Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on August 7, 2006, with President Mark Poche` presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Poche`, who asked Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized additions/changes to the agenda to allow anyone from the audience to address the Jury.

Mr. Jimmie Sturm and his wife Lucy addressed the Jury concerning the noise ordinance that was passed at the July 17, 2006, Police Jury meeting. The Sturms have asked the Jury to go back to the original noise ordinance, if nothing else can be resolved.

Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel addressed the Jury about state and federal laws that would affect the noise ordinance.

Mr. Edval Simon, Jr. expressed his opinion to go back to the original noise ordinance.

Mr. Wayne Touchet expressed his opinion to keep the footage on the amended noise ordinance.

Mr. Edval Simon, Jr. made a motion to go back to the original noise ordinance.

Mr. Wayne Touchet made a motion to send the discussion on the noise ordinance back to the committee.

Upon motion of Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the Legal Counsel to contact neighboring parishes on their noise ordinance.

Mr. Calvin Broussard addressed the Jury about a problem with culverts and drainage problems near his property that were not completed.

Mr. Maxwell Chreene advised the Jury that they could not remove the culverts, due to erosion along the canal.

Mr. Dudley Broussard, Road Supervisor informed the Jury that the culverts could not be removed.

Mr. Jimmy Dupre addressed the Jury about the opening of Shrimp season.

Upon motion of Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter to Louisiana Department of Wildlife & Fishery and Governor Kathleen Blanco opposing the partial opening of Zone 2 for the shrimp season, and requesting to reconsider and open all of Zone 2 for the shrimp season.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury went back to regular session.

Vermilion Parish Sheriff Michael Couvillon addressed the Jury about the Vermillion Parish Law Enforcement Center, Inmates, and presented several proposals.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, made a motion to accept the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's proposal No. 1.

Mr. David C. Mayard thanked the Vermilion Parish Sheriff for the proposals and recommended to table the action for further review.

Upon motion of Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard, made a substitute motion to send all the proposals presented by Vermilion Parish Sheriff Michael Couvillon back to the Finance Committee meeting for review.

The vote was (7) seven for and (6) six against, the motion passed to present Vermilion Parish Sheriff Michael Couvillon's proposals at the next Finance Committee meeting.

Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel expressed his opinion relative to the overflow problems at the Vermilion Parish Law Enforcement Center.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to schedule a General Needs Committee meeting on August 16, 2006 with the scheduled Committee meetings to discuss the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's proposals.

Mr. David C. Mayard commended the Vermilion Parish Sheriff and his staff for doing an outstanding job regarding the proposals submitted.

President Poche` read the following announcements:

- 1) Received the 2005 Financial Report from the Pecan Island Waterworks District No. 3, which will be kept on file.
- 2) The Coastal Wetlands Planning, Protection and Restoration Act will hold the 15th Priority Project List (PPL) public meeting on August 30, 2006 at 7:00 p.m. – 8:15 p.m. at the Vermilion Parish Police Jury Courthouse Building, Courtroom 1, in Abbeville, Louisiana.
- 3) The Department of Natural Resources, Office of Conservation will hold a Public Hearing on Thursday, September 14, 2006, at 6:00 p.m. at the Iberia Parish Senior High School Auditorium, located at 1301 E. Admiral Doyle, New Iberia, Louisiana.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, the reading of the minutes of the Regular Meeting of July 17, 2006 and Special Meeting of July 19, 2006, were dispensed with and were accepted.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr. with Sellers & Associates, Inc. presented the following various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of the following Project Permits:

- (A) Project Permit No. 1432-WL to Vermilion Parish Police Jury, c/o Waterworks District No. 1, to furnish and install 3-inch, 4-inch, and 6-inch water lines to unserved residents in the Cow Island area, under the F.Y. '05 LCDBG Disaster Program, in Election District No. 9 and 13.
- (B) Project Permit No. 1421-P to El Paso E&P Company, to furnish and install approximately 9,092 feet of one 4-inch pipeline and one 6-inch pipeline to serve the Vermilion Parish School Board No. 1 Well, located on Joe Road, in Election District No. 13.
- (C) Project Permit No. 1420-D to El Paso E&P Company, modify the plan revisions to furnish and install a second 8-inch pipeline to serve the Jason G. Guidry et al 28 No. 1 Well, located approximately nine miles south of Kaplan, in Election District No. 13.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "Letters of No Objection" to El Paso E&P Company, to install living quarter's platform and walkway to serve the S.L. 18090, in White Lake, located in Election District No. 13.

Mr. Sellers also presented (3) three bids received for the 2005 Hurricane Rita Birch Road Improvements as follows:

- 1) Glenn Lege Construction \$56,630.00
- 2) H & S Construction Co. \$58,248.00
- 3) M. Matt Durand \$64,639.10

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury awarded the lowest bid to Glenn Lege Construction, in the amount of \$56,630.00, for the 2005 Hurricane Rita Birch Road Improvements.

Mr. Sellers also presented a status report to the Jury on the new Vermilion Parish Solid Waste Facility Office.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved Partial Payment Estimate No. 1 (Final) to Glenn Lege Construction, in the amount of \$16,900.00, relative to the Stormwater Runoff Control System for the Subtitle D Cell- Area 1-B, at the Vermilion Parish Solid Waste Facility.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved Partial Payment No. 1 (Final) to United Dredging Services Corp., in the amount of \$77,400.00, relative to the "Dredging Oilfield Canal at Oaks Canal".

Upon motion of Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted the following resolution accepting the project as complete, and authorized the President to execute an Act of Acceptance from United Dredging Services Corp. pertaining to the completion of the contract for the "Dredging Oilfield Canal at Oaks Canal".

RESOLUTION OF ACCEPTANCE

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PRESIDENT TO EXECUTE AN ACT OF ACCEPTANCE FROM UNITED DREDGING SERVICES CORPORATION, PERTAINING TO THE COMPLETION OF THE CONTRACT FOR THE "DREDGING OILFIELD CANAL AT OAKS CANAL".

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR, United Dredging Services Corporation, as Contractor, has completed the "Dredging Oilfield Canal at Oaks Canal" in accordance with the plans and specifications contained in the contract documents pertaining thereto; and

WHEREAS, Vermilion Parish Police Jury desires to accept the completed work:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE Vermilion Parish Police Jury that the President of said Vermilion Parish Police Jury be, and is hereby empowered, authorized, and directed to execute a Notice of Acceptance for and on behalf of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury, accepting the work as being completed, and that s/he be authorized and directed to have a copy of said acceptance recorded in the Conveyance Records of the Parish of Vermilion, State of Louisiana.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr. with Sellers & Associates, Inc. informed the Jury that the property for sale off of La. Hwy. 696 is approximately 150 acres, and on the back side of the property there is wetland area.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the Secretary/Treasurer to publish in the Official Journal a "Notice of Public Hearing" on Tuesday, August 15, 2006, beginning at 6:00 p.m. in the Police Jury Meeting Room, Second Floor, Courthouse Building to receive comments regarding a piece of property the Police Jury is interested in purchasing, located off of La. Hwy. 696.

Mr. Sellers also gave an update on approximately 50,000 yards of dirt in exchange for 3 acres with Mr. Robert D. Lowe.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, Item No. 6 of the General Needs Committee Recommendations be amended to also add to send a letter of thanks to the District Attorney and the Vermilion Parish Sheriff for their cooperation in paying the Acadiana Criminalistics Laboratory bill.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the General Needs Committee Recommendations, as amended, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations:

AS A RESULT OF A GENERAL NEEDS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON AUGUST 2, 2006, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter to the National Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) advising them that the Vermilion Parish Coastal Restoration Advisory Committee approved to request the National Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) to do the engineering for the Coastal Impact Assistant Program (CIAP) for the Coastal Restoration Project.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve to participate in the Coastal Impact Assistant Program (CIAP) for the Freshwater Bayou Bank Stabilization Project. The Police Jury's cost share will be \$2 million dollars.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the final plat for the subdivision development identified as William Hebert Subdivision, in Election District No. 2, contingent upon comments by Parish Engineer.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve preliminary approval for the subdivision development identified as Seraphine Estates Subdivision, Phase III & IV in Election District No. 11, contingent upon comments by Parish Engineer.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to advertise for three (3) Model 4100 Gradalls and one sweeper.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter of thanks to all the mayors for their cooperation in paying the Acadiana Criminalistics Laboratory bill.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to obtain prices for a Resealing Hopper.
8. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter of authorization to Abbeville Chief Elvin Michaud, to have the tanker truck repaired, which is being housed at the Abbeville Fire Department.
9. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter to Cox Communications requesting them to reevaluate Mack Switch Road for cable installation, in view of more residents having moved on Mack Switch Road.
10. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve 10 hours a week of overtime per employee, for the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/Office of Emergency Preparedness.
11. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Legal Counsel to move forward with a civil suit action involving an animal, being held at the Rabies Control Facility.

12. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to contact the insurance company, to expedite the money due for the fire stations damaged, relative to Hurricane Rita.
13. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize to adopt the draft version of the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/Office of Emergency Preparedness evacuation of household pets.
14. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to review the Vermilion Parish Drug and Alcohol Policy No. 2004-Personnel-01 on clarification on drug testing when an accident occurs.
15. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter to the Vermilion Parish Sheriff, allowing the Sheriff to determine the ratio between DOC Prisoners and pre-trial detainees, which will economically benefit the Sheriff and the Police Jury.
16. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to place limestone on Lynn Road to Joseph Road, 20 feet pass the driveway, and not to exceed two loads.
17. It is recommended that the Police Jury install a 35 mph speed limit sign on Cabrol Road, off of Spruce Road turning north onto Cabrol Road, in Election District No. 11.
18. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to send a letter to the Louisiana Legislative Delegation and the Department of Transportation and Development (DOTD) requesting a meeting to discuss the overlay of La. Hwy. 339.
19. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the President to sign the grant agreement submitted by the 15th Judicial District Attorney, Mike Harson, to the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement Council to provide Vermilion Parish with the Teen Court Program.
20. It is recommended that the Police Jury deny Louisiana CVS Pharmacy, LLC dba CVS Pharmacy to receive local benefits on the Enterprise Zone Program.
21. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve Kolder, Champagne, Slaven and Company to provide services, relative to computing overpayment of any employees.

22. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve Amendment No. 1 to the Professional Services contract between Vermilion Parish Police Jury and Sellers and Associates, Inc., relative to applying for a Coastal Use Permit from the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) for the New Fire Stations in Pecan Island and Forked Island, relative to the LCDBG Disaster Recovery Program.
23. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a “No Wake Zone” on the Oaks Canal.
24. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve payment of Invoice No. 131779 to SunbeltFire, in the amount of \$184,514.00, relative to the new fire truck for the Meaux/Nunez Fire Department.
25. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize President Mark Poche` to sign an amendment with DNR Cooperative Agreement No. 2503-05-11, “Parish Coastal Wetlands Restoration Program” between the Vermilion Parish Police Jury and the La. Department of Natural Resources.
26. It is recommended that the Police Jury ratify the payment of \$1,947.28 in additional funding to the Acadiana Crime Lab from the July 28, 2006 group meeting.
27. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to send a letter to Mr. Randal White, relative to the continued development of a subdivision on Lawrence Road, without Parish Engineer review and approval by the Vermilion Parish Police Jury.
28. It is recommended that the Police Jury award the lowest quote to Southern Earth Sciences, Inc., in the amount of \$4,900.00, for Geotechnical Services for the new fire stations in Pecan Island and Forked Island, relative to the LCDBG Disaster Recovery Program.
29. It is recommended that the Police Jury award the lowest quote to L and R Construction Co. Inc. of Kaplan, in the amount of \$45,282.86, to furnish materials and labor to repair a bridge on Albert Road.
30. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve to renew a 3 year lease with Mr. Robert Lowe, (approximately 3 acres) of land near the Solid Waste Facility, in the amount of \$100.00 a year.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to negotiate with Mr. Robert Lowe for utilizing excavated material on his property (approximately 4 acres) adjacent to the Solid Waste Facility in exchange for approximately 3 acres of Police Jury property, on the east side of the drainage canal, providing Mr. Lowe signs a waiver on the 3 acres concerning the 200' buffer zone requirement established in the solid Waste Permit.

31. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve to drop criminal charges against Mr. Samuel Dennis, relative to full restitution being paid for the damages done to the Rabies Control Facility.

In accordance with the General Needs Committee Recommendation the following ordinance was adopted:

**ORDINANCE
2006-O-21**

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
“NO WAKE ZONE” IN DESIGNATED WATERS: TO PROVIDE
FOR THE INSTALLATION OF SIGNS DESIGNATING THESE
ZONES: AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE
THERE TO.**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Police Jury of Vermilion Parish, Louisiana, in regular session duly assembled and proceeding under its police power and further pursuant to the laws of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 1: NO WAKE ZONES (5 M.P.H.)

The following described waterways are hereby designated as no wake zones within which watercraft shall not throw any type of wake or when such a wake is occurring that such watercraft shall not exceed the speed of five (5) miles per hour:

- A. That portion beginning at the Intracoastal Canal entering into the “Oaks Canal” to install a sign facing south and install a sign facing north entering from the Vermilion Bay to “Oaks Canal”.

Appropriate signs shall be erected and maintained along such waterways, and any vessel traveling thereon shall respect the signs so erected and maintained.

SECTION 2: WATERWAY IDENTIFICATION SIGNS AND
NAVIGATIONAL AIDS

No person shall destroy, molest, damage, change or alter any sign or navigational aid placed along, or in, any waterbody within Vermilion Parish.

SECTION 3: PENALTY

Any person violating any of the provisions aforesated shall upon conviction be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days or both.

SECTION 4: DECLARATION

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the remainder of said ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5: IMPLEMENTATION

This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption by the Police Jury.

On motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby and unanimously carried, the above ordinance was adopted as presented.

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Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury ratified the Section 5311 Monthly Activity Report for the month of June, 2006, as submitted by the Vermilion Council on Aging and directed the Secretary/Treasurer to submit the report to the Department of Transportation and Development for reimbursement in accordance with the contract agreement.

Mr. Clay P. Menard, Secretary/Treasurer presented the following various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard duly seconded by Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to accept Drake Elm (Pvt.) Drive into the Parish System as a private road, in Election District No.3, contingent upon two residents providing access to their residences from Dentente Road or accept the new addresses on Drake Elm (Pvt.) Drive.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury denied Acadiana Building, LLC to receive local benefits on the Enterprise Zone Program.

Mr. Menard also informed the Jury that Mr. Darvey Dupuis who was overpaid and his salary frozen, until full restitution has been paid, has retired as of August 1, 2006.

Upon motion of Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to hold Mr. Darvey Dupuis's last payroll check, pending hearing from Legal Counsel or make payment arrangements.

Upon motion of Mr. David C. Mayard duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of the following invoices to Sellers & Associates, Inc. for professional services:

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved final plat for the subdivision development identified as Maria Danna Segura Subdivision, in Election District No. 2.

Mr. Clay P. Menard, Secretary/Treasurer advised the Jury that parish roads are being torn up by drilling companies. Mr. Menard asked the Jury what needs to be done to get the drilling companies to repair the parish roads.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to amend the Pipeline Ordinance to that the permit application shall include a statement by the applicant, certifying that the applicant shall be responsible for all damages to parish roads, ditches, and all other infrastructure, in connection with all operations.

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE
RELATIVE TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF PIPELINES

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF PIPELINES IN THE PARISH OF VERMILION, LOUISIANA.

BE IT ORDAINED that it is the desire of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury to amend the Ordinance originally adopted December 6, 1976, relative to the construction of pipelines, as set forth herein.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Police Jury of Vermilion Parish, in regular session convened on this 7th day of August, 2006, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury amended the Parish Ordinance originally adopted on December 6, 1976, in the following specifics:

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the permit application shall include a statement by the applicant, certifying that the applicant shall be responsible for all damages to parish roads, ditches, and all other infrastructure, in connection with all operations.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all other provisions of said Ordinance originally adopted on December 6, 1976, shall remain unchanged.

This amendment having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted at a public meeting of the Police Jury of the Parish of Vermilion, State of Louisiana, was then submitted to an official vote as a whole, the vote was thereon being as follows:

Upon motion of Mr. Edval Simon, Jr. duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to accept Ceva Richard (Pvt.) Road into the Parish System as a private road, in Election District No.8.

Mr. Menard also informed the Jurors that on Wednesday August 9, 2006, at 10:00 a.m., Wet Tech Energy, Inc. will have a ground breaking ceremony for upcoming office and fabrication shop, at 4598 Woodlawn Road, Maurice, LA. 70555.

Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel discussed with the Jury about the Drug and Alcohol Policy.

Mr. Moresi also discussed with the Jury about the amendment Ordinance 2001-O-17 Regulating Traffic on Parish Roads.

Mr. Moresi also informed the Jury that the letters have been sent to the Shooting Range owners.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel to send a letter to Mr. Robert Brown, owner of property off of W. Etienne Road, relative to tall grass on property, which is a hazard for neighbors entering roadway.

Upon motion of Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to install 10 ton weight limit sign on Mulberry Road, contingent upon approval from Parish Engineer.

Upon motion of Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Sellers & Associates, Inc. to do a drainage study on Bluebonnet Road, relative to two bridges being removed and replaced with pipe or culverts.

Mr. Hubert J. Faulk thanked Mr. Mark Poche` for the invite to the shooting range.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Ravis Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the Secretary/Treasurer to research if there is an office space available for the Assist Agency, at the Vermilion Parish Office Complex (Old Hibernia Bank).

Mr. Ronald Darby questioned who is still running Nite Life Lounge.

Mr. Paul Moresi, Legal Counsel discussed with the Jury about the pass problems that have been going on with Nite Life Lounge.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to correct the minutes of the Special Meeting on July 19, 2006, to change the second sentence to President Poche` and Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III.

Mr. Ravis Menard questioned the unloading of commodities, and that he feels that it is hard on the employees of the location where the commodities are being unloaded. Mr. Menard wants to send the truck to a different location to be unloaded.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted an ordinance establishing the placing of "No Littering \$500.00 Fine" signs off of Tommy Road.

ORDINANCE

2006-O-22

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of litter exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Tommy Road, in Election District No. 3.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose the following to install a "No Littering \$500.00 Fine" sign along the portion of Tommy Road.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for any offense, a maximum fine of \$500.00 fine.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the littering ordinance.

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Mr. Minos Broussard thanked the Vermilion Parish Sheriff to allow the use of the DOC prisoners.

(Ret.) General Robert LeBlanc discussed with the Jury about submitting all necessary paperwork for 100% recovery for category B worksheets from Hurricane Rita by August 29, 2006. Mr. LeBlanc also informed the Jury, if this is not done, the Jury will have to send a letter to Col. Smith explaining why paperwork was not completed by deadline.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Ravis Menard, and unanimously carried, there being no further business to be presented, the meeting was duly adjourned.
