Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on October 1, 2001 with Mr. Ritter Trahan presiding.

President Ritter Trahan called for any other bids in the audience to be submitted relative to the bid calls for tonight's meeting.

Upon motion of Mr. Ernal "E. J." Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis "Pee Wee" Meaux, and unanimously carried, the Jury closed the receipt of all bids for tonight's meeting.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the opening of the bids received as follows:



Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Ernal "E. J." Broussard, and unanimously carried, it is recommended that the Police Jury award the sale of the used equipment shown on the attached sheet to the highest bidder as shown.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Terry Bessard, and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes of the September 17, 2001 regular meeting were dispensed with and were accepted.

President Ritter Trahan read the following announcements:

- (1) Received a notice from the Social Security Administration – Lafayette District Office advising of their plans to discontinue their monthly visits to Abbeville after the October 18, 2001 scheduled visit.
- (2) The Department of Natural Resources – Coastal Management Division will host its third annual Symposium entitled “Local Coastal Programs 2001: Protecting, Restoring and Enhancing Coastal Resources” on October 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> in Lafayette.
- (3) Received a copy of a resolution from Rapides Parish Police Jury endorsing Mr. Joe Fuller in his candidacy for election as Third Vice-President of the Police Jury Association of Louisiana.
- (4) Received a copy of a resolution from Natchitoches Parish Police Jury endorsing Mrs. Gale Potts-Roque in her candidacy for election as Executive Board Member At Large of the Police Jury Association of Louisiana.
- (5) Received a copy of Proclamation signed by Governor Mike Foster in which he declares a State of Emergency to exist within the boundaries of the State Of Louisiana in a precautionary effort to facilitate rapid mobilization and deployment of state assets, should it become necessary.
- (6) A Public Hearing will be held at the Ted A. Ardoin City/Parish Council Auditorium in Lafayette, on Wednesday, October 31, 2001, at 3:00 p.m. This Public Hearing will be held in accordance with Act 334 of the 1974 regular session of the Louisiana Legislature and conducted by the Joint Legislative Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works. The purpose of this Public Hearing is to review highway construction priorities for the fiscal year 2002-03 for the parishes of Acadia, Evangeline, Iberia, Lafayette, St. Landry, St. Martin, St. Mary and Vermilion, which comprise Highway District 03. This review is based upon the project priorities established by the DOTD highway needs analysis.

- (7) The Vermilion Parish Library invites the Police Jury to participate in the Seventh Annual "Scare on the Square" on Halloween Night. This project has been extremely successful in past years. This year's event will consist of a Costume Contest, an Entertainer, and Trick-or-Treating with Downtown Merchants. Activities will begin at 5:15 p.m.
- (8) The Louisiana Department of Natural Resources invites the Police Jury to the first of a series of energy management workshops on December 6, 2001, in Baton Rouge which is designed to assist publicly funded entities with developing and implementing a comprehensive energy management strategy.

Parish Engineer, Mr. Gene Sellers advised the Police Jury that he had received correspondence from the State Office of Emergency Preparedness that the application submitted by the Parish to develop a parish hazard mitigation plan will be held until the State OEP develops a statewide plan.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Public Road Committee Recommendations were amended to authorize that Mr. Rayford Hardy be hired to fill the open mechanic position and assigned to the Public Works Maintenance Facility.

Upon motion of Mr. Mark Poche, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr. and unanimously carried, the Public Road Committee Recommendations were further amended to authorize payment to Ms. Monica Hebert in the amount of \$75.00 to reimburse her for repairs to her sewer line damaged by the Police Jury.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously accepted, the Public Road Committee Recommendations were approved as amended, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations.

PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE  
SEPTEMBER 26, 2001  
ABBEVILLE, LOUISIANA

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON SEPTEMBER 26, 2001, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the legal counsel be authorized to complete the final draft of the purchase agreement and lease agreement relative to the Government Offices purchase.
2. It is recommended that Minvielle and Associates, Inc. be authorized to evaluate possible areas that would qualify for a Community Development Block Grant. Sites mentioned as potential areas include:

- A) Unincorporated area south and west of Delcambre toward the Bayou Tigre
  - B) Unincorporated areas around Kaplan and Nunez
  - C) North Vermilion area
3. It is recommended that the previous Police Jury action of September 17, 2001 authorizing \$100.00 towards the purchase of a used lawnmower for the Lemaire damage claim be amended to increase the amount authorized to \$150.00.
  4. It is recommended that a right-of-way instrument be prepared to widen the end of E. Abshire Road to create a cul de sac, and upon signature by the landowner that it be accepted into the parish road maintenance system.
  5. It is recommended that the legal counsel be requested to review the right-of-way status of Fore Road.
  6. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 40 mph speed limit on Sandpit Road from U.S. Highway 167 easterly to the entrance of the Vermilion Shell & Limestone sandpit site.
  7. It is recommended that the Police Jury accept into the Parish Road Maintenance system a road in the area of Don's Boat Landing, subject to the paperwork being completed.
  8. It is recommended that the Police Jury amend the RRF-Equipment Purchase Allocation to authorize the purchase of a used tandem roller for the resealing program.  
  
It is further recommended that the Police Jury advertise for a used tandem roller.
  9. It is recommended that the Police Jury give final approval to the subdivision development identified as North Vermilion Estates.
  10. It is recommended that a 10-ton load limit be set on the bridge on J. Alcee Road.
  11. It is recommended that the Police Jury enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Seventh Ward Drainage District to assist in removing trees along the right-of-way of Hunter Road.
  12. It is recommended that the used pile driver and leads be advertised to be sold as surplus equipment.

13. It is recommended that the Parish Engineer and Road Supervisor inspect Doris Hebert (Pvt.) Road to determine what actions are needed by the landowners to meet the requirements for having the road taken into the public road maintenance system.
14. It is recommended that Mr. Archie Hebert be transferred from the FRS-Resealing Crew to the Area 2 Road Crew as the brushcutter operator.
15. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the purchases of two (2) new trade-in 18.4, R1 tractor tires from Mr. Sandrus Stelly at a cost of \$100.00 each. Current contract bids for this size tire is a minimum of \$307.65.
16. It is recommended that the following equipment be authorized to be sold from the Area 2 inventory:

- A) Unit #2-988 & #2-998 – Tractor & Brushcutter
- B) Unit #2-997 & #585A – Tractor & Mower

It is further recommended that Sellers and Associates, Inc. be authorized to prepare specifications and bids be advertised to be received for a new 2-wheel drive tractor and side-mount boom mower.

It is further recommended that once bids are accepted that any cost difference between the new and old equipment would be paid from the District 13 allocations from Road District 6 & 7 Funds, prorated according to mileage.

17. It is recommended that contracts be awarded to Gordon Vice, L.L.C. for the repairs to the following fire stations, per the quotes submitted:

18. It is recommended that the request to furnish “Sugar Cane Loading Site” signs to area farmers be denied.
19. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 30-mph speed limit on Landry Road for its entire length.
20. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the naming of Evenite (Pvt.) Road and that the location information be sent to the parish engineer’s office for plotting and to the 911 Office for emergency use reference.

21. It is recommended that the Police Jury issue a letter of no objection/letter of support relative to MAR-CON, INC. application to USDA-Rural Development for a loan to expand their operations.
22. It is recommended that Mrs. Karen Trahan be reappointed to serve as Commissioner on the Vermilion Parish Library Board effective with the end of her current term which expires October 7, 2001.
23. It is recommended that the Police Jury enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Ward One Consolidated Gravity drainage District No. 1 to remove trees on the Suire property.

Police Jury to provide labor and equipment (trucks) to assist in the project.

24. It is recommended that the Police Jury notify the La. Congressional delegation of their concern regarding proposed mandatory Social Security participation where governmental entities are already participating in an approved retirement system, which is already subject to Social Security Offset regulations.

## **ORDINANCE**

### **2001-O-18**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding is existing and causing very hazardous conditions on Sandpit Road; and

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 40 mph speed limit on said road from U.S. Highway 167 easterly to the entrance of the Vermilion Shell & Limestone sandpit site; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that a maximum penalty of \$100.00 and/or a 10 day jail sentence may be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that Honorable Sheriff Raywood Lemaire be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

## ORDINANCE

2001-O-19

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding is existing and causing very hazardous conditions on Landry Road; and

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 15 mph speed limit on said road for its entire length; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that a maximum penalty of \$100.00 and/or a 10 day jail sentence may be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that Honorable Sheriff Raywood Lemaire be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

**TITLE:** A resolution authorizing the Vermilion Paris Police Jury and the Seventh Ward Gravity Drainage District No. 2 to enter into an intergovernmental agreement all in accordance with the provisions of La. R.S. 33:1321 et seq.

## GENERAL STATEMENT OF CONTRACTUAL AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the provisions of La. R.S. 33:1321 et seq, dealing with "intergovernmental functions", authorize the police jury of a parish, and any city, town or village, and any special district or political subdivision of the state

to agree between and among themselves to engage jointly in the exercise of any power, and in the construction, acquisition or improvement of any public project or improvement, or the promotion and maintenance of any undertaking when either one of the participants in the agreement is authorized under provision of general or specific law to perform such activity or exercise such power as may be necessary for completion of the undertaking (La. R.S. 33:1324); and

### **PROJECT**

WHEREAS, there is a need to remove trees along the right-of-way of Hunter Road; and

### **AGREEMENT**

NOW, THEREFORE, the Seventh Ward Gravity Drainage District No. 2 does;

RESOLVE THAT, they will provide their labor and excavator to do the project.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does

RESOLVE THAT, they will provide labor and trucks to assist in the project.

RESOLVED FURTHER, by both parties that a certified copy of this resolution shall immediately be filed and recorded in the records of the Clerk of Court for the Parish of Vermilion, Louisiana; and upon adoption of this

resolution by both parties and recordation of same, it shall constitute the agreement between the Police Jury and the Seventh Ward Gravity Drainage District No. 2 and a copy of this resolution shall be published in the official journal of the above said parties concerned.

Upon motion of Mr. Kenneth DeHart, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury did resolve to request the Parish's Congressional Delegation to support the Senate's proposed funding for the Coastal Impact Assistance Program (CIAP).

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Terry Bessard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury ratified the Section 5311 Monthly Activity Report for the month of August, 2001 as submitted by the Vermilion Council On Aging and directing the Secretary to submit the report to the Department of Transportation and Development for reimbursement in accordance with the contract agreement.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert Faulk, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized payment to Gulf Coast Environmental Consultants, Inc. in the amount of \$1,200.00. Invoice represents payment for work completed to conduct a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment of the proposed Government Office Complex site.

Upon motion of Mr. Edval J. Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury allowed those in the audience to present their business at this time.

Ms. Kizzie Shelvin advised the Police Jury that she was a tenant through the Section 8 Program, a single mother, and has been notified that she has 30 days to relocate. She requested help in getting an extension of time to relocate.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized that a letter be sent to the Section 8 Office and the Department of Housing and Urban Development requesting that they consider an extension of the time (30 days) for tenants to relocate due to noncompliance after recent regulatory changes, when the conditions are not the fault of the tenant.

Mosquito Control Director, Ms. Antoinette Derouen, advised the Police Jurors that the Louisiana Mosquito Control Association's Annual Conference will be held on October 29, - 31, 2001 in Lake Charles and requested that she be allowed to attend.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Ms. Antoinette Derouen to attend the Louisiana Mosquito Control Association's Annual Conference.

Upon motion of Mr. Pervis "Pee Wee" Meaux, duly seconded by Mr. Terry Bessard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury returned to its regular agenda.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Invoice No. C088336 from Southern Structures, Inc. in the amount of \$500.00 for materials to repair the roof of the Indian Bayou Fire Department. Cost to be paid from the '76 Sales Tax Fund as a Capital Improvement Line Item for Fire Departments.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Invoice No. RE333165 from Greg Rabalais dba Rabalais Enterprise for labor to repair roof of the Indian Bayou Fire Department. Cost to be paid from the 76 Sales Tax Fund as a Capital Improvement Line Item for Fire Departments.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Mark Poche, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of two invoices in the amounts of \$1,897.92 and \$1,568.29 to Laborde & Neuner for legal services provided in the defense of the Melissa Ann Carmouche, et al lawsuit. Cost to be paid from the Parishwide Road Maintenance Fund.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Kenneth DeHart, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the issuance of a letter of no objection relative to their request for an ABC special event permit to the North Vermilion Youth Athletic Association who will be sponsoring the North Vermilion High School Alumni Dance in conjunction with Homecoming activities on Friday, October 26, 2001 at the WOW Hall on Louisiana Highway 92, in Maurice. Alcoholic beverages will be sold and proceeds will go towards their youth activities.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Edval J. Simon, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Application No. 1 from Lundin Roofing Company in the amount of \$17,515.00 which represents payment of materials on hand and for roofing work done as of 9/27/01 on the Indian Bayou and Meaux-Nunez Fire Departments. Cost to be paid from the '76 Sales Tax Fund as a Capital Improvement Line Item for Fire Departments.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Invoice No. 21662 from Philip Reclamation Services in the amount of \$20,970.00 relative to the Vermilion Parish Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day. Cost to be paid from the 94 Sales Tax Fund.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the payment of Invoice No. 01-072 from Library Interiors of Texas, Inc. in the amount of \$32,297.86 for furnishing furniture and fixtures for the Kaplan Branch Library. The invoice amount is \$42,297.86. Parish Architect, Gene Sellers, Jr. recommends withholding \$10,000 for materials not delivered and/or defective. Cost to be paid from the Library Bond Fund.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Statement No. 2118 from The Sellers Group in the amount of \$642.93 for architectural services provided relative to the Kaplan Library Branch Renovations. Cost to be paid from the Library Bond Fund.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Terry Bessard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted the following ordinance establishing a “No Wake Zone” on the Vermilion River from the Woodlawn Bridge going north, approximately ½ mile in the area of Eagle Pass Subdivision.

**ORDINANCE NUMBER  
2001-O-20**

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF  
“NO WAKE ZONE” IN DESIGNATED WATERS: TO PROVIDE FOR  
THE INSTALLATION OF SIGNS DESIGNATING THESE ZONES:  
AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Police Jury of Vermilion Parish, Louisiana, in regular session duly assembled and proceeding under its police power and further pursuant to the laws of the State of Louisiana.

**SECTION 1: NO WAKE ZONES (5 M.P.H.)**

The following described waterways are hereby designated as no wake zones within which watercraft shall not throw any type of wake or when such a wake is occurring that such watercraft shall not exceed the speed of five (5) miles per hour:

- A. That portion of the Vermilion River, beginning at the Woodlawn Bridge and extending northerly for a distance of approximately ½ mile to beyond Eagle Pass Subdivision.

Appropriate signs shall be erected and maintained along such waterways, and any vessel traveling thereon shall respect the signs so erected and maintained.

**SECTION 2: WATERWAY IDENTIFICATION SIGNS AND  
NAVIGATIONAL AIDS**

No person shall destroy, molest, damage, change or alter any sign or navigational aid placed along, or in, any waterbody within Vermilion Parish.

**SECTION 3: PENALTY**

Any person violating any of the provisions aforestated shall upon conviction be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days or both.

#### SECTION 4: DECLARATION

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the remainder of said ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

#### SECTION 5: IMPLEMENTATION

This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption by the Police Jury.

On motion of Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Terry Bessard, and unanimously carried, the above ordinance was adopted as presented.

The Secretary advised the Police Jurors that the monthly membership meeting of the Greater Abbeville/Vermilion Chamber of Commerce will be held on Thursday, October 4, 2001. Agenda items call for a forum of the candidates for the Abbeville City Court Judge position. Also, BESE Board Member, Mr. Dale Bayard will give an update on the latest news from the BESE Board.

Legal Counsel, Mr. Paul Moresi, III, advised the Police Jurors that the sale/lease agreement to purchase the Hibernia Bank is near completion. Advised of the comments made by Hibernia to modify the agreement.

Upon motion of Mr. Edval J. Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Mark Poche, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel, Mr. Paul Moresi, III to meet with the Parish Architect, Mr. Gene Sellers, Jr. to discuss the time frame for the interim construction of the Hibernia Bank addition, which will be included in the sale/lease agreement.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Kenneth DeHart, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the hiring of a person to fill an open truck driver position in the Area 4 work crew as soon as a person can be found.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the President to sign the necessary agreement with Southern Structures for the purchase of the building materials needed for the Area 4 building from Southern Structures per their quote.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Edval J. Simon, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized that a request be sent to Mr. Bill Fontenot, Administrator of District 03 of the Department of Transportation and Development, to reduce the speed limit to 45 mph on the Highway 14 By-Pass within the corporate limits of the Town of Erath, and that a copy of the request be sent to the Mayor of Erath.

Mr. Edval J. Simon, Jr. advised of complaints he has received relative to an employee at the Delcambre Branch Library.

Upon motion of Mr. Edval J. Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury directed the Secretary to contact the Iberia Parish Library Board and the Vermilion Parish Library Board requesting that they look into the complaints against the employee.

Upon motion of Mr. Ernal "E. J." Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Mark Poche, and unanimously carried, that there being no further business to be presented, the meeting was duly adjourned.
