Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on November 17, 2003, with President Edval Simon, Jr. presiding.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes of the November 3, 2003 meeting were dispensed with and were accepted.

The Police Jury allowed those who requested time on the agenda to present their business at this time.

Ms. Rebecca Shirley, Chairman of the Vermilion Parish Tourist Commission introduced other board members present: Bert Hoffpauir, Arlene Choate, Pat Heard and Bonnie Broussard. Mrs. Shirley gave a report on the operating revenues received and the various activities the commission participated in during the year; She also discussed a proposed birding trail, in which 12 different sites have been nominated from Vermilion Parish; Louisiana Purchase Bi-Centennial Participation, Historical marker in Mouton Cove area being placed; New entrance signs being placed due to Hurricane Lili.

President Edval Simon, Jr. then read the following announcements:

- (1) The Teche-Vermilion Fresh Water District Commission will have their Annual Inspection & Meeting at the Pump Station in Krotz Springs on Friday, November 21, 2003.
- (2) The Governor's Office of Coastal Activities announces the next meeting of the Governor's Advisory Commission on Coastal Restoration and Conservation will be held on Friday November 21, 2003 at 9:00 a.m. at the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries in Baton Rouge.

- (3) The Vermilion Parish Coastal Restoration Advisory Committee will host a meeting featuring Dr. Ivor van Heerden discussing “What If Lili Didn’t Slow Down: Assessing The Impact Of Hurricanes On Vermilion’s Communities And Infrastructure Using Computer Modeling” to be held on December 3, 2003 at 2:00 p.m. at the LSU AgCenter, Vermilion Extension Office.
- (4) The Louisiana PRIMA Fall Conference “Are Your Bases Covered?” sponsored by the Louisiana Public Risk Management Association will be held December 10 – 11, 2003 in Baton Rouge.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Louis Joe Hardy, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury gave preliminary plat approval as well as approval of the proposed street and drainage plan improvements for both the subdivision developments identified Maria Danna Segura Subdivision and Aldora Subdivision – Phase II, contingent upon the following items being received:

1. Vermilion Parish Health Unit approval of the proposed water supply and sewage disposal methods for the lot sizes indicated, as well as approval of the comprehensive drainage.
2. The owners will forward the \$175.00 preliminary plat and plan review fee directly to the V.P.P.J.
3. Provide an agreement with Waterworks District No. 1 for water service to the new developments.

Upon motion of Mr. Kenneth DeHart, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the following drilling permits:

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Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, relative to Project Permit No. 1256-D issued to El Paso Production on September 2, 2003, the Police Jury gave final “Acceptance” of this project as complete.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert Faulk, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the issuance of a “letter of no objection” to Cox Communications to run telecable service to Din Mobile Home Park located in Election District No. 1.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the issuance of a "letter of no objection" to Kimberly Vincent to refurbish an existing levee in the Pecan Island area, to protect pasture land from high water and salt water intrusion.

Upon motion of Mr. Louis Joe Hardy, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert Faulk, and unanimously carried, Item No. 12 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations was amended to add the following state highway driveway permit installations:

- D) Dehart Shipyard – La. Hwy 335
- E) Vermilion Parish Tourist Commission – La. Hwy 690

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Public Road Committee Recommendations were further amended to recommend adoption an ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Lloyd Road for its entire length.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Public Road Committee Recommendations were approved as amended, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations;

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON NOVEMBER 12, 2003, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the following items relative to the 2003 Road Improvements – Phase 1 Project be approved:
  - A) H & S Construction Co., Inc.  
Partial Payment Estimate No. 3  
Amount Due = \$8,403.80
  - B) Contract Change Order No. 2  
Adjust contract quantities to  
as-built quantities  
Net decrease of \$37,048.96
  - C) Adopt a resolution accepting the project  
as complete and authorizing the President  
to sign an Act of Acceptance of the project.
2. It is recommended that the following invoices from Sellers and Associates, Inc. be approved to be paid:

- A) Invoice #007411 = \$340.00  
Update parish road system map
- B) Invoice #007395 = \$1,100.00  
50% share of cost to perform drainage study in Mt. Carmel Heights Subd.; request quotations for proposed drainage improvements; and preparation of DOTD permit for crossing U.S. Hwy 167. City of Abbeville paying remaining 50%.
- C) Invoice #007415 = \$175.00  
Meaux Ranch Subdivision Reviews  
Preliminary & Design Approval

3. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt the attached ordinance accepting the findings of the State Land Office relative to the re-establishment of the parish boundary lines between Vermilion and Lafayette Parishes.

It is further recommended that the President be authorized to sign the maps and documents related to the boundary survey, and to have the documents recorded with the Clerk of Court's Office.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury approve the payment of \$10,000 to the State Land Office which represents the Jury's share of the cost of the survey.

It is further recommended that Sellers and Associates, Inc. be authorized to prepare the necessary maps to be distributed to all taxing bodies, and to establish permanent markers and signs denoting the parish boundary line location at, or along, all state and parish road intersections or crossings.

4. It is recommended that the following 10/15 Ton weight limits be maintained on those bridges located on the roads listed below:

Farmer Road, Romeal Road and Lomier Road

5. It is recommended that the following damage claims be approved to be paid:

A) Eddie Hoffpauir - \$170.71      B) Pat Menard - \$34.98

6. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the closure of Clint Road between J. K. Road and Shelton Road from 11/13 to 11/21 to allow for the repair of a pipeline crossing under the road. Pipeline Company to be responsible for all signage, blocking of roads, notification of emergency response agencies and that new installation will meet current pipeline permit requirements.

7. It is recommended that Material Resources be allowed to do a test section of a new cold mix product on Edier Road. Supplies will furnish material and Police Jury will provide labor and equipment to spread the material.
8. It is recommended that authorization be given to haul ditch dirt from Mack Switch Road to the Pony League park in Erath.
9. It is recommended that a letter of support on behalf of the Meaux-Nunez Fire Dept. be sent, requesting Acadian Ambulance Service, Inc. to donate the appropriate lights to be used to establish helicopter landing zones during night time emergencies.
10. It is recommended that the Police Jury enter into the following intergovernmental agreements with the Coulee Kinney Drainage District:
  - A) Haul dirt to backfill culvert in a drainage on the Russell Duhon property located in the area of La. Hwy 343 and Hilton Road. Police Jury to provide trucks to haul the material.
  - B) Haul dirt/rip-rap to correct an erosion problem on Coulee Crouch in the area of the Faulk Property. Police Jury to provide trucks to haul the material.
  - C) Haul dirt/rip-rap to correct an erosion problem along a public drainage in the area of the Irene Romero property. Police Jury to provide trucks to haul the material.
11. It is recommended that a towing company be hired to move a salvaged school bus from Maurice to the solid waste plant. School bus formerly used as a training tool by the fire departments and no further use is required.
12. It is recommended that the following state highway driveway permit installations be approved:
  - A) Marlene Louviere – La. Hwy. 335
  - B) E. J. Saltzman – La. Hwy. 335
  - C) Josette Turner – La. Hwy. 697
13. It is recommended that Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr. be reappointed to the Waterworks District No. 1 Board of Commissioners, effective with the end of his current term.
14. It is recommended that the list of requisitions dated October 20, 2003 as submitted by the purchasing agent be approved to be voided.

15. It is recommended that the action taken at the October 6, 2003 meeting to issue an irrigation permit to Steven Plaisance be rescinded in view of Mr. Plaisance no longer wanting to do the project.
16. It is recommended that the invoices submitted relative to the road maintenance program and approved by the Finance Committee be authorized to be paid.
17. It is recommended that the Police Jury, working through the annual intergovernmental agreement with the City of Abbeville, assist the City in the removal of any excess dirt fill material off the realigned drainage project in the area of the Stine Lumber Company building (old Wal-Mart Building).

**WHEREAS**, should the boundary between Lafayette Parish and St. Martin Parish and between Vermilion Parish and Iberia Parish be determined to be different at a later date, then the accepted boundary line between Vermilion and Lafayette, in the location shown on this survey, will not change except that the eastern terminus point will be adjusted to intersect with the determined and accepted boundary line between Lafayette Parish and St. Martin Parish and between Vermilion Parish and Iberia Parish; and

**WHEREAS**, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury has reviewed the data furnished by the State and is in agreement with their findings; and accordingly

**NOW THEREFORE**, for and in consideration of the mutual advantages to the parties to the aforementioned Agreement, it is hereby agreed:

**SECTION 1:** All of the aforementioned “Whereas” clauses are adopted as part of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 2:** Vermilion Parish Police Jury President, Edval Simon, Jr., on behalf of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury, is hereby authorized to sign any documents, maps, etc. accepting the findings of the State.

**SECTION 3:** The results of the State’s findings shall be forwarded to the U.S. Bureau of Census for their information and records, as well as to the U.S. Justice Department for their concurrence.

**SECTION 4:** The Tax Assessors and other Taxing Authority of Vermilion Parish and Lafayette Parish shall be notified of the State’s findings and the acceptance of same by both Parishes so that taxing of property and other taxes and fees can be made accordingly.

**SECTION 5:** All ordinance or resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 6:** This ordinance shall become effective upon signature of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury President.

AS A RESULT OF A FINANCE COMMITTEE SPECIAL MEETING HELD ON NOVEMBER 10, 2003, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY’S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the following changes to the health insurance coverage be implemented effective January 1, 2004:
  - A) The employer-employee contribution is to be deleted for all existing jurors and retired jurors. Active and retired jurors will no longer be eligible to enroll in the health plan. Any active or retired police juror, currently enrolled in the plan, will be eligible for COBRA coverage for a period of up to thirty-six months.
  - B) For all retired employees, the Police Jury will pay (an amount to be determined) of the retired employee's personal coverage. Dependent coverage, if wanted, will require that the employee pay 100% of that coverage.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury not renew the health care advocacy services provided by Patient Care, effective January 1, 2004.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury cancel the uniform contract with CINTAS effective January 1, 2004.
4. It is recommended that Waterworks District No. 1 be requested to be responsible to pay for any engineering fees over the grant amount for the LCDBG – Phase VII and VIII Water Distribution Projects.
