President Poche` asked if there where any changes to the agenda.

The President asked for a motion to open the bids for the 2006 Pick-Up Truck for the Mosquito Control Department.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized opening the bids received.

The President asked if there were any other bids in the audience to be presented.

Mr. Clay P. Menard, Secretary/Treasurer opened the bids as follows:

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized taking the bid for the 2006 Pick-Up Truck for the Mosquito Control Department, under advisement.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the April 17, 2006 meeting, were dispensed with and were accepted.

Ms. Liz Girouard, with Sellers & Associates, Inc. presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Sellers and Associates, Inc. to advertise for bids for the "Materials for Parish Road Maintenance" contract for the period of July 1, 2006 thru December 30, 2006.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved Partial Payment Estimate No. 7 in the amount of \$35,064.04, and Final Change Order No. 2, to Gray Construction Company, contingent upon 100% completion with punch list, relative to the Erath/Bayou Tigre, Phase I Project.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted the following resolution accepting the project as complete, with a punch list, and authorized the President to execute an Act of Acceptance from Gray Construction Company pertaining to the completion of the contract for the "Erath/Bayou Tigre, Phase I Project".

RESOLUTION OF ACCEPTANCE

2006-R-30

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PRESIDENT TO EXECUTE AN ACT OF ACCEPTANCE FROM GRAY CONSTRUCTION CORP., PERTAINING TO THE COMPLETION OF THE CONSTRUCTION FOR THE “DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS – PHASE I IN THE ERATH.BAYOU TIGRE AREA”.

*WHEREAS*, CONTRACTOR, as Contractor, has completed the “Drainage Improvements – Phase 1 in the Erath/Bayou Tigre Area” in accordance with the plans and specifications contained in the contract documents pertaining thereto; and

*WHEREAS*, Vermilion Parish Police Jury desires to accept the completed work, subject to the completion of the punch list items attached hereto:

*NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED*, BY THE Vermilion Parish Police Jury that the President of said Vermilion Parish Police Jury be, and is hereby empowered, authorized, and directed to execute a Notice of Acceptance for and on behalf of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury, accepting the work as being completed, and that s/he be authorized and directed to have a copy of said acceptance recorded in the Conveyance Records of the Parish of Vermilion, State of Louisiana.

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Upon motion of Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. Ravis Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of the following Project Permits, contingent upon OEP approval:

- (A) Project Permit No. 1407-D to El Paso Production Company, to construct a drill site for the Charles J. Montgomery, III, Well No. 1, located off of La. Hwy. 14, in Election District No. 10.

- (B) Project Permit No. 1408-D to El Paso Production Company, to construct a drill site for the Donald R. Hebert No. 1 Well, located off of La. Hwy. 14, in Election District No. 10.
- (C) Project Permit No. 1409-D to Cimarex Energy Company, to construct a drill site for the Larry Haynes et al., Well No. 1, located at the intersection of La. Hwy. 92 and 700, in Election District No. 2.

Upon motion of Mr. Ravis Menard, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of the following Telecommunication Permits:

- (A) Bell South Telecommunications, Inc. to bore a 50'-pair cable along Pumping Plant Road and down Angelle Lane, located in Election District No. 13.
- (B) Bell South Telecommunications, Inc. to bore a 25'-pair cable along Arbor Road and down Tenock Drive, located in Election District No. 11.

Upon motion of Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, Item No. 1 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations amended to state that all bids received for the Multi-Purpose Community Center (Health Unit) were over the budget.

Upon motion of Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, Item No. 7 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations be amended to add that the variance will be approved pending that Ed's Sporting Good (Shooting Range) fills out the appropriate paperwork.

Upon motion of Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, Item No. 6 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations be amended to request that the Louisiana Department of Wildlife & Fisheries install "No Wake Signs" at Don's Boat Landing.

Upon motion of Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, the Public Road Committee Recommendations were amended to accept a quote from Head & Engquist, LLC, for one digging bucket, at a cost of \$1,060.00.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations, as amended and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations:

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON MAY 10, 2006, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury rejects the bids received for the construction of a new Multi-Purpose Community Center (Health Unit).
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury amend Ordinance No. 2006-O-11 to change the speed limit on Claude Road from 35 mph to 45 mph for its entire length.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to attend the Louisiana Technical Assistance Program seminar entitled "Local Road Safety Program" on June 22-23, 2006, in Lake Charles.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt the following ordinance establishing a 30 mph speed limit on portions of Kirk Road, in Election District No.1:
  - a) Install speed limit sign traveling north approximately 2,000 feet from La. Hwy. 92.
  - b) Install speed limit sign 6,000 feet from La. Hwy. 92 facing south.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to stop all studies being done to widen Cordell Road.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance to install "No Wake Zone" signs at Don's Boat Landing.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury request that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff Water Patrol install the signs, which were lost relative to Hurricane Rita.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve a variance for Ed's Sporting Good (Shooting Range) on Sunday, May 21, 2006 from 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.
8. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to do a study on Gale LeMaire (Pvt.) Road to see if it is feasible to turn into a public road.
9. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to contact Iberia Parish Sheriff Sid Hebert, relative to the bill received to house parish prisoners.

10. It is recommended that the Police Jury extend the State of Emergency for another 30 days.
11. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the resealing of Marcia Road in the 2007 Resealing & Patching Program, the allocation for District No. 5 is \$5,000, and to carry over the 2006 Resealing & Patching Program allocation for District No. 5 of \$5,000 until 2007, which will total \$10,000 for the resealing of Marcia Road.
12. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to install "Watch For Children" signs on the corner of Theodore Road and Jude Road.
13. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to contact the State Office of Homeland Security and ask what criteria must the Vermilion Parish Office of Homeland Security/Emergency Preparedness Personnel Policy be.

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In accordance with the Public Road Committee Recommendations the following ordinances were adopted:

**ORDINANCE**

***AN AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 2006-O-11, APPROVED BY THE VERMILION PARISH POLICE JURY AT THEIR REGULAR MEETING HELD ON MAY 15, 2006.***

***THE AMENDMENT RESCINDS SECTION I (C) OF ORDINANCE 2006-O-11 TO CHANGE SPEED LIMIT ON CLAUDE ROAD AS FOLLOWS:***

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Enis, Lagrange and Claude Road, in Election District No. 2.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose the following:

- (a) Enis Road, adopt a 35 mph speed limit from the intersection of Enis and Lagrange Road heading eastward.
- (b) LaGrange, adopt a 35 mph speed limit from the intersection of Lagrange and Claude Road heading north.
- (c) Claude, adopt a 45 mph speed limit for it entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense,  
a  
maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER IRDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

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## ORDINANCE

2006-O-16-A

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF “NO WAKE ZONE” IN DESIGNATED WATERS: TO PROVIDE FOR THE INSTALLATION OF SIGNS DESIGNATING THESE ZONES: AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Police Jury of Vermilion Parish, Louisiana, in regular session duly assembled and proceeding under its police power and further pursuant to the laws of the State of Louisiana.

### SECTION 1: NO WAKE ZONES (5 M.P.H.)

The following described waterways are hereby designated as no wake zones within which watercraft shall not throw any type of wake or when such a wake is occurring that such watercraft shall not exceed the speed of five (5) miles per hour:

- A. That portion beginning at the Boston Canal (Don’s Boat Landing launch, located at 5515 West La. Hwy. 688) and extending south for a distance of 1,000 feet.

Appropriate signs shall be erected and maintained along such waterways, and any vessel traveling thereon shall respect the signs so erected and maintained.

### SECTION 2: WATERWAY IDENTIFICATION SIGNS AND NAVIGATIONAL AIDS

No person shall destroy, molest, damage, change or alter any sign or navigational aid placed along, or in, any waterbody within Vermilion Parish.

SECTION 3: PENALTY

Any person violating any of the provisions aforesated shall upon conviction be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days or both.

SECTION 4: DECLARATION

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the remainder of said ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5: IMPLEMENTATION

This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption by the Police Jury.

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**ORDINANCE**

**2006-O-17**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Kirk Road, in Election District No. 1.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 30 mph speed limit on Kirk Road as follows:

- a. Install speed limit sign traveling north approximately 2,000 feet from La. Hwy. 92.
- b. Install speed limit sign 6,000 feet from La. Hwy. 92 facing south.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

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Upon motion of Ravis Menard, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Public Works Committee Recommendations were amended to accept the quote from Gutter Smith to repair gutters at the Area II Barn, at a cost of \$490.00.

  1. To Centennial Wireless to add 2 towers mounted amplifiers to an existing tower located on Hwy 3147, in Election District No. 13.

**WHEREAS**, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury originally adopted the Flood Prevention and Protection Ordinance on May 6, 1985 with amendments as follows:

June 3, 1985

March 2, 1987

January 20, 1998

**WHEREAS**, the Federal Emergency Management Agency has published new Advisory Base Flood Elevation maps for Vermilion Parish dated March 2006 of the National Flood Insurance Program; and

**WHEREAS**, because of these changes, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury wishes to comply with the recommendations of the National Flood Insurance Program.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** that the Flood Prevention and Protection Ordinance, is hereby revised as follows:

**FLOOD PREVENTION AND PROTECTION**

**ARTICLE I.**

Amend Section 5 of Ordinance No. 98-0-2 to read as follows:

Sec. 5. Basis for establishing the areas of special flood hazard.

The areas of special flood hazard identified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency in a scientific and engineering report entitled the AFlood Insurance Study

Vermilion Parish Louisiana, Unincorporated Areas,@ dated November 14, 1984, with the accompanying AFlood Insurance Rate Map, Community-Panel Number 220221 0025 through 0775,@ dated March 15, 1985, and the accompanying AFlood Boundary and Floodway Map, Community Panel Number 220221 125 through 450,@ dated May 15, 1985 with some panels revised May 4, 1992, is hereby adopted by reference and declared to be a part of this ordinance except for the panels in conflict with the established Advisory Base Flood Elevation Map dated March 2006 for Vermilion Parish, Louisiana which shall control and be made a part of this Ordinance by reference. The Flood Insurance Study, the Flood Insurance Rate Map, and the Flood Boundary and Floodway Map together with the March 2006 Advisory Base Flood Elevation map are on file in the Police Jury Office, Vermilion Parish Courthouse, Abbeville, Louisiana.

#### ARTICLE II.

Amend Section 28 Item 3 of Ordinance No. 98-0-2 to read as follows:

Sec. 28. Development permit.

(3) Certification by a registered professional engineer, surveyor or architect that the floodproofing, methods for any nonresidential structure meet the floodproofing criteria in section 9-53(2); and

#### ARTICLE III.

Amend Section 53 Item 3 and Item 9c of Ordinance No. 98-0-2 to read as follows:

Section 53. Specific standards

(3) The satisfaction for standards of (1) and (2) above shall be certified by a registered professional engineer, surveyor or architect. The certification that the standards of sections 27(6) or 28(1) are satisfied shall be submitted to the Secretary/Treasurer or his designee.

(9) Located within the areas of special flood hazard, etc.

c. A registered professional engineer, surveyor and architect shall submit a certification to the Secretary/Treasurer of the Secretary/Treasurer of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury or his designate that the standards of this section, as proposed in Section 28 are satisfied.

**ORDINANCE**

***AN AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 2004-O-37, APPROVED BY THE VERMILION PARISH POLICE JURY AT THEIR REGULAR MEETING HELD ON MAY 15, 2006.***

THE AMENDMENT RESCINDS SECTION 27. PENALTIES PART (1, 2, 3, & 4) OF ORDINANCE 2004-O-37 TO CHANGE PENALTIES AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 27. Penalties.**

Any violation of these ordinances shall be considered both a public nuisance and a misdemeanor and enforcement may be obtained both civilly and criminally. All cost associated with the repair and remediation of the nuisance shall be borne by the generator of the nuisance.

Any violation of this Chapter may also be charged and prosecuted as a misdemeanor as follows:

- 1) Upon **first** conviction of violation of this section, the person shall be sent a certified letter.
- 2) Upon **second** conviction of violation of this section, the person shall be fined \$50.00 for each such violation.
- 3) Upon **third** conviction of violation of this section, the person shall be fined \$100.00 for each violation
- 4) Upon **fourth** and subsequent convictions of violation of this section, the person shall be fined \$200.00 for each such violation.
