June 19, 2006
Abbeville, Louisiana

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on June 19, 2006, with President Mark Poche` presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Poche`, who asked Mr. Purvis Abshire, to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

President Poche` asked if there where any changes to the agenda.

President Poche` read the following announcements:

- (1) The Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority meeting will be held on Wednesday, July 26, 2006 from 9:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. at the State Capitol House Committee Room 5, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.
- (2) The Coastal Wetlands Planning, Protection and Restoration Act Task Force meeting will be held on Wednesday, July 12, 2006 at the Louisiana Department of Wildlife & Fisheries, located at 2000 Quail Drive, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the June 5, 2006 meeting, were dispensed with and were accepted.

Ms. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers & Associates, Inc. presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Mr. Sellers presented an update on the Fire Stations insurance claims.

Mr. Sellers also gave a report on the debris removal at the Solid Waste Facility.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the President to sign a progress payment and a release that the quantities that the Jury received from Phillips & Jordan, Inc. agreed with the quantity from Sellers & Associates, Inc.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved Project Permit No. 1419-D to Mosbacher Energy Company, to extend the existing drill site for the LaFurs Well No. 5, located approximately 4 miles northwest of Intracoastal City, in Election District No. 9, contingent upon OEP approval and certificate of insurance received and pending Mr. Maxwell Chreene's approval.

Mr. Sellers also advised the Jury that the drainage studies conducted on Curly Road indicated that the bridge cannot be replaced with culverts; will have to retain a bridge on this road,

Mr. Sellers also advised the Jury that the Jury request for an exemption for early construction of the liner at the Solid Waste Facility, has been approved by the State.

Mr. Sellers also informed the Jury that he received quotes for the bridge replacement for Hawk Road as follows:

Upon motion of Mr. David C. Mayard, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury awarded the quote to Glenn Lege Construction, in the amount of \$27,420.00, for the bridge replacement on Hawk Road, being the lowest of two bids received.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the award of the Materials For Parish Road Maintenance (Period from July 2, 2006 to December 31, 2006) contracts for the various proposals and items to the low bidders meeting specifications as shown in the bid tabulation submitted by the parish engineer.

Upon motion of T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury accepted the 2006-2007 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) preliminary funding breakdown.

Mr. Sellers also discussed with the Jury about Senator Landrieu's proposed bill to obtain offshore revenues. The Parish would receive 35% of the revenues from the \$135 million. The Jury's share would be \$2,278,549. Mr. Sellers also informed the Jury that the request package needs to be submitted to the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources (DNR) by October 2006.

Upon motion of Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, Item No. 1 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations be amended to send back to the Committee for further discussion.

Upon motion of Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, Item No. 11 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations be amended to abolish Ordinance No. 2002-O-21.

Upon motion of Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, Item No. 2 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations be deleted.

Upon motion of Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, Item No. 4 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations be amended to include to authorize legal counsel to draft the necessary language and present to the Police Jury for approval.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations, as amended and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations:

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JUNE 14, 2006, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury deny a pipeline permit application from AGL Resources to install a pipeline corridor to Lake Peigneur containing 2-12 inch pipelines, 1-4 inch electrical conduit, and 1-2 inch pipeline, in Election District No. 3.

It is further recommended that the Secretary/Treasurer contact AGL Resources to attend and make a presentation to the Jury exactly what the permit pertains.

2. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve an intergovernmental agreement with Gravity Drainage District No. 1 to do a drainage project in Palms Subdivision, in Election District No. 3.

3. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve a \$2.2 million Capital Improvement Program (CIP) with \$2 million in construction and \$200,000 in contingency for testing, and inspection services, for the Parish Road Program from the 78` Sales Tax Fund and Royalty Road Fund.
4. It is recommended that an amendment to the ambulance service ordinance be prepared to change Part III of the Penalty, Section (d) stating that the fine not exceeding \$500.00 per day of violation.
5. It is recommended that the invoices submitted be approved to be paid.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the extension of Sosthene Road in Election District No. 9.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 25 mph speed limit on Chatagnier Road, for its entire length and also install “Watch For Children” signs, in Election District No. 3.
8. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve payment to Acadiana Ford, in the amount of \$1,658.53 for an accident involving a Police Jury tractor and a pickup truck driven by Mr. Roy Abbott.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury approve a rental car for Mr. Roy Abbott for 8 days.

9. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve an Act of Revocation for Broussard Acres Subdivision, in Election District No. 2.
10. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve a letter of map amendment (LOMA) application for Beau Soleil Subdivision, in Election District No. 2.
11. It is recommended that the Police Jury abolish Ordinance No. 2004-O-27 and create a new ordinance to establish a 45 mph speed limit on Sidney Gautreaux Road for its entire length, except for the portion beginning at 10538 Sidney Gautreaux Road and ending at 10319 Sidney Gautreaux Road, there be a 25 mph speed limit be adopted and also install a “Deaf Child” and “Watch for Children” signs in this area.

In accordance with the Public Road Committee Recommendations the following ordinances were adopted:

ORDINANCE

2006-O-18

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury’s attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Chatagnier Road, in Election District No. 03.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 25 mph speed limit on Chatagnier Road, for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit and “Watch For Children” signs be installed.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

ORDINANCE

2006-O-19

WHEREAS, in action taken at the June 19, 2006, meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury abolished Ordinance No. 2002-O-21 and 2004-O-27 because of conflict.

WHEREAS, it has further been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions on Sidney Gautreaux Road, in Election District No. 2, from La. Hwy. 14 to La. Hwy. 697.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 45 mph speed limit on Sidney Gautreaux Road for its entire length, except for the portion beginning at 10538 Sidney Gautreaux Road and ending at 10319 Sidney Gautreaux Road, that there be a 25 mph speed limit be adopted and also install a "Deaf Child" and "Watch for Children" signs in this area.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit, "Deaf Child", and "Watch for Children" signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

Upon motion of Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, Item No. 1 of the Public Works Committee Recommendations be amended to add the cost of materials and labor not to exceed \$1,500.00 and that quotes be obtained for material needed.

Mr. Menard also informed the Jury that the property located in Kaplan on Cushing Street, which is the old Jr. Food Mart was adjudicated to the Parish on May 26, 2004, and the City of Kaplan has requested that the Parish clean up the property, and the City of Kaplan is also sending a letter to the land owner requesting the same. The Jury requested that Legal Counsel contact the City of Kaplan.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of the following Ward 8 Cemetery Program charges for the period of April through June, 2006, with the costs to be paid from the Ward 8 Cemetery Fund.

- 1) Diana Gale Smith - \$300.00 – record keeping for the months of April -June 2006.
- 2) Lorphea Broussard - \$200.00 – maintenance of the Little Chapel Cemetery for the months of April -June 2006.

Legal Counsel Mr. Paul Moresi, III, discussed with the Jury about the Occupational License Ordinance and how it is enforced in the Parish.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel to send a letter to the Vermilion Parish Sheriff requesting him to enforce the Occupational License Ordinance and institute such a proceeding against the operator of the Nightlife Lounge, and to take action against him under the statutes to pay the taxes or shut the business down.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury went into executive session to discuss the City of Abbeville's inmates being housed at the Iberia Parish Jail at 7:42 p.m.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury reconvened back into regular session at 8:00 p.m.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized that if another Juror, the President or employee is contacted to request work to be done, they must contact the appropriate Juror in that district before the work is performed.

Mr. Luddy Herpin discussed with the Jury about the shooting range. Mr. Herpin thanked the Jury for passing an ordinance for the shooting range. Mr. Herpin informed the Jury that he met with Mr. Michael Harson and at that time he realized he was fighting something totally different, he was fighting a political promise that was made by some people. Mr. Herpin informed the Jury that there was over 40 citations issued in violation of the shooting range ordinance, but only three of the citations have gotten to the District Attorney's office. Mr. Herpin requested a copy of the ordinance number, and Mr. Hubert J. Faulk said he would give Mr. Herpin a copy of the ordinance. Mr. Herpin advised the Jury that he wrote a letter to the Judge relating to various citations being issued at the shooting range. Mr. Herpin thanked the Jury again for all of their assistance.

Upon motion of Mr. Ravis Menard, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard, and unanimously carried, there being no further business to be presented, the meeting was duly adjourned.
