

Police Jury Room
July 17, 2006
Abbeville, Louisiana

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on July 17, 2006, with President Mark Poche` presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Poche`, who asked Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized additions/changes to the agenda to discuss Item No. 1 of the Courthouse/Building Committee Recommendations to rescind the amendment to Ordinance 2005-O-17 (relative to noise) to exempt fowl from the Ordinance except in subdivisions.

Upon motion of Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, with Juror Minos Broussard voting nay, the Police Jury approved to amend Ordinance No. 2005-O-17 to state "to exempt fowl from the Ordinance except in subdivisions as long as they are housed 300 feet from an inhabited dwelling."

Mr. Scott Weaver addressed the Jury about the concerns with a 300 foot limit for fowl.

Mr. Clint Gary, Mr. Ray Gaspard and Ms. Donna Miguez all addressed the Jury with the concerns on the 300 foot limit to house fowl from an inhabited dwelling.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized additions/changes to the agenda to allow Ms. Darlene Vice to speak in reference about the Police Jury interest in purchasing property off of La. Hwy. 696.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the Secretary/Treasurer to schedule a public meeting with the residents that live in the area, that the Police Jury is interested in purchasing property, off of La. Hwy. 696.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved that the land be utilized off of La. Hwy. 696 will strictly be used for dirt use only and will never be used as a Solid Waste Dump.

Mr. Casey Melancon addressed the Jury introducing Mr. John Fallis, Mr. Richard Spears, Mr. Stephen Langlinais and Mr. Dale Smith. Mr. Melancon discussed with the Jury a new subdivision development identified as Coastal Ridge Air Park, which consist of 87 acres with 30 plus lots and 4,600 foot grass runway. Mr. Melancon informed the Jury that he took noise level tests and it showed that it will be no louder than road traffic.

Mr. Stephen Langlinais with S.J. Langlinais & Associates, Inc. addressed the Jury about decibel levels that was taken for airplanes, cars and general sounds.

Mr. Steven Bradley addressed the Jury about the airplanes taking off and going over his house.

Ms. Yvette LeBlanc addressed the Jury about her concerns with the airstrip.

Mr. Ronald Broussard addressed the Jury about the air park. Mr. Broussard informed the Jury that they have no problem with the subdivision only. The residents are concerned about the safety.

Mr. Tommy Menard addressed the Jury about an airstrip off of Bienville Road that planes fly over homes. Mr. Menard asked that a decibel level be done by an unbiased person.

Mr. Hyden Gouterez also addressed the Jury asking the subdivision developers why they don't use the Abbeville Airport and the New Iberia Airport.

State Airport Compliance Office, Mr. David Smith addressed the Jury about Coastal Ridge Air Park Subdivision, that it meets all the criteria and exceeds, after a redesign was done, to meet the requirements of the State and FAA.

Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel informed the Jury that he will look at the Parishes subdivision ordinance and see what options are available.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury tabled the matter with Coastal Ridge Air Park Subdivision until legal counsel reports back to the Jury.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the July 5, 2006 meeting, were dispensed with and were accepted.

Ms. Liz Girouard with Sellers & Associates, Inc. presented the review updates from FEMA flood maps.

Ms. Girouard also presented the following various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of the following Project Permits:

- (A) Project Permit No. 1428-D to Yuma E & P Company, Inc., to cleanout a private slip and to construct a shell pad and the necessary structures for drilling the LaPasada Prospect, located in Vermilion Bay area, in Election District No. 9, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness.
- (B) Project Permit No. 1429-D to Exxon Mobil Production Company to furnish and install approximately 247 feet of one 4-inch jumper line and 1,502 feet of one 4 inch jumper line to serve the Exxon Fee No. 103 Well, located south of Highway 3147, in Election District No. 13.
- (C) Project Permit No. 1430-D to Triumph Energy, Inc. to construct a drill site along with the necessary structures for drilling the North Borel Prospect, located off of Highway 343, in Election District No. 2, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness
- (D) Project Permit No. 1431-D to Sandalwood Exploration, L.P. to construct a drill site along with the necessary structures for drilling the Lucy B. Thomas, et al No. 1 Well., located off of Hwy. 699, in Election District No. 2, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations, as presented and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations:

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JULY 12, 2006, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to check to see if it is feasible for the Police Jury to start a credit card payment program.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to contact Wal-Mart about the possibility of the Police Jury using Wal-Mart Credit Cards to make purchases at the store.

2. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter to the resident on Cleo Road concerning the placement of trees in the parish right of way and parish ditches.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers and Associates, Inc. to advertise for "Notice to Bidders" for the Vermilion Parish Mosquito Control Program Aerial Application Post Emergency.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Coulee Kinney Drainage District to do drainage improvements on East Etienne Road. The Parish and Drainage District will both provide labor and equipment to do the work.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize payment of \$27,000 to the City of Abbeville to assist them in participating in the LCDBG Grant Railroad Repair Project.

It is further recommended that the Secretary-Treasurer be authorized to pursue possible reimbursement from the State through various grants.

6. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to prepare the paperwork to exchange 3 acres of property owned by the Vermilion Parish Police Jury with Mr. Robert Lowe for the Vermilion Parish Police Jury getting fill dirt by digging a pond on Mr. Lowe's Property.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers and Associates, Inc. to conduct a study to see if the 161.7 acres of land on Hwy. 696 is feasible for the intentions of the Police Jury.

It is further recommended that the Secretary/Treasurer be authorized to hire Laporte Appraisal Service to appraise the 161.7 acres of land on Hwy. 696.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to prepare a Buy/Sell agreement for the 161.7 acres of land on Hwy. 696.

8. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve to pay the following invoices submitted by the department heads.
9. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the quote and payment of the invoice from Matthew's A/C and Heating Inc., in the amount of \$1,997.00, to replace a 5-ton heat pump air-condition at the Leleux Volunteer Fire Department.

It is further recommended that payment be made from the Leleux Volunteer Fire Department's 2006 allocation and if their 2006 Allocation does not have the necessary funds, that their 2007 Allocation be reduced by the remaining amount owed.

10. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve an intergovernmental agreement with the Vermilion Parish School Board whereas the Vermilion Parish School Board requests and appoints the Vermilion Parish Police Jury to apply for mitigation funding necessary for the protection of school properties and if funded, to authorize the design and construction of the proposed project in accordance with the funding requirements.
