Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on August 15, 2005, with President Hubert J. Faulk presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Faulk, who asked Juror Purvis Abshire, to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Registrar of Voters, Mr. Michael J. Bertrand, informed the Jury that Voter Registration Week will be August 22-26, 2005.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes of the regular meeting of August 1, 2005, were dispensed with and were accepted.

President Faulk read the following announcements:

1. The Louisiana Wetlands Conservation And Restoration Authority quarterly meeting will be held on Tuesday, August 30, 2005, at 12:30 p.m. at the Galvez Building in Baton Rouge, La.
2. The Coastal Wetlands Planning, Protection and Restoration Act meeting will hold the 15th Priority Project List (PPL) public meeting on August 30, 2005, at 7:00 p.m. – 8:15 p.m. at the Vermilion Parish Police Jury Courthouse Building, Courtroom 1, in Abbeville, La.
3. The Governor's Office of Rural Development, in cooperation with USDA Rural Development, the Southern Rural Development Center will host the 2005 Southern Institute for Rural Development training workshop, on September 12-15, 2005, in West Monroe, LA.
4. The 2005 Rural Development Grant applications will be posted on Friday, August 12, 2005, the first grant review deadline is scheduled for October 2, 2005.

Mr. Gene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers and Associates, Inc., presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "Letter of No Objection" to McMoran Oil & Gas, LLC, to transfer ownership for Project No. 1318-D from McMoran Oil & Gas, LLC to ExxonMobil Production Company, located in Election District No. 13.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1356 to Range Production Co. to furnish and install approximately 3,161 feet of (1), 3-inch pipeline, in the Indian Bayou area, located in Election District No.12.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Permit No. 1357-D to Bois D'arc Offshore, LTD, to construct a drill site, for the S.L. 18601, Well No. 1, located in Block 12 offshore, in Election District No. 9.

Upon motion of Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Mark Poche`, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1359 to Walter Oil & Gas Corporation, to install approximately 2,100 feet of (1), 3.5-inch flowline to service the Richard No. 1 Well, located in Election District No.03.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a Project Permit to Petro Gulf Corporation pending the engineer's review.

Upon motion of Mr. Mark Poche`, duly seconded by Mr. Edval Simon, Jr. and carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Partial payment Estimate No. 1, in the amount of \$44,804.43, to Gray Construction Company, relative to the Erath/Bayou Tigre Phase I Project.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Ravis Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Sellers & Associates, Inc. to prepare information data for the use in flood mapping efforts for FEMA to assist in preparing in Flood Map Modernization.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted the following ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Horseshoe and Old Sugar Mill Road, which will replace all existing speed limit signs.

ORDINANCE

2005-O-24

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Horseshoe and Sugar Mill Road, in Election District No. 9.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 35 mph speed limit on Horseshoe and Old Sugar Mill Road, which will replace all existing speed limit signs; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit sign be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

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Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations as presented, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations.
