August 16, 2004  
Abbeville, Louisiana

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on August 16, 2004, with President Hubert J. Faulk presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Faulk, who asked that Juror Mark Poche, lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes of the August 2, 2004 meeting, were dispensed with and were accepted.

President Faulk read the following announcement:

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved amending the agenda to allow Mr. Mike Pederson, with Pederson & Pederson Auctions, Inc. to make a presentation. His company wants to get local governments to join together for a large sale of surplus equipment in this area sometimes in the fall. It would also be open to farmers, contractors, and individuals.

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury give final approval to the development identified as Richard John Rural Subdivision.

**ORDINANCE**

**2004-O-24**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury’s attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists which is causing very hazardous conditions on Rosewood Road in Election District No. 10 and 14, from Mahogany Road to Bluebonnet Road.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion

Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 25 mph speed limit on Rosewood Road for that section of road named above; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff’s Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

**ORDINANCE**

**2004-O-25**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists which is causing very hazardous conditions on Farmer Road in Election District No. 10, from Chestnut Road to Beech Road.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 25 mph speed limit on Farmer Road for that section of road named above; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

Prejean, Jr., and Mark Poche.

The motion failed by a vote of 4 for and 9 against. The owner will be required to pay the difference between the low bid and the actual cost.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON AUGUST 11, 2004, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that bids be advertised and authorized to be obtained for the purchase and installation of eight (8) global positioning system monitors for the mosquito control spray trucks and for the software to make reports. Cost to be paid from allocation received from the state to upgrade mosquito control program to fight the West Nile virus.
2. It is recommended that the District Attorney's office be requested to pursue restitution of the thirty-six (36) garbage cans vandalized in the Champagne Estates and La. Hwy. 89 area earlier this year.
3. It is recommended that the City of Abbeville be requested to enforce their litter ordinance in cleaning up the debris in the median across from the Bohrer trailer park.
4. It is recommended that the invoices submitted by the Public Works Department be approved to be paid.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury award the contract to repair the parishwide fire tanker truck to Bonaventure Co., Inc. in the amount of \$39,550.00. Cost to be paid from 76 Sales Tax and state grant received (\$30,000.00).

It is further recommended that a letter of appreciation be sent to the parish legislative delegation for obtaining state funds to assist in the project.

6. It is recommended that the application review committee, for the Public Works accounts payable/receivable/clerk position, be comprised of Jurors from Election District No. 13, 14, 1, & 2 and the Public Works Director.

It is recommended that interviews of the selected applicants be held on Monday, August 16, 2004, beginning at 6:00 p.m.

7. It is recommended that the secretary draft an ordinance similar to the City of Abbeville's regarding the placement and removal of garbage cans from within the public road right-of-way for pickup.

It is further recommended that all other municipalities be requested to adopt a similar ordinance.

1. It is recommended that the Sheriff's office be requested to deputize the animal wardens which would allow the animal wardens to issue citations and enter onto property; however they would not be authorized to carry a firearm.
