

Police Jury Room
September 19, 2005
Abbeville, Louisiana

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on September 19, 2005, with President Hubert J. Faulk presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Faulk, who asked Solid Waste Supervisor, Ricky LeBlanc, to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Upon motion of Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury considers additions/changes to the agenda, and that a roll call votes on this motion. The result of the roll call vote on the motion was unanimous, that the Secretary/Treasurer, Mr. Clay P. Menard and the Solid Waste Supervisor, Mr. Ricky LeBlanc be on the agenda.

Upon motion of Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with Consolidated Gravity Drainage District No. 1 - Ward One, to use the Police Jury dump trucks to move excavated material away from a ditch on the Moresi property located in the Erath area, and which interfere with the tenant farmer harvesting his crop.

Don Trahan, State Representative addressed the Jury about a special session to help New Orleans recover from Hurricane Katrina.

(Ret.) General Robert LeBlanc, Director of the Homeland Security Office of Emergency Preparedness informed the Jury about FEMA's reimbursement for expenses incurred in Vermilion Parish for Hurricane Katrina. Mr. LeBlanc informed the Jury that FEMA has inquired about putting trailers in the Kaplan, Gueydan and Abbeville area for the Hurricane Katrina victims.

General LeBlanc gave an update on Hurricane Rita advising the Jury about evacuating certain areas in the parish and evacuating special need patients. They will have a FEMA meeting on Tuesday, September 20, 2005, at 10:00 a.m. to discuss the location of trailers in our parish and at 11:00 a.m. a conference call will be held with the Louisiana Office of Emergency Preparedness about Hurricane Rita.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes of the regular meeting of September 6, 2005, were dispensed with and were accepted.

President Faulk read the following announcements:

- 1) This year Mount Carmel Elementary School is proud to be celebrating its 120th anniversary. The Sisters of Mt. Carmel cordially invite you to a "Walk Down Memory Lane" to be held on Sunday, September 25, 2005, from 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. at Mount Carmel Elementary School in Abbeville.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers and Associates, Inc., presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the President to sign the Capital Outlay Grants for the cooperative agreements for the Flood Protection in the Bayou Tigre Area, Truck By Pass Route Improvements in the Gueydan Area and the Multi Purpose Arena.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1363 D&P, contingent upon the approval of the emergency plan approved by the Vermilion Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness, to Petrohawk Energy Corporation to drill and install approximately 1,434 feet of (1), 3-inch pipeline to serve Alliance Trust Company, Well No. 049, off of Highway 713 and north Barbara Road, located in Election District No.14.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1364 D&P, contingent upon the approval of the emergency plan approved by the Vermilion Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness, to Cimarex Energy Company, to construct a drill site, for the Horseman et al #1 Well, off of Monceaux Road, located in Election District No. 14.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1365 D&P, contingent upon the approval of the emergency plan approved by the Vermilion Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness, to Petrohawk Energy Corporation, to drill and install approximately 1,700 feet of (1), 3.-inch pipeline to service the Alliance Trust Company Well No. 050 and 051, these two wells will be drilled on the same pad, off of Highway 713 and north of Barbara Road, located in Election District No.14.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1366-D, contingent upon the approval of the emergency plan approved by the Vermilion Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness, to McMoran Oil & Gas, LLC, to construct a drill site, for the Liberty Canal No. 1 Well, off of May Road, located in Election District No. 13

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "Letter of No Objection" to Midstream Fuel Service, LLC to replace approximately 140 feet of steel sheet pile bulkhead, in Section 90, T-14-S, R-3-E, located in Election District No. 09.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted the following ordinance establishing a 40 mph speed limit on Placide Road from the intersection of Roy Road traveling west to the intersection of Alfred Road.

ORDINANCE

2005-O-27

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Placide Road, in Election District No. 1.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 40 mph speed limit on Placide Road from the intersection of Roy Road traveling west to the intersection of Alfred Road.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit sign be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON SEPTEMBER 14, 2005, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve payment to Hixson Autoplex in Alexandria in the amount of \$16,106.00 for an F-350 Ford pickup truck for the Solid Waste Program.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve establishing a policy for uniforms, that all uniforms need to be returned when employee leaves employment with the Jury and if the uniforms are not returned, the employee must pay for the uniforms, and in the event the uniforms are not returned, the Jury will hold the employee's last payroll check until the uniform is returned or the cost of the uniform will be subtracted from the employees last payroll check.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury enter into an intergovernmental with the Water Works District No. 1 to provide the labor and equipment to load old culverts and unload new culverts.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt a resolution urging the Louisiana Legislature to exempt local governments for the liability to pay excise taxes on their purchases of gasoline and other motor fuels.

5. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter to all municipalities that the Solid Waste Facility will no longer be picking up trees or accepting trees beginning October 1, 2005.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve to hire a part-time employee to fill in Mr. John Earl Harrington position who is on Workers Compensation.
7. It is recommended that the invoices submitted by approved to be paid.

RESOLUTION

2005-R-22

A RESOLUTION URGING THE LOUISIANA LEGISLATURE TO EXEMPT LOCAL GOVERNMENTS FROM THE LIABILITY TO PAY TAXES ON THEIR PURCHASES OF GASOLINE AND OTHER MOTOR FUELS

WHEREAS, parishes, municipalities school boards, and other local government entities in Louisiana continue to struggle with the problem of balancing their budgets; and

WHEREAS, under current law, local governing bodies must pay Louisiana's state government the full 20 cent per gallon tax on all gasoline purchases that they make; and

WHEREAS, in these current economic times, it does not seem right that Louisiana's local governments should have to pay taxes to the state government; and

WHEREAS, a review of the tax laws reveals that for the most part, state government generally exempts local governments from the payment of most state taxes (i.e., sales taxes, income taxes, etc.) and local governments exempt the state from the payment of local taxes (i.e., property taxes, sales taxes, etc.); and

WHEREAS, a review of the gasoline tax laws further reveals that the Legislature has already exempted a number of other entities from payment of this tax, including sales to the federal government and its agencies, sales to school bus drivers and sales to farmers, fisherman and aviation entities; Therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby urge the Louisiana Legislature to pass the necessary laws to exempt local governments in this state from the liability to pay taxes on their purchases of gasoline and other motor fuels; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Vermilion Parish Legislative Delegation, the Police Jury Association of Louisiana and all Parish Governments in the State of Louisiana for their support of this endeavor.

**ORDINANCE NO.
2005-O-22**

AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING REMOTE CONTROLLED
MODEL AIRPLANES IN THE UNINCORPORATED
AREAS OF THE PARISH OF VERMILION

BE IT ORDAINED by the Vermilion Parish Police Jury, that:

WHEREAS, the operation of remote controlled model airplanes poses an excessive sound hazard and a safety hazard to the public health, welfare, safety and the quality of life; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the unincorporated area of the Parish of Vermilion have a right to, and should be ensured of an environment free from excessive sound hazards and safety hazards associated with the operation of remote controlled model airplanes, especially in residential areas during the hours sleep normally occurs; and

WHEREAS, considering the foregoing, it is the policy of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury to prevent excessive sound hazards and safety hazards associated with the operation of the radio controlled model airplanes that may jeopardize the health, welfare, or safety of the citizens of the parish of Vermilion or degrade the quality of life therein, particularly in our residential neighborhoods, and in accordance therewith, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury desires to establish new regulations governing said operations in the unincorporated areas of the Parish of Vermilion.

Sec. 1. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this article, shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

Remote controlled model airplane means a scaled version of an aircraft, either fixed wing or rotorcraft, that is controlled remotely by electronic, radio, or other signal, or other method of remote control.

Model airplane club means an association consisting of two or more people, that is organized primarily for the purpose of operating remote controlled model airplanes and associated activities.

Sec. 2. Applicability.

This ordinance applies to the operation of remote controlled model airplanes, or similar devices, within the unincorporated areas of the Parish of Vermilion.

Sec. 3. Permits Required

Any *model airplane club* wishing to operate in the Parish of Vermilion shall first obtain a permit from the Vermilion Parish Police Jury. Said permit shall include (1) the name and address of the model airplane club, (2) the names and addresses of its organizers; (3) the location to be used for activities of said club; and (4) evidence of liability insurance coverage for the activities of said club, including liability limits of at least \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence.

Sec. 4. Hours and Location of Operation

Whether in association with a *model airplane club* or not, no person shall operate remote controlled model airplanes except between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday, and between 12:00 Noon and 6:00 p.m. on Sunday. No person shall operate remote controlled model airplanes within a recognized residential subdivision, or in such close proximity to a recognized residential subdivision so as to cause a nuisance.

Sec. 5. Enforcement and penalties.

Any person found to be in violation of this Ordinance shall be subject to a maximum fine of \$500.00 and/or a term of imprisonment of thirty (30) days in the parish jail or both. Each violation shall be deemed a separate offense.

Sec. 6. Repeal of conflicting ordinances.

All ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 7. Severability

Should any part of this ordinance be declared null, void, invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the remainder of the said ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury to close the Police Jury Office on the Friday before the first weekend in October, in observance of the Cattle Festival in Abbeville. A vote was taken 12 For – 2 Against. Therefore, the motion passed.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved that all Police Jury employees will be off on the Friday before the first weekend in October, in observance of the Cattle Festival in Abbeville, except for the Solid Waste employees; they will be scheduled to work and will get holiday pay.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, due to State Highway closures a considerable increase of heavy vehicles are using Detraz Road, Rue Francois Road and Prairie Road the Police Jury authorized the Secretary/Treasurer to adopted an ordinance and impose a “No Trucks Allowed” zone on said roads for their entire length while said closure on La 82 is in effect; and that the appropriate signs be installed in said area. “Trucks” are defined as any vehicle weighting more than 14,000 pounds and publicly owned service vehicles are exempted from this ordinance.

ORDINANCE

2005-O-30

WHEREAS, It has been brought to the Police Jury’s attention that, due to State Highway closures a considerable increase in the amount of traffic, which includes heavy vehicles, are using Detraz Road, Rue Francois Road and Prairie Road.

WHEREAS, this increase in traffic is causing very hazardous conditions as well as an imposition and abuse; and

WHEREAS, these parish roads and the bridges servicing them are not designed to bear the weight of the vehicles using said roads,

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a “No Trucks Allowed” zone on said roads for their entire length while said closure on La 82 is in effect; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED that the appropriate signs installed in said area.

“Trucks” are defined as any vehicle weighting more than 14,000 pounds.

Publicly owned service vehicles are exempted from this ordinance.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 20 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 30 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff’s Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce this ordinance by regular patrolling of said roads.
