- (c) The Keep Abbeville Beautiful Committee will have a general membership meeting on August 4, 2005 from (5:30 p.m. till 7:00 p.m.) at the Abbeville City Hall.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes of the regular meeting of July 18, 2005, were dispensed with and were accepted.

Ms. Liz Girouard, with Sellers and Associates, Inc., presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1354-D to Browning Oil Company, to prop wash an existing channel and slip to place a drilling barge for the S.L. 17826 No. 2 well, located in Buck Point Field, in Election District No.9.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1355-D to Cimarex Energy Company, to construct a drill site for the Cimarex-Harrington Well No. 1, located in Election District No.2.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "Letter of No Objection" to ExxonMobil Production Company, request to dredge for drilling and installing facilities to produce the Exxon Fee Well No., 109 from an existing slip, located in Section 7, 8, T-16-S, R-1-E, southeasterly from Pecan Island, in Election District No. 13.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "Letter of No Objection" to Range Production Company, to install product pads to produce the E. C. Petry Heirs No. 1 Well, in Section 1, T-10-S, R-1-E, off of Simon Road, located in Election District No. 12.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the July 27, 2005 General Needs Committee Recommendations, as presented, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations:

AS A RESULT OF A GENERAL NEEDS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JULY 27, 2005, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that a right of way extension be approved on Mansel Road, to provide a turnaround for school buses and solid waste equipment. The approval is subject to the right of way instrument being executed, and all paperwork being in order.
2. It is recommended that the legal counsel be authorized to research available statutes to address the ability of the Police Jury to pursue "abatement procedures" against the Nite Life Lounge.

3. It is recommended that the Police Jury obtain three (3) quotes to address current fencing needs at the Law Enforcement Center.

It is further recommended that in response to a request by the Sheriff's Office, that an estimate be obtained for a perimeter fence on approximately 8 acres of the Law Enforcement Center property and the matter be submitted to the Finance Committee for consideration in the 2007 budget.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury, in response to a request of the Sheriff's Office, look into the feasibility of establishing an alarm notification system for the Law Enforcement Center area.

4. It is recommended that a committee composed of the Courthouse Offices, Parish Legislators, the Sheriff, and 15<sup>th</sup> Judicial District Court Administrator be established to develop a security plan for the courthouse. Mr. Ronald Darby, Courthouse/Building Committee Chairman will represent the Police Jury on the committee.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury give final approval to the subdivision development identified as Horseman's Park Subdivision, Phase 1 & 2.
6. It is recommended that Ms. Karen Crosby be hired on a temporary basis, as an animal control officer at the Rabies Control Center, to replace Mr. Keith Henry, who will be out due to illness.
7. It is recommended that the purchasing agent obtain additional quotes for termite spraying at the Area 2 Barn site.
8. It is recommended that the Public Works site be cleaned and the perimeter fence area cleared of trees and brush, and that quotes be obtained to repair the perimeter fencing.
9. It is recommended that until a new secretary-treasurer is named that the meeting minutes be signed by Ms. Carolyn Bessard or Ms. Linda Duhon.
10. It is recommended that a letter be sent to Mr. J. D. Pierce explaining the residential garbage collection process implemented for the parish.
11. It is recommended that the Police Jury and City of Abbeville, utilizing the current intergovernmental agreement, authorized the overlay of N. Louisiana Street from Graceland Street north to its dead end. City to pay the cost of materials and the Police Jury will provide the labor and equipment to do the project.
12. It is recommended that the Police Jury obtain quotes for the replacement of the six (6) air conditioning units at the Parish Government Office Complex and award the contract to the low bidder.

It is further recommended that the General Fund budget be amended to reflect the needed repair and that an additional transfer be authorized from either the Royalty Road Fund or 78 Sales Tax Fund if needed at the end of the year.

13. It is recommended that the request by the Coulee Kinney Drainage District for an intergovernmental agreement to improve a ditch in the area of the Foreman property be deferred until the next road committee meeting.
14. It is recommended that the Police Jury accept the resignation of Ms. Pat Heard from the Vermilion Parish Tourist Commission, and that a letter of commendation be sent to Ms. Heard thanking her for her service to the Commission.
15. It is recommended that the Police Jury defer action on the development of a parishwide ordinance banning smoking in parish facilities.
16. It is recommended that the Police Jury, in lieu of naming appointees to the Youth Planning Board for the 15<sup>th</sup> Judicial District, that the name of public entities involved with youth programs be submitted. The entities would include the Sheriff, FINS, District Attorney, Sheriff's Juvenile Office, School Board, Herod Village Organization, etc.
17. It is recommended that Mr. Gaulman Gaspard be appointed to the Acadiana Resource Conservation & Development Council, Inc. as one of the Police Jury representatives to replace Mr. Michael Bertrand.
18. It is recommended that the Crisis Leave Pool Policy (2005-General-02) be approved as amended.
19. It is recommended that the Police Jury issue the award of a contract to Kaplan Telephone Co. to furnish and install a new telephone system for the Police Jury Administrative Office and the Registrar of Voters Office at a maximum cost of \$6,281.74, based on their bid proposal, which was the lowest of the three (3) submitted.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury accepted a petition submitted by residents in the neighborhood of the Nite Life Lounge requesting action be taken.

The Police Jury's Legal Counsel, Mr. Paul Moresi, III, informed the Jury that he has researched the options available to the Police Jury regarding complaints about the Nite Life Lounge.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury directed the legal counsel to prepare an amendment to the liquor permit ordinance, which would be similar to the Lafayette Parish Ordinance.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorize the Legal Counsel to prepare a law suit against the Nite Life Lounge, which would address this matter and would act to abate a nuisance related to crime, or other related activity at the lounge.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. Mark Poche`, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted an ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Brandon Road, 100 yards north and south of Mr. Kimball Foreman's home.

## **ORDINANCE**

### **2005-O-23**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Brandon Road, in Election District No. 2.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby imposes a 35 mph speed limit on Brandon Road, 100 yards north and south of 1138 Brandon Road; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit sign be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.
