Abbeville, Louisiana

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on September 20, 2004, with President Hubert J. Faulk presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Faulk, who asked that Juror Mark Poche' lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes of the September 7, 2004 meeting, were dispensed with and were accepted.

President Faulk read the following announcements:

- (1) The next quarterly meeting of the La. Wetlands Conservation and Restoration Authority will be held on Tuesday, September 28, 2004, from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the Galvez Building Conference Center in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.
- (2) The next meeting of the CWPPRA Task Force will be held on Wednesday, October 13, 2004 beginning at 9:30 a.m. at the La Department of Wildlife and Fisheries Building in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

Mr. Gene Sellers, with Sellers and Associates, Inc., presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee III, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1298 to Browning Oil Company to install 1,156 feet of 4" pipeline beginning at Stovall Well No. 1 to tie into an existing tap, south of the Intracoastal Waterway and northeast of Onion Lake, located in Election District No.09.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee III, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1299-D to Cimarex Energy Company to construct a drill site and necessary site structures for the Hebert No. 1 Well, off of Oliver Road, located in Election District No. 14.

Upon motion of Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee III, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1300-D to Zink & Trumbo, Inc. to construct a drill site and necessary site structures for the C. Harrison, et al, Well No. 1, off of La. Hwy. 694, located in Election District No. 09.

Upon motion of Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee III, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1301-D to Burlington Resources Oil & Gas LP., to construct a drill site and necessary site structures for the A. M. Simon No. 2 Well, off of La. Hwy. 699, located in Election District No. 02.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, approved the issuance of a telecommunication permit to Cox Communications Inc., to install cable along Judge Doucet Road, southwest of Nunez, located in Election District No.13.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, approved the issuance of a telecommunication permit to Cox Communications Inc., to install cable along Baylee Road, west of Maurice off of La. Hwy. 699, located in Election District No.02.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "letter of no objection" to Hilcorp Energy Company to stabilize sections of the bank of the Florence Canal for erosion control purposes, approximately 4.5 miles southwest of Gueydan, located in Election District No. 14.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "letter of no objection" to Cypress Gas pipeline to deposit rock material at 4-locations along the banks of Freshwater Bayou for bank stabilization, south of Intracoastal City, located in Election District No. 09 and 13.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "letter of no objection" to Lumcon, to dredge the water bottom of a canal to the Lumcon site at Redfish Point, located in Election District No. 09.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "letter of no objection" to Broussard Brothers, Inc. to clean out an existing canal and to install a bulkhead, in Section 90, T14S, R3E, in the Intracoastal City/Freshwater Bayou area, located in Election District No. 09.

Upon motion of Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved amending Item No. 3 of the Public Road Recommendations, to adopt an ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Sidney Gautreaux Road for its entire length (La. Hwy. 14 to La Hwy. 697).

## **ORDINANCE**

**2004-O-27**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists which is causing very hazardous conditions on Sidney Gautreaux Road in Election District No.2, from La. Hwy. 14 to La. Hwy. 697.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 35 mph speed limit on Sidney Gautreaux Road for that section of road named above; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

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Upon motion of Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury further amended Item No. 3 of the Public Road Recommendations, to adopt an ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Lormand Road, from La. Hwy. 92 to Fusilier Road.

**ORDINANCE**

**2004-O-28**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists which is causing very hazardous conditions on Lormand Road in Election District No.1, from La. Hwy. 92 to Fusilier Road.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 35 mph speed limit on Lormand Road for that section of road named above; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

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Upon motion of Mark Poche', duly seconded by Ernal "E.J." Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury amended Item No. 7 of the Public Road Recommendations, to change the Fording at the end of the sentence to read “, and that the fifth operator be assigned to do any of the job duties within the work area as directed by the Area Foremen.”

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. Ravis Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations, as amended, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations:

PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE  
SEPTEMBER 15, 2004  
ABBEVILLE, LOUISIANA

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON SEPTEMBER 15, 2004, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury's action taken at their August 2, 2004 meeting, which changed the name of Goldie Road to Roland Road, be rescinded and instead the road name be established as Stella Road.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury advertise for a dragline operator on a part-time, as needed basis, at an hourly rate to be based on experience. No benefits are included. Position is needed to provide operator to build and/or repair parish road bridges.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Keno Road for its entire length.
4. It is recommended that Scott Construction Equipment be authorized to do a transmission test on Unit #3-630 (Motor Grader) at a cost of \$1,000.00 to determine if an electrical or mechanical problem exists, and the shop foreman to report the findings as soon as possible to the Police Jury for further action.
5. It is recommended that overtime, as needed be authorized for the shop mechanics in order to complete repair jobs whenever the parts are delivered to the shop. A report of all overtime incurred is to be provided each meeting.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury give final approval, and accept as complete, the subdivision development identified as Rosebed Estates Subdivision.

It is further recommended that the act of acceptance and related documents be allowed to be recorded in the Clerk of Court records prior to Monday's meeting.

7. It is recommended that the Area 1 Road Crew be reorganized to normally operate with only four (4) mowers instead of five (5), and that the fifth operator be assigned to a dump truck, thereby having four dump trucks operating in the area.
8. It is recommended that Charles Dozier be promoted to asphalt crew foreman replacing Dudley Broussard, who was appointed road supervisor. Appointment to be on a 6 month probationary basis running concurrent with Mr. Broussard's appointment as road supervisor.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury advertise for a general laborer and truck driver positions for the asphalt crew.

9. It is recommended that the Police Jury enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Abbeville to install culverts on the south side of Rodeo Drive (ED#7) from Dairy Festival Road, westward to the outfall ditch, in order to correct an erosion problem and to provide a shoulder on the road. Cost of the culvert materials to be paid by the Police Jury. The City of Abbeville will provide labor and equipment to install the culverts and build any drop inlets needed. Costs of the culvert material is to be paid from Sub 1 of 2 Road District Funds.
10. It is recommended that the Police Jury recognize the establishment of a private road to be identified as M. Lemaire (Pvt.) Road, located off of Morning Dove (Pvt.) Road, which is located off of Hwy. 700 in Election District No. 2.

It is further recommended that 911 be advised of the addition to the road system and that Sellers & Associates, Inc. be directed to add the road name and location to the parish map.

11. It is recommended that quotes be obtained to install replacement gutters at the new Area 2 Barn site.
12. It is recommended that the President be authorized to execute the U.S. DOT-Louisiana Unified Certification Program Agreement, which sets out regulations to certify small social and economically Disadvantaged Business Enterprises, in order for agencies, who receive FTA or FAA funds, to develop a Unified Certification Program, which is a requirement for receiving those funds.
13. It is recommended that Police Jury get a status report on the PAB Oil Superfund site.
14. It is recommended the Road Committee bills be approved to be paid.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON SEPTEMBER 15, 2004, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury agree to pay the 10% local match (\$5460.00) on behalf of the Erath Fire Department relative to their FEMA-FIRE Grant which has been awarded to them, subject to all paperwork being provided.
2. It is recommended that a new ¾ ton diesel pickup truck for the solid waste operation be authorized to be purchased through state contract when the new contract becomes available.
3. It is recommended that the Solid Waste Supervisor and Parish Engineer meet to discuss remedies to the tree debris stockpile at the solid waste site.

It is further recommended that Sellers & Associates, Inc. be authorized to prepare a permit modification to address the expansion of the current Sub-Title D Cell adjacent to the Type 3 cell, at the solid waste plant.

4. It is recommended that change Order No. 1 to the Garbage Container contract to furnish containers for the automated trucks be approved. Change Order provides pricing to furnish truckload quantity (336) of containers. Truckload price is \$48.25 per container, in lieu of lot (20 containers) price of \$ 64.78 per container.

It is further recommended that authorization be given to purchase one (1) truckload of a second color container now, and if necessary a second truckload is authorized to be purchased.

5. It is recommended that Invoice No. 108993 from the Department of Environmental Quality-Office of Management and Finance, in the amount of \$698.00, be approved to be paid. Invoice represents Annual Air Quality fee for the solid waste plant and burner unit site.
6. It is recommended that the invoices submitted by the Public Works supervisors be approve to be paid.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury consider adopting a Ground Water Protection Ordinance and direct the secretary and legal counsel to prepare a draft for their review.
