Minutes of a special meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on October 19, 2005 with Mr. Hubert J. Faulk presiding.

The meeting was called to order by President Faulk, who asked Juror Wayne Touchet, to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Upon motion of Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury considers additions/changes to the agenda. The result of the roll call vote on the motion was unanimous.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to give time on the agenda to the Secretary/Treasurer and the Solid Waste Supervisor.

Upon motion of Mr. Ravis Menard., duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the regular meeting of October 17, 2005 were dispensed with and were accepted.

Ms. Cindy O'Neal, the NFIP State Coordinator with the State of Louisiana, Department of Transportation and Development addressed the Jury on the Parish Flood Ordinance and the procedure on issuing permits to residents with damage homes from Hurricane Rita.

Along with Ms. O'Neal was Ms. Nancy Olson, Mr. David Heigal, FEMA representatives, Mr. Shane Raugh with Louisiana Hazard Mitigation, Ms. Diana Harrah, Insurance Specialist with CSC Corp., Mr. David Otagard, Flood Insurance Claims, Mr. Danny Campbell, FEMA Representative and Ms. Charmani Pousson, SBA Representative.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to use as a guideline for the appraisal of homes to add 20% to the Tax Assessment for the pre-market value of homes before Hurricane Rita.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved a program refundable by FEMA for (DMORT) Disaster Mortuary Operational Response Team, relative to re-entombment of displace graves by Hurricane Rita.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Invoice No. 7658 to Hanagriff's Machine Shop in the amount of \$21,435.00 to purchase materials for the shredder mill at the Solid Waste Plant.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment to Piazza Office Supply in the amount of \$7,651.00 for a Sharp Model ARM455 copy machine for the Solid Waste Plant.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to extend the State of Emergency for another 30 days.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to transfer Ms. Amanda Luquette still on a part-time basis from the Public Works Office to the Administrative Office.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the following precincts to be temporarily relocated due to Hurricane Rita.

- (A) Precinct 23 Temporarily relocate precinct location from the 7<sup>th</sup> Ward Elementary School to the 7<sup>th</sup> Ward Fire Station located at 20321 La. Hwy. 82 in Abbeville, Louisiana.
- (B) Precinct 50-A and 50-B Temporarily relocate precinct location from the Erath City Court to the Erath City Hall located at 115 W. Edwards Street in Erath, Louisiana.
- (C) Precinct 53 and 54 Temporarily relocate precinct location from the Delcambre City Hall to the Delcambre Elementary School located at 706 Martin Luther King Drive in Delcambre, Louisiana.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Ravis Menard and unanimously carried, the Police Jury awarded the quote of Landry's AC & Heating at a cost of \$2,940.00, for the purchase of a Lennox 12 Seer 5 ton heatpump being the (2) two quotes received for the LeBlanc Volunteer Fire Department.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard and unanimously carried, that there being no further business to be presented, the meeting was duly adjourned.
