Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on January 23, 2006, with President Mark Poche` presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Poche`, who asked Juror David C. Mayard, to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to rescind the action on the January 3, 2006, Police Jury meeting relative to reappointing Mr. Menard as Secretary/Treasurer of the Police Jury.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet., duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk., and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the regular meeting of January 3, 2006 were dispensed with and were approved as amended.

President Poche` read the following announcements:

- (a) The Coastal Wetlands Planning, Protection and Restoration Act Task Force meeting will be held on Wednesday, February 8, 2006 at 9:30 a.m. at the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers Office in New Orleans.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr. with Sellers and Associates, Inc. presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Mr. Sellers advised the Jury that a "Notice To Bidders" was advertise for the "Dredging Oilfield Canal at Oaks Canal" and the deadline was today at 10:00 a.m. Mr. Sellers informed the Jury no bids were received and requested to readvertise bid for another (30) thirty days.

Upon motion of Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to readvertise the bid for the 'Dredging Oilfield Canal at Oaks Canal' for another (30) thirty days.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the preliminary/final plat for the subdivision development identified as Providence Subdivision, Phase II, in Election District No. 6, contingent upon Parish Engineers comments.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the preliminary plat for the development identified as Kirkland Estates, in Election District No. 1, contingent upon Parish Engineer and Drainage Board review.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JANUARY 18, 2006, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve to maintain 2,600 feet of E. Abshire Road.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Public Works Director to purchase a new air condition for the Area 2 Barn.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve a leave of absence to Mr. Albert Thibodeaux.

4. It is recommended that the Police Jury accept 100 feet of Eldridge Road into the Road System up to the bridge, subject to the appropriate paperwork being submitted, and authorize the Parish Engineer to go out and survey this location.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to go size culverts to close off a ditch and clean out the alley off of Marcia and Villien Street.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 45 mph speed limit on Alexander Road for its entire length.

8. It is recommended that the Police Jury cancel an intergovernmental agreement with Gravity Drainage District No. 2 to repair a bridge off of Amerada Road.

In accordance with the Public Road Committee Recommendations, the following Ordinance was adopted:

## **ORDINANCE**

### **2006-O-01**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Alexander Road, in Election District No. 13.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 45 mph speed limit on Alexander Road for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit sign be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

ORDINANCE

98-0-13

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 98-0-13 ENACTING COMPLIANCE WITH CHAPTER XIII, SUB PART D – INDIVIDUAL SEWERAGE SYSTEMS, AND PARTICULARLY ARTICLE 13:019-1 OF THE LOUISIANA STATE SANITARY CODE, WHICH WAS ADOPTED ON OCTOBER 5, 1998, TO PROVIDE FOR TEMPORARY CAMPER SEWER HOOK-UPS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of Vermilion Parish, in regular session convened on this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of January, 2006, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury hereby amends Parish Ordinance No. 98-0-13.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that it is the desire of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury to amend Ordinance No. 98-0-13 to allow motor homes, trailers or FEMA campers to hook-up or tap into existing sewer systems at homes not damaged by the effects of Hurricane Rita, for a period of eighteen (18) months, or until March 31, 2007.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all other provisions of Ordinance No. 98-0-13 shall remain the same.
