Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on June 21, 2004, with President Hubert J. Faulk presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Faulk, who asked that the meeting begin with the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a moment of silent prayer.

President Hubert J. Faulk called for any other bids in the audience to be submitted relative to the bid call shown on the agenda.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Jury closed the receipt of all bids and authorized the opening of the following bid:

Abbeville Meridional	First insertion at the rate of \$6.00 per square of 100 words and for all subsequent insertions, a rate of \$6.00 per square of 100 words.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Ernal "E.J." Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the award of the official journal and printer to the Abbeville Meridional.

The President recognized those persons who had requested time on the agenda to present their business at this time.

Mr. Randy Moertle representing Coastal Environment, Inc., provided the Jury with a final report on the environmental assessment regarding the AGMAC study. He also made a power point presentation of the findings.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes of the June 7, 2004 meeting, were dispensed with and were accepted.

President Hubert Faulk read the following announcements:

- (1) Received the 2003 Financial Audit Report from the Pecan Island Waterworks District #3, which will be kept on file.
- (2) Received the 2003 Financial Audit Report from Ward One Consolidated Drainage District #1, which will be kept on file.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers and Associates, Inc., presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Advised that the annual Hazardous Waste Collection Day has been scheduled for Saturday, September 25, 2004.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Ernal "E. J." Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized payment of Invoice No. 2513 from Lingo/ERS Waste Services in the amount of \$213,000.00. Invoice represents the cost to deliver 5,000, 90-Gallon Rollout Waste Containers. Cost to be paid from the 2004 Solid Waste Equipment Fund.

Upon motion of Mr. Ravis Menard, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the award of the contracts for Materials for Parish Road Maintenance to the various low bidders for each of the proposals, and authorized that those bids which did not meet specifications be rejected.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Mark Poche, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1285D to Henry Production Company to drill the Lillian Comeaux, et al., Well No. 1, in Election District No. 1.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1286D to South Oak Production Company to drill the McIlhenny, et al., No. 1 Well, in Election District No.9.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee III, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Seismic Permit No. 675 to Boone Exploration, Inc. to conduct seismic activity in the Leroy and Meaux areas in Election District No.2, subject to receipt of the performance bond, and holding of a pre-construction meeting.

Upon motion of Mr. Mark Poche, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prjean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury amended Item #3 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations to have the ordinance become effective in thirty (30) days from this meeting date (June 21, 2004), and to request the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department to issue verbal warnings during this period until the ordinance becomes effective.

It is further recommended that on future stop sign ordinance matters that the road supervisor installs advance warning signs of the date of implementation.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee III, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Public Road Committee Recommendations were approved as amended.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JUNE 16, 2004, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Prairie Gregg Drainage District and Coulee Des Jons Drainage District to provide their truck and trailer to haul Police Jury equipment to the shop or to alternate location.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to reinstall a driveway on La. Hwy. 330 for Allen Comeaux that was previously moved in error at the request of the tenant farmer and not the landlord.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a three (3) way stop at the intersection of Lons and Natasha Streets.
4. It is recommended that Partial Payment Estimate No. 2 from Jan's Construction Co. Inc., in the amount of \$55,098.78 be approved to be paid. Estimate represents work completed on the FY 2003 LCDBG-Water System Extension, North Vermilion-Area VII project. Cost to be paid from LCDBG grant funds.

5. It is recommended that the Police Jury submit the following names to the Abbeville Harbor and Terminal District to fill the commissioner position that will expire June 30, 2004, currently held by Mr. Tim Creswell.

- (A) Mr. Tim Creswell
- (B) Mr. Bud Zaumbrecher

6. It is recommended that the Police Jury enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Coulee Kinney Drainage District to provide labor and equipment to haul off removed trees in the area of Fore Road.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury award the contract in the amount of \$96,680.00 to construct the Cheniere Au Tigre Sediment Trapping Project to Broussard Brothers, Inc. Cost to be paid from the Coastal Impact Assistance funds.
8. It is recommended that the Road Committee bills be approved to be paid.

In accordance with the Public Road Committee Recommendations, the following ordinance was adopted:

ORDINANCE

2004-O-21

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a very hazardous and dangerous condition exists at the intersection of Lons Drive and Natasha Street; and

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 3-way stop at said intersection; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate stop signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce this stop sign ordinance by regularly patrolling.

SECTION V: BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall become effective on July 21, 2004.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, and unanimously carried, the Public Works Committee Recommendations were approved as amended.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JUNE 16, 2004, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the solid waste supervisor accept all contracted garbage cans at the Solid Waste Plant, and when the new trucks arrive and when it is time to distribute the containers in the cities, that the Mayors be contacted to see if assistance can be provided to haul and place cans on the designated routes.
2. It is recommended that Sellers & Associates, Inc. meet with the Solid Waste Supervisor to establish a suitable date in September to hold the annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day.

It is further recommended that Phillip Reclamation Services be contacted to provide pickup and disposal of hazardous waste material collected.

3. It is recommended that Sellers & Associates, Inc. be authorized to prepare a plat showing the exchange of property with the Deshotel family in the area east of the Rabies Control facility.

It is further recommended that the legal counsel be authorized to prepare the necessary documents relative to the act of exchange.

4. It is recommended that Invoice No. 2503 from Lingo International, Inc. /ERS Waste Services in the amount of \$213,000.00 be approved to be paid. Invoice represents the delivery and acceptance of 5000-90 gallon containers to the solid waste plant.

It is further recommended that authorization be given to pay additional invoices for the remainder of the containers to be delivered and accepted by the solid waste supervisor.

5. It is recommended that the Abbeville Fire Chief be authorized to obtain formal quotes for the repair of the parishwide tanker truck. Material to be specified shall be for a stainless steel tank and steel body.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury amend the 2004 Budget to reallocate \$15,000.00, which is currently unappropriated from the capital outlay line item and to authorize up to an additional \$25,000.00 from the fund reserves to pay for the cost of the repairs to the parishwide water truck.

6. It is recommended that the invoices submitted by the Public Works Department for approval, be authorized to be paid.
