Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on April 3, 2006, with President Mark Poche` presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Poche`, who asked Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes of the March 20, 2006 meeting, were dispensed with and were accepted.

President Poche` read the following announcements:

- 1) The Louisiana PRIMA Spring Conference "Confronting the Rising Cost of Risks for Public Entities" will be held on April 19-21, 2006, at the Isle of Capri Hotel in Bossier City, Louisiana.
- 2) The 23<sup>rd</sup> Annual Louisiana Floodplain Management Association, Technical & Business Conference will be held on April 19-21, 2006, in Vidalia, Louisiana.

Mr. Eugene Sellers with Sellers & Associates, Inc. informed the Jury that he and Mr. Matthew Trahan met with the insurance adjuster to discuss the damages of the three fire stations relative to Hurricane Rita. The insurance adjuster will come back with a re-evaluation and meet with Mr. Matthew Trahan and the Police Jury.

President Poche` informed the Jury that he met with the insurance adjuster after they met with Mr. Sellers and Mr. Trahan. The insurance adjuster advised him that they could come with their own people to bring back the buildings to restoration. Mr. Poche` informed the Jury that the insurance adjuster will get back with Mr. Sellers.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Jr. informed the Jury that the new LCDBG Multi Purpose Community Center will be in a flood zone, with the proposed new base flood maps so the building will have to be raised 1.5'. Mr. Sellers advised the Jury that the bids for the construction need to be delayed for 30 days.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Sellers & Associates, Inc. to delay the bid openings for the LCDBG Multi Purpose Community Center for 30 days to execute an addendum to prepare base flood elevation to 1.5'.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr. informed the Jury that one bid was received for the "Drainage Improvements of Oilfield Canal" off of Oaks Canal and the base bid is the only one allowed by the state budget.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury awarded the contract for the "Drainage Improvements of Oilfield Canal" off of Oaks Canal to United Dredging Services Corp., in the amount of \$86,000 subject to state approval.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr. with Sellers and Associates, Inc. presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1400 to Cimarex Energy Company, to furnish and install approximately 2,257 feet of (1) four inch pipeline to serve the Rodney J. Stelly Well, in Election District No. 14.

Upon motion of Mr. David C. Mayard, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a telecommunication permit to Bell South to furnish and install new cable along U. S. Hwy. 167 and down Cordell Road, located in Election District No. 1.

Upon motion of Mr. David C. Mayard, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, with Juror Ronald Darby abstaining, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a telecommunication permit to Cox Communications to furnish and install new cable below ground for Beau Soleil Subdivision off of La. Hwy. 343, located in Election District No.2.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the General Needs Committee Recommendations, as presented, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations:

AS A RESULT OF A GENERAL NEEDS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON MARCH 29, 2006, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury accept the Shooting Range Ordinance with new provisions and amend the Ordinance to reflect that 90% of signatures are needed within a 1 mile radius for residents to be allowed to shoot until 10 p.m., and final adopting will be on April 3, 2006 Police Jury Meeting.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury take under advisement Southern Mutual Help LCDBG proposal.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to advertise to fill the opening for an Animal Control Warden.
4. It is further recommended that the Police Jury approve to pay an invoice submitted by Ms. Jessica Meaux from Custom Glass & Mirror in the amount of \$32.49 for repair damages which occurred to Ms. Jessica Meaux's windshield caused by an Area 3 truck.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Purchasing Agent to purchase 12 barricades.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to hire someone to knock down a dead tree, located off of Chassion Road, and the Jury will dispose of the tree, in Election District No. 6. Cost to be paid from the Road District 1 of 2 Fund.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to advertise to fill the opening for a (CDL) Tanker Truck Driver for the FRS Crew.  
  
It is further recommended that in view of Mr. Robert Vincent's not renewing his CDL License that his pay grade be changed to a Grade 10.
8. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 25 mph speed limit and "Watch For Children" signs on Crepe Myrtle Road for its entire length in Election District No. 2.
9. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter to the Louisiana State Delegation on the money being paid for the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) tire recycling program.

10. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the damage claim of Mr. Joseph D. Menard in the amount of \$749.79. Cost to be paid from 94` Sales Tax Fund.
11. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the damage claim of Ms. Beulah Lewis relative to a cracked windshield, when two cost estimates are received and the cost to be paid from 94` Sales Tax Fund.
12. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve to hire Mr. Adam Romero as a Rabies Control Warden to replace Ms. Karen Crosby. It is further recommended that the Police Jury rescind the motion to advertise for this position.
13. It is recommended that the Police Jury participate to co-sponsor the Acadiana Delegation (six parishes) to participate in a crawfish boil for the State Representative and State Senators on May 5, 2006, and the cost to co- sponsor will be \$1,000.
14. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Mr. Jay Guidry, Courthouse Janitorial Supervisor, to personally clean the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Annex. It is further recommended that the Police Jury authorize Mr. Jay Guidry to be responsible and handle any and all complaints from the Vermilion Parish Sheriff concerning the cleaning and maintenance of the Annex.
15. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Mr. Jay Campbell with the Abbeville Harbor & Terminal District, to discuss a common ground with companies to regulate boat wakes in the canals and boat channels and to contact the companies in Intracoastal City who would be affected and report back to the Jury.
16. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve Invoice No. 138023 to Acadiana Contractors Inc. in the amount of \$1378.50 relative to the rental of a crane, to install generators at the Courthouse.
17. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize to appoint Mr. Irving Chris Suire to the Industrial Development Board, replacing Mr. Ray Landry.
18. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the Secretary/Treasurer to attend the New England Mitigation Conference in Northampton, Massachusetts on Hurricane Recovery and working with FEMA on May 10 through 12, 2006.
19. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt a proclamation proclaiming June 1, 2006 and every June 1 hereafter as "Day of Prayer" in Vermilion Parish, to pray for protection from the hurricane devastation during hurricane season.

20. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt a resolution in support of Federal Legislation that would provide oil royalties derived from up to 12 miles offshore and shall be shared by state government getting 75% and the Federal Government receiving 25% and royalties over 12 miles shared 50% with affected parishes receiving 1/3 of state share in both situations.
21. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve to issue permits to re-roof structures and a completed roof inspection form must be submitted to the Vermilion Parish Police Jury Permit Office prior to a permit to dump at the Solid Waste Facility can be issued. It is further recommended that the Secretary/Treasurer notify all roofers and to advertise in local new papers.
22. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt a resolution supporting Acadiana Home Builders Association proposed solution to utilize a portion of the community grant dollars from federal hurricane relief dollars to 4 – lane Verot School Road from Highway 90 to Erath.
23. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve a proposed land exchange from Mr. O.H. Deshotel and the Vermilion Parish Police Jury at the Nunez dump site.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to prepare legal documents.

24. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve payment of Invoice No. 1726 to Tempco Services, Inc. for the replacement of the compressors at the courthouse in the amount of \$13,360.00 and also Invoice No. 1727 to Tempco Services, Inc. to repair a freon leak for Chiller No. 1, in the courthouse, in the amount of \$750.00.
25. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve to reinstate the Ambulance Ordinance Advisory Committee as follows:

In accordance with the General Needs Committee Recommendations the following ordinances were adopted:

**ORDINANCE**

**2006-O-10**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Crepe Myrtle Road, in Election District No. 02.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 25 mph speed limit and a "Watch For Children" sign on Crepe Myrtle Road for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit sign be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

In accordance with the General Needs Committee Recommendations the following resolutions were adopted:

**RESOLUTION**

**2006-R-28**

**WHEREAS**, Federal legislation is being proposed by Louisiana Congressman Bobby Jindal which would provide that oil royalties derived from up to 12 miles offshore shall be shared by the State government receiving 75% and Federal government receiving 25%, with all affected Parish governments to receive one-third of State revenues derived from this source; and

**WHEREAS**, said proposed legislation would also provide that oil royalties derived from over 12 miles offshore shall be shared by the State and Federal governments on a 50%-50% basis, with affected all Parish governments to receive one-third of State revenues derived from this source; and

**WHEREAS**, this method of distribution would be more equitable to local governments, whose infrastructure systems, including roads, drainage, sewerage disposal, etc., are affected by the use of heavy equipment and traffic generated by the oil and gas industry and would provide a much-needed source of revenue for repairs and improvements of existing infrastructure needs.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby express its support of proposed Federal legislation by Representative Bobby Jindal which would provide that oil royalties derived from up to 12 miles offshore shall be shared by the State government receiving 75% and Federal government receiving 25% and royalties derived from over 12 miles offshore shall be shared by the State and Federal governments on a 50%-50% basis, with affected Parish governments to receive one-third of State revenues in both situations.

**RESOLUTION**

**2006- R - 14**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE VERMILION PARISH POLICE JURY SUPPORTING THE ACADIAN HOME BUILDERS ASSOCIATION'S PROPOSED SOLUTION TO UTILIZE A PORTION OF THE COMMUNITY GRANT DOLLARS FROM THE FEDERAL HURRICANE RELIEF DOLLARS TO FOUR-LANE VEROT SCHOOL ROAD (A HURRICANE EVACUATION ROUTE) FROM HIGHWAY 90 TO ERATH, LOUISIANA**

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Vermilion Parish Police Jury, that:

**WHEREAS**, the parish of Vermilion, while not suffering a direct hit from the two devastating hurricanes last year, has experienced unprecedented population growth, adding to Lafayette's already robust economy; and

**WHEREAS**, every citizen of Vermilion Parish is aware of the tremendous impact it has had on our already crowded roadways; and

**WHEREAS**, Vermilion Parish's infrastructure, some of which are state highways, have served for years as woefully inadequate hurricane evacuation routes for many in lower lying Vermilion and Cameron Parishes; namely, Verot School Road; and

**WHEREAS**, the citizens of lower Vermilion Parish do not have an adequate highway system to effectively move them out of harm's way quickly to Highway 90; and

**WHEREAS**, the Acadian Home Builders Association would like to propose a solution to the dilemma, which would ultimately benefit both Vermilion and the state's hurricane evacuation plan.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Vermilion Parish Police Jury, that:

**SECTION 1:** All of the aforescribed "Whereas" clauses are adopted as part of this resolution.

**SECTION 2:** The Acadian Home Builders Association's proposal would be to utilize a portion of the Community Grant Dollars from the federal hurricane relief dollars to four-lane Verot School Road (a hurricane evacuation route) from Highway 90 to Erath, Louisiana.

**SECTION 3:** Although it does not resolve the entire issue, it would lend itself as a step in the right direction for those citizens who have very limited choices when it comes to accessing a speedy and safe evacuation route.

**SECTION 4:** The Clerk of the Vermilion Parish is hereby requested and instructed to provide a copy of this resolution to all legislators within the legislative districts of Lafayette Parish, Vermilion Parish and Cameron Parish, Louisiana, so as to request that such legislators take all necessary steps, including the introduction of appropriate legislation, to utilize a portion of the Community Grant Dollars from the federal hurricane relief dollars to four-lane Verot School Road (a hurricane evacuation route) from Highway 90 to Erath, Louisiana.

**SECTION 5:** All resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted a resolution approving the issuance, sale and delivery of \$2,717,000 of Water Revenue Bonds, Series 2007, of Southeast Waterworks District No. 2 of the Vermilion Parish and other matters relating thereto, including to provide interim financing for said District's waterworks project and the issuance, sale and delivery of \$2,717,000 of Bond Anticipation Notes of said District.

**RESOLUTION**

**2006-R-16**

A resolution approving the issuance, sale and delivery of \$2,717,000 of Water Revenue Bonds, Series 2007, of Southeast Waterworks District No. 2 of the Vermilion Parish and other matters relating thereto, including to provide interim financing for said District's waterworks project and the issuance, sale and delivery of \$2,717,000 of Bond Anticipation Notes of said District.

WHEREAS, the Board of Waterworks Commissioners of Southeast Waterworks District No. 2 of the Parish of Vermilion, State of Louisiana, by resolution adopted on March 14, 2006 (the "Resolution"), has authorized the issuance and delivery of \$2,717,000 of said Water Revenue Bonds, Series 2007 (the "Bonds"), to finance a portion of the costs of acquiring and constructing improvements and extensions to the System, including appurtenant equipment, accessories and properties, both personal and real, a work of public improvement for the Issuer (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, as provided in the Resolution, the United States of America, acting through Rural Development, the purchaser of the Bonds, requires the District to obtain interim financing for the construction of the Project, and the District shall obtain such interim financing through the issuance of \$2,717,000 Bond Anticipation Notes of the District (the "Notes"), all as provided in the Resolution;

WHEREAS, it is now the desire of the Police Jury of the Parish of Vermilion, State of Louisiana, to approve the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds and the Notes as required by Article IV, Section 15 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974 and the authority supplemented thereto;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Vermilion, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of said Parish; that:

SECTION 1. In compliance with the provisions of Article VI, Section 15 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974 and other authority supplemental thereto, and in accordance with the request of the Board of Waterworks Commissioners of Southeast Waterworks District No. 2 of the Parish of Vermilion, State of Louisiana, the Police Jury hereby approves (i) the issuance, sale and delivery of \$2, 717, 000 of Water Revenue Bonds, Series 2007, of the District and (ii) the District's obtaining of interim financing for a portion of the costs of the Project through the issuance, sale and delivery of \$2,717,000 of Bond Anticipation Notes of the District, all in accordance with the provisions of the Resolution. The Bonds shall be secured by and payable solely from the

revenues derived or to be derived from the operation of the waterworks system of the District, and the Notes shall be payable from the proceeds of the Bonds or from such other funds available to the District as set forth in the Resolution, and neither the Parish of Vermilion nor this Police Jury shall in any way be liable for the payment of the principal of and/or interest on the Bonds or the Notes.

Legal Counsel, Mr. Paul Moresi, III, discussed the prepared amendment to the shooting range ordinance.

The Jury wants to omit the wording of daylight saving time “and to place shooting range” in italics in the amended shooting range ordinance.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted the proposed amendment with the omitting of the wording of “daylight saving time” and to place “shooting range” in *italics* to the 2005-O-21 Shooting Range Ordinance.

## **AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 2005-0-21**

### **REGULATING SHOOTING RANGES IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF THE PARISH OF VERMILION**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Vermilion Parish Police Jury, that Sec. 5 of the foregoing Ordinance be amended to provide as follows:

#### **Sec. 5. Hours of Operation**

- A) Except as provided below, a *shooting range* may only be operated between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday and between 12:00 Noon and 5:00 p.m. on Sunday.
- B) The hours of operation of a *shooting range* may be extended until 10:00 P.M. upon the owner(s)/operator(s) of a *shooting range* submitting proof of the written consent of ninety percent (90%) of all households and businesses located within one (1) mile of said *shooting range*. Evidence of the required consent of the households and businesses for extended hours of operation shall be submitted to the Vermilion Parish Police Jury prior to operation during the proposed extended hours of operation, and shall contain the printed name, signature, address, and telephone number of the households and business owners giving such consent. A household or business that is established subsequent to the construction or operation of the *shooting range*, shall not be used in the calculation of the required consent of ninety percent (90%) of said households and businesses.
- C) Additionally, the owner(s)/operator(s) of a *shooting range* may apply for a variance to extend the hours of operation for a single event. An application for such a variance shall be made to the Vermilion Parish Police Jury, in writing, at least ten (10) days prior to the proposed event. The factors to be considered by the Police Jury in considering whether to grant a variance are: 1) the date of the proposed event; 2) the location of the proposed event; 3) the number of participants for the proposed event; 4) the proposed hours of operation during the event; 5) the effect of the proposed event on traffic conditions; and 6) the impact of the proposed event and of the granting of the variance upon surrounding households and businesses. Applications for variances under this sub-part shall address the foregoing factors.

\*\*\*\*\*

Secretary/Treasurer, Mr. Clay P. Menard informed the Jury that a Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) meeting will be held on April 7, 2006 at 9:00 a.m. in the Police Jury Meeting room.

Mr. Ricky LeBlanc, Solid Waste Supervisor informed the Jury that U.S. Army Corp of Engineers would like the Solid Waste Facility to provide a “holding area” for household waste since the Area 2 Barn is closing. Mr. LeBlanc advised the Jury that such items as paints, oil, chemicals, tanks, etc. will be hauled to the Solid Waste Plant, which the Corp may come across in the demolition of the homes in the Parish.

The Jury concurred that the Solid Waste Facility will not be a “holding area”.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Ravis Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the hiring of Mr. Troy Durke as a part time tractor operator at the Area 2 Barn, at an hourly rate of \$6.92/hr., Grade 9, to replace Mr. John Morris Saunier who is on Family Medical Leave (FMLA).

The Secretary/Treasurer reminded the jurors to pay their spouses registration fee from the Police Jury Convention in Alexandria.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Ravis Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the Secretary/Treasurer to develop a policy to state that new employees, who do not stay a year employed with the Jury after getting a CDL license that the cost of the CDL License will be taken from the employees’ last payroll check.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Invoice to S.L. Langlinais & Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$1,500, relative to professional services rendered in preparing maps with flood elevations from Hurricane Rita. Cost to be paid ½ from Election District No. 3, and Election District No. 6, Sub 5 of 2.

Legal Counsel, Mr. Paul Moresi, III advised that he received the Attorney General’s opinion on pumps and levees and will submit his opinion after further review.

Mr. Carroll Duhon discussed with the Jury about Victoria Acres Subdivision on the levee system and the oxidation pond. The Jury requested Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., Parish Engineer to go take a look at Victoria Acres Subdivision, and report back to the Jury.

Mr. Wayne Touchet discussed with the Jury that the Louisiana Recovery Authority (LRA) omitted the resolution requesting the levee for Hurricane protection in Vermilion Parish.
