Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on October 16, 2006, with President Mark Poche` presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Poche`, who asked Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Upon motion of Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized additions/changes to the agenda to allow Ms. Liz Girouard, with Sellers & Associates, Inc. to open the bids for a 2006 Model Wheeled Excavator/Telescope Boom.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury accepted the bids and awarded the bid to Scott Construction Company for (3) three 2006 Model Wheeled Excavators/Telescope Boom including additive No. 1, 2, & 3, for a total cost of \$868,500.00.

Mr. Brian Walley with Scott Construction Equipment Company, L.L.C. addressed the Jury on the bid package for the 2006 Model Wheeled Excavator/Telescope Boom.

Mr. Gray Vanek with Louisiana Machinery addressed the Jury about the problems with the final drive guards on the dozers, which was purchased from Louisiana Machinery for the Solid Waste Facility. Mr. Vanek stated that he was not involved with the sale of the dozer, and that the specifications did not include the landfill package, which included the final drive guards.

Mr. David Dresser, Branch Manager with Louisiana Machinery addressed the Jury on what type of dozer they purchased. Mr. Dresser stated that the Jury's specifications did not include the landfill package with final drive guards.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel to get with Sellers & Associates, Inc. to look into how Unit No. SWD 452 & SWD 464 was specked out.

Mr. Ricky LeBlanc, Solid Waste Supervisor informed the Jury that Unit No. SWD 452 is broken and needs to be sent to the shop to be repaired.

Upon motion of Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the Solid Waste Supervisor to have Louisiana Machinery pick up Unit No. SWD 452, to be repaired under warranty and the Jury will pay for the transportation cost.

Mr. Michael J. Bertrand, Registrar of Voters addressed the Jury on the Amendments on the upcoming Election on November 7, 2006, Ballot and early voting.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel to prepare a public service announcement to publish in the Official Journal explaining Amendment No. 2 Parish Severance Tax on the November 7, 2006, Election.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury reconvened back to regular agenda.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the October 2, 2006 meeting, were dispensed with and were accepted.

President Poche` read the following announcements:

- (A) The Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority will have a meeting on Thursday, October 19, 2006, at 9:00 a.m.-Noon at the House Committee Room 5 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

Ms. Liz Girouard with Sellers & Associates, Inc. presented the following various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of the following Pipeline Permits excluding Pipeline Permit No, 1442-D, contingent upon engineering comments:

- (A) Project Permit No. 1131-D to Murphy Exploration, to re-enter the Zaunbrecher 36 No. 1 Well, located off of Curtis Road in Election District No. 14, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/ Office of Emergency Preparedness.
- (B) Project Permit No. 1407-D to Murphy Exploration & production Company to change of ownership of well, located off of La. Hwy. 14, in Election District No. 10, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/ Office of Emergency Preparedness..
- (C) Project Permit No. 1443-D to Republic Resources, LLC to construct a drill site for the drilling of the Meaux No. 1, and drill site will be accessed from Davis Road, in Election District No. 02, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/ Office of Emergency Preparedness.
- (D) Project Permit No. 1444-P to Hilcorp Energy Company to furnish and install approximately 14,016 feet of one 6-inch pipeline beginning at the existing S.L. 3052 Well and tying into an existing facility, located in White Lake at Lac Blanc Field, in Election District No. 13, contingent upon receiving insurance certificate.
- (E) Project Permit No. 1445-D to McMoRan Oil & Gas, LLC to prop-wash a channel and private slip and to construct a shell pad for the purpose of drilling the S.L. 18091 "F" located in White Lake at Lac Blanc Field, in Election District No. 13, contingent upon receiving insurance certificate and the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/ Office of Emergency Preparedness.
- (F) Project Permit No. 1446-P to Kaiser-Francis Oil Company to furnish and install approximately 1,498 feet of one 4 ½ -inch pipeline in 6-inch casing beginning at the existing Kash O & G Alleman No. 1 and tying into an existing 6-inch valve, located across Alice Road, in Election District No. 02, contingent upon receiving insurance certificate.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of the following telecommunication permits:

- (A) Bell South to bore a 50'-pair cable along La. Hwy. 688, located in Election District No. 09.
- (B) Bell South to bore a 100'-pair aerial cable on Sidney Gautreaux Road, located in Election District No. 02.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "Letter Of No Objection" to Raywood Stelly/Cajun Alligator Farm for an "after the fact" permit to construct a protection levee around the alligator farm, in Section 35 of T-14-S, R-1-E, located in Election District No. 13.

President Poche` gave an update from FEMA on the fire stations which were damaged by Hurricane Rita.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Sellers & Associates, Inc. to move forward with preparing plans and specifications for the relocation of the Henry and 7th Ward Fire Stations, relative to Hurricane Rita.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations, as presented and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations:

10. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter advising Judge Frank E. Lemoine that the Kaplan City Court's Chief Clerk and all other Court Clerks work week will now be forty hours and will be paid accordingly.

It is further recommended that the Kaplan City Court's Chief Clerk grade adjustment be denied.

Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted an ordinance to establish a 45 mph speed limit and “Watch for Children” signs traveling south 2,800 feet on Joe Road before the intersection of Romeal Road and traveling south 2,200 feet on Joe Road pass the intersection of Romeal Road.

ORDINANCE

2006-O-32

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury’s attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Joe Road, in Election District No. 13.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 45 mph speed limit on Joe Road, traveling south 2,800 feet on Joe Road before the intersection of Romeal Road and traveling south 2,200 feet on Joe Road pass the intersection of Romeal Road and also install “Watch for Children” signs in this area.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit, and “Watch for Children” signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

* * * * *

President Poche` stated that he would like to reduce the Jury down from 14 to 8 at next year's election. The Districts will be like the School Board Districts, which already has Justice Department approval.

Upon motion of Mr. David C. Mayard, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, a motion was made to reduce the Jury down from 14 to 8 at next years election to follow the same Districts as the School Board Districts has now, which has been approved by the Justice Department.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, a substitute motion was made to table the above motion in order for the newly formed committee to look into reducing the Police Jury members.

Mr. Ronald Darby rescinded his motion.

Mr. Hubert J. Faulk stated that at the September 30, 2006 Election 11.81% of the registered voters voted for the Home Rule Charter, 17.88% of the registered voters voted against the Home Rule Charter, 29.69% of the registered voters did vote in the September 30, 2006 Election. They have 37,000 total registered voters in the Parish. 26,015 did not vote. Mr. Faulk's motion is that at reapportionment, at the 2011 Election after the Census that a study be made in reducing the size of the Jury.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, made a substitute motion, that at reapportionment, at the 2011 Election after the Census that a study be made in reducing the size of the Jury. A roll call vote was taken as follows:
