The meeting was called to order by Mr. Poche`, who asked Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

President Poche` addressed the Jury about the problem that is going on involving Vermilion Parish Pre-Trial Detainees being housed in other facilities out of the parish and what could be done regarding possible bond reduction on them to prevent them from being housed in facilities out of the parish.

District Judge Durwood Conque, with the 15<sup>th</sup> Judicial District Court advised the Jury that more bond reductions need to be done and that is occurring on a daily basis when requested.

Commissioner Tommy Frederick, with the 15<sup>th</sup> Judicial District Court explained the bond reduction process.

Colonel Kirk Frith, with the Vermilion Parish Sheriff Department, expressed that they send inmates to bond reduction hearings as often as possible.

Judge Conque also discussed the possibility of a work release program with probation officers monitoring inmates.

Judge Conque will work on getting a work release program with probation officers started in Vermilion Parish to get bond reductions on pre trial detainees.

President Poche` read the following announcements:

**ORDINANCE**

**2006-O-23**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on East Elina Road, in Election District No. 05.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 15 mph speed limit and a "Watch For Children" sign on East Elina Road for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit sign be installed and 3 way stop signs at the intersection of East Elina Road and Daniel Road in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr. with Sellers & Associates, Inc. informed the Jury that they will do the bid packages for the reentombment of graves, relative to Hurricane Rita.

Mr. Tim Creswell gave an update on the hurricane protection barrier.

Mr. Wayne Touchet expressed to the Jury that the new generator at the Courthouse unoperational due to the exhaust fumes going into the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/Emergency Preparedness Office.

Mr. Eugene Sellers informed the Jury that he is working on a plan to re route the exhaust fumes and construct a cover over the new generators.

Mr. Mark Poche` advised the Jury about a contractor who's cutting pine trees in the parish and requested them to keep an eye out for him and if anyone sees this contractor, to contact Mr. Ricky LeBlanc at the Solid Waste Facility.

Mr. Poche` requested that the Jury read the proposed personnel plan, which will be discussed at a later date.

Mr. Ronald Darby and Mr. Wayne Touchet expressed that they had some problems with certain parts of the proposed plan.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr. and unanimously carried, there being no further business to be presented, the meeting was duly adjourned.
