Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on August 20, 2007, with President Luther "Buster" Hardee, III presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Hardee, who asked Mr. Carroll Duhon to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

President Hardee asked if there was anyone in the audience who had a bid for the "Aerial Spray Helicopter Service Contract for Mosquito Control".

Upon motion by Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to close the receipt of bids for the "Aerial Spray Helicopter Service Contract for Mosquito Control".

Upon motion by Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to open the bids for the "Aerial Spray Helicopter Service Contract for Mosquito Control".

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers & Associates, Inc., presented the only bid received from T & M Aviation for \$2,000 per hour with a minimum of 75 hours, and a rate of \$2,000 per hour over 75 hours for the first year, and the same rate for the second year.

Mr. Billy Noegel, Mosquito Control Director, informed the Jury that he had spoken with the individuals at T & M Aviation, and they will be eliminating the minimum requirement, and will fly on an as-needed basis only.

Upon motion by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury awarded the only bid received for the "Aerial Spray Helicopter Service Contract for Mosquito Control" to T & M Aviation, in the amount of \$2,000 per hour for the first year, and the same rate for the second year.

President Luther "Buster" Hardee, III asked if there are any additions or changes to the agenda.

Upon motion by Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Mark Poche', the Police Jury authorized additions/changes to the agenda to allow Mr. Calvin Woodruff, Mayor Linda Hardee, Mr. Steven Menard and Ms. Carol Bradley to address the Jury.

President Hardee reminded those individuals who wished to speak to the Jury to please keep all comments brief, no more than five minutes each.

President Hardee recognized Ms. Mary Courville with the Acadiana Marina to speak to the Jury.

Ms. Courville informed the Jury she was at tonight's meeting on behalf of the Acadiana Marina. The Marina was an existing business before Hurricane Rita, with 50 lots with boat slips. The Marina plans to sell the lots in order to raise revenue for improvement of the marina property. Ms. Courville requested the approval for development of subdivision as required by the Subdivision Ordinance. She stated that the plat and plans for Acadiana Marina had been submitted to Sellers & Associates, Inc. for review, but they would like to expedite the process.

Upon motion by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the preliminary review of plat for the subdivision development identified as Acadiana Marina, in Election District No. 13, subject to approval from Sellers & Associates, Inc.

President Hardee recognized Mr. Dexter Duhon, candidate for Vermilion Parish Tax Assessor.

Mr. Duhon introduced himself as a candidate for the office of Tax Assessor for Vermilion Parish. He also introduced his wife, Ms. Cathy Duhon, his son, Mr. Derek Duhon, and one of his campaign workers, Jude Savoie.

Mr. Duhon began by giving a brief personal history. He graduated from Kaplan High School and from the University of Southwestern Louisiana with an accounting degree. He is currently a Certified Public Accountant, a Notary Public, and he is a licensed Real Estate Agent. Mr. Duhon stated that he has a 30 year history of community service in Abbeville and Vermilion Parish. Mr. Duhon informed the Jury that he worked for the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department in the Tax Collection Department while attending USL, and it was then that he decided he would one day run for the office of Tax Assessor. Mr. Duhon stated that he believed that the timing is right for running for the office of Tax Assessor, and that he is ready to serve Vermilion Parish. Mr. Duhon further stated that his platform was fair, equitable and accurate assessments for Vermilion Parish. He also stated that he felt it was time to improve technology in the Tax Assessor's office as Vermilion Parish was falling behind in this regard as compared to nearby parishes.

President Hardee recognized Mr. Calvin Woodruff, Legal Counsel for the City of Kaplan.

Mr. Woodruff informed the Jury that the City of Kaplan desired to incorporate a 5-acre tract of land, directly south of the Kaplan city limits, for an upscale mobile home park. In order to incorporate, the city would need a corridor from the current city limits to get to the location of the property. The city requested permission from the Jury to incorporate South Guidry Street from the city's southern boundary line at Mill Street down to the southern boundary at Maraist Street, approximately 3 blocks. Were permission granted to incorporate South Guidry Street, the City of Kaplan would take over maintenance and operation of the road. Mr. Woodruff requested a motion from the Jury to allow the City of Kaplan to incorporate South Guidry Street.

Mr. Purvis Abshire questioned Legal Counsel regarding the legality of donating South Guidry Street to the City of Kaplan.

Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel, informed the Jury that they could donate the road to the City of Kaplan if they wished to do so.

Upon motion by Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the donation of South Guidry Street to the City of Kaplan in connection with the annexation of a 5-acre tract of land directly south of the Kaplan city limits, for an upscale mobile home park, as set forth in their letter of August 13, 2007.

President Hardee recognized Mayor Linda Hardee, with the City of Kaplan to speak to the Jury.

Mayor Hardee thanked the Jury for allowing her to speak and extended her gratitude for their help with the incorporation of South Guidry Street. Mayor Hardee told the Jury that she was aware that they do not always receive praise for their employees, but she wanted to praise Mr. Ricky LeBlanc, Solid Waste Supervisor, for the outstanding job he has done and continues to do. Mayor Hardee stated that she is aware that Mr. LeBlanc has to listen to the public gripe and complain about trash pick-up, but he always does it in a professional manner.

Mayor Hardee also informed the Jury that she wanted to thank them for their consideration in allowing the City of Kaplan to borrow one of the Parish's grab trucks for one month.

Mr. Woodruff informed the Jury that he had been in contact with the Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel, and they were in the process of drawing up an intergovernmental agreement to allow the city to utilize one of the Parish's grab trucks for one month, and would submit it to the Jury as soon as it was completed.

President Hardee recognized Mr. Stephen Menard to speak to the Jury.

Mr. Menard informed the Jury that he had sent 2 letters to them, the first of which specifically requested information regarding the following:

1. Why was there no criminal investigation conducted by the Vermilion Parish Sheriff Department regarding allegations of criminal activity at the Rabies Control Facility?
2. Was it legal for Mr. Jimmy Meaux, Sr. to be employed by the Vermilion Parish Police Jury and to hold a commissioner position with the Coulee Baton Gravity Drainage District?

Mr. Menard further informed the Jury that his second letter requested information for a number of items regarding the Rabies Control Facility and its policies and procedures.

Mr. Wayne Touchet suggested having Legal Counsel answer the itemized request from Mr. Menard.

Mr. Mark Poche' requested clarification from Legal Counsel regarding the ethics of an employee holding a commission on the drainage board.

Mr. Moresi stated that the Dual-Office Holding Law states that someone may serve on a drainage board or any other public body or position in the state of Louisiana. Mr. Moresi informed Mr. Menard that anyone could file a complaint with the Louisiana Board of Ethics, and that the Board of Ethics did have a website for research on any ethics issue.

Mr. Menard asked Legal Counsel why there was no investigation conducted by the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department regarding allegation of criminal activity at the Rabies Control Facility. Mr. Moresi stated that he was not aware of any allegations of criminal activity at the facility, and that neither the Jury nor the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department acts on any unsubstantiated rumors.

Mr. Wayne Touchet informed Mr. Menard that he had every right to file a complaint with the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department.

Mr. Menard also stated that the Administrator/Secretary-Treasurer was advised of the situation at the Rabies Control Facility by the former Rabies Control Supervisor and Animal Wardens, yet he did nothing. Furthermore, Mr. Jimmy Meaux was appointed as Rabies Control Supervisor following the allegations of criminal activity.

Mr. Menard further stated that he would suggest re-opening the Animal Supervisor position, since those who put in applications before were never interviewed. He questioned whether Mr. Meaux was qualified for the Animal Supervisor position.

Mr. Touchet stated that Mr. Meaux was hired on a 6-month probationary period, and that should he not fulfill the duties required of him, he would be removed from the position.

President Hardee recognized Ms. Carol Bradley to speak to the Jury.

Ms. Bradley informed the Jury that she was interested in reiterating to the Jury the request made by the residents of Zion Hill Subdivision during the Public Road Committee

meeting held on August 15, 2007. Ms. Bradley informed the Jury that she had requested having Revelation Drive in Zion Hill Subdivision blacktopped rather than having a 3-course application laid. She stated that the residents want an attractive subdivision and felt that a blacktopped road would improve the subdivision's appearance. Ms. Bradley informed the Jury that the subdivision is not looking for any help in developing the subdivision, she and the other residents are only looking for help in having the road blacktopped.

President Hardee read the following announcements:

1. The Corps of Engineers will hold the 17th Priority Project List meeting on Wednesday, August 29, 2007, at 7:00 p.m. at the Vermilion Parish Courthouse, Courtroom No. 1.
2. The Corps of Engineers will hold a Public Meetings Technical Committee Meeting on Thursday, August 30, 2007, at 7:00 p.m. at the Corps of Engineers District Assembly Room, 7400 Leake Avenue, New Orleans.
3. The Corps of Engineers will hold a Technical Committee meeting on Wednesday, September 12, 2007, at 9:30 a.m. at the Corps of Engineers District Assembly Room, 7400 Leake Avenue, New Orleans.

Upon motion of Mr. Mark Poche`, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the August 6, 2007 meeting, were dispensed with and were accepted.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers and Associates, Inc. presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of the following Project Permits:

- (A) Project Permit No. 1493-D to Red Willow Offshore, LLC, to construct and maintain a drill site location with structures for drilling the P. J. Miller Heirs Well No. 1, in Election District No. 13, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/Office of Emergency Preparedness.
- (B) Project Permit No. 1494-D to McClymond, LTD, to construct and maintain a drill site location with structures for drilling the M. Marceaux Well No. 1, in Election District No. 13, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/Office of Emergency Preparedness.

- (C) Project Permit No. 1487-D to El Paso E & P, to cancel all drilling operations for the L MARG H RA SUA: Tartak et al No. 1 Well, in Election District No. 10.
- (D) Project Permit No. 1465-P to El Paso E & P, to cancel all operations concerning the installation of 9,414 feet of one 8-inch flowline to serve the Apache Louisiana Minerals, Inc., Well No. 001, in Election District No. 09.

Upon motion by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of the following Letters of No Objection:

- (A) Nexen Petroleum, Inc. to conduct a seismic survey utilizing an existing well previously permitted by the Vermilion Parish Police Jury as Permit No. 1490-D, in Section 15, T-17-S, R-2-E, in Election District No. 09.
- (B) Chevron Pipe Line Company to remove and abandon pipelines and associated structures, in T-14-S and T-15-S, R-3-E, in Election District No. 09.
- (C) Browning Oil Company to maintain dredge for the Fred Stovall Well No. 2, in Section 25, T-14-S, R-3-E, in Election District No. 09.

Upon motion by Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved Contract Change Order No. 3 for the F.Y. 2005 LCDBG-DR Water System Improvements – Cow Island Area. This change order would reduce the total contract price by \$66,132.71, adjusting the total contract price to \$568,616.54.

Mr. Sellers also informed the Jury that approval had been received from the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry for the storage of tree limbs and yard waste at the Solid Waste Facility and the Eddie Young property.

Mr. Sellers further informed the Jury that they are in the process of receiving bids for the 3-year contract for a tub grinder. Bids are due on Monday, September 19, 2007 at 7:00 p.m.

Mr. Sellers discussed with the Jury signing a general contract with Sellers & Associates, Inc., for those projects assigned to his business. Mr. Sellers' insurance company has informed him their rates could be reduced if they had such a contract. Mr. Sellers informed the Jury that no work could be done without the authority of the Police Jury.

Mr. Mark Poche` asked Mr. Sellers if this bound the Police Jury to Sellers & Associates, Inc. for every job they had for the year.

Mr. Sellers stated that it did not bind the Police Jury for every job, just those that were assigned to Sellers & Associates, Inc.

Upon motion by Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the President to sign a general contract with Sellers & Associates, Inc. for those jobs assigned to Sellers & Associates, Inc.

Upon motion by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted a resolution removing Juniper Road Bridge from the Off System Bridge Program.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE
VERMILION PARISH POLICE JURY
FOR THE OFF-SYSTEM BRIDGE PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury is participating in the Federal and State Off-System Bridge Program; and

WHEREAS, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury has listed 14 bridges on the priority list of the State eligible for funding; and

WHEREAS, the State finds itself short of funds to put these bridges in line for construction; and

WHEREAS, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury has several bridges scheduled for closing and/or with limited load limits; and

WHEREAS, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury is in a position to advertise for bids on the following bridges under Project Nos. 713-57-0105, 713-57-0107, 713-57-0112, 713-57-0117 and 713-57-0118.

WHEREAS, due to lack of funding by the State and the delay in construction, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury requests the removal of Project No. 713-57-0118 from the Off-System Bridge Program due to the closure of the bridge and the Vermilion Parish Police Jury has ordered the reconstruction of this bridge; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby commit to fund 20% of the project cost for the following bridge Project Nos. 713-57-0105, 713-57-0107, 713-57-0112 and 713-57-0117 and request the State to put these projects in line for advertising for bids as soon as possible, however, in less than 6 months.

THEREUPON, the above resolution was declared adopted.

Mr. Dudley Broussard, Road Supervisor, informed the Jury that there was a problem with Area I Barn. Mr. Broussard recommended that a crew be created for the 3 Police Jurors on the west end of Area I at the Public Works Facility and a crew be created for the 3 Police Jurors on the east end of Area I at the Area I Barn. As it stands now, there is too much work for one foreman to handle. Mr. Broussard would recommend having Mr. Terry Bourque, Mr. Wayne Briggs and Mr. Clarence Fusilier work out of the Area I Barn and open the area foreman's job for any employee who wishes to apply for the Barn at the Public Works Facility.

Mr. Mark Poché informed Mr. Broussard that the six Jurors in Area I would meet to solve this problem in the near future.

Upon motion by Mr. Mark Poche`, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations, as presented, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON AUGUST 15, 2007, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to provide Ms. Senegal with a report of when the road had been graded and/or limestone laid for the past 2 years.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to hire a contractor to remove the tree located in the Parish's right-of-way in the Marion Faulk Subdivision, in Election District No. 11.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Public Works Director to purchase a steam cleaner for the Area I Barn.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve sending a Letter of No Objection to Trunkline Gas Company, LLC to construct a meter site down an existing oil production road and to re-construct an existing bridge destroyed by Hurricane Rita and to remove the existing bridge and install a self-supporting twin rail car bridge structure at the same location crossing Boston Canal, in Election District No. 9.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury amend the pipeline permit ordinance revising the project permit application fee schedule.

6. It is recommended the Police Jury approve paying Partial Payment No. 1 to Glenn Lege Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$217,831.86, relative to the “2006-2007 Capital Improvements Program - Street Improvements”.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve Change Order No. 3. This change order would add \$11,042.89 to the total contract price.
8. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the preliminary plat for the subdivision identified as Deere Park Subdivision, in Election District No. 1.
9. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an Ordinance establishing the placement of “NO LITTERING - \$500 FINE” signs at the 4 fishing piers located on Louisiana Highway 82, in Election District No. 13.
10. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve paying the following invoices to Frenzel Motors, Inc., relative to the “2007 or Latest Model 5-Cubic Yard Dump Truck (Non-CDL) for Parishwide”:

A. Invoice No. 13367 Date: 08/13/07 Amount = \$54,305.39	B. Invoice No. 13370 Date: 08/13/07 Amount = \$54,305.39

11. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Administrator/Secretary-Treasurer to sign an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Coulee Baton Gravity Drainage District No. 1. The Police Jury will use its equipment and labor to mow a public drainage ditch on the Winston Foreman property in Nunez and the Drainage District will return a similar value of service at a later date.
12. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve paying the attached bills that were submitted.
13. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to send a letter denying Maxie Pierce Grocery to receive local benefits on the Enterprise Zone Program.
14. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to cut the trees back located on Tamara Road, in Election District No. 6.
15. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to reset the bridge load limits on Boat Shop Road for the two bridges, in Election District No. 6, to 15 tons.

16. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Road Supervisor to install a 3-way stop sign at the intersection of North Lyman and Marcia, in Election District No. 5.

ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury’s attention that a considerable amount of litter exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Louisiana Highway 82, at the 4 fishing piers, in Election District No. 13,

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose the following to install a “No Littering \$500.00 Fine” sign at the 4 fishing piers along Louisiana Highway 82.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for any offense, a maximum fine of \$500.00 fine.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff’s Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the littering ordinance.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON AUGUST 15, 2007, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to take all steps necessary to ensure that all shooting ranges in Vermilion Parish are in compliance with Ordinance 2005-O-21.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to advertise for three 2007 or Latest Model Hydraulically Operated Knuckle-Boom Trash Loaders for the Solid Waste Program.

3. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to investigate the legality of entering into an intergovernmental agreement with any municipality within the Parish to allow them to utilize one of the Parish' grab trucks for a limited period of time.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Mr. Billy Noegel to attend the Louisiana Mosquito Control Association meeting to be held December 3rd through December 5th, 2007, in Metairie, Louisiana.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to purchase additional pumps as needed for the Solid Waste Facility to alleviate high levels of water due to recent rains.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve a 20 x 15 office/education room addition to be built at the Indian Bayou Fire Department. The Fire Department will be responsible for the cost of the addition.

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that due to a considerable increase in the amount of traffic, including heavy vehicles, on Columbus Road, in Election District No. 13,

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose the following to install "NO THRU TRUCKS ALLOWED" signs on Columbus Road for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate signs be installed in said area.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the ordinance.

Upon motion by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the Administrator/Secretary-Treasurer to sign a letter to take any and all action necessary to provide a Standby Letter of Credit in favor of DEQ, in the amount up to \$3,079,228.00, dated June 12, 2007, with an expiration date of June 12, 2008, which Letter of Credit may be drawn upon by DEQ to pay the cost of (closure and post-closure) care of the Parish's Solid Waste Disposal Facility, Permit No. D-113-0023, P-0030 at North Abbeville, Louisiana.

Upon motion by Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert Faulk, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Sellers & Associates, Inc. to advertise for quotes and accept the lowest quote received to reconstruct the levee at Victoria Acres Subdivision to an elevation of 15.5 feet msl, to have Legal Counsel and the Administrator/Secretary-Treasurer determine the owners of the sewer system at Victoria Acres Subdivision, and to have the Vermilion Parish Health Department check the sewer lines near the ditches in Victoria Acres Subdivision.

Upon motion by Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the installation of "DEAF CHILD AREA" signs at 3589 Woodlawn Road, in Election District No. 1.

Mr. Theriot also addressed the Jury regarding the situation at the Rabies Control Facility. Mr. Theriot stated that Mr. Menard called him the week of July 4, 2007 while he was with Mr. Ravis Menard inspecting a culvert. Mr. Menard questioned Mr. Theriot regarding the allegations of criminal misconduct at the Rabies Control Facility. Mr. Theriot told Mr. Menard that the Rabies Control Supervisor had resigned and that he was not aware of any criminal misconduct. He suggested that Mr. Menard contact the Vermilion Parish Sheriff to make a complaint. Mr. Menard also questioned Mr. Theriot about the ethics issue of Mr. Jimmy Meaux, Sr. being an employee of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury and holding a commission on the Coulee Baton Drainage Board. Mr. Theriot informed Mr. Menard that he was within his rights to file a complaint with the Louisiana Board of Ethics regarding that issue.

Mr. Menard informed Mr. Theriot that he was interested in the Rabies Control Supervisor position, at which point Mr. Theriot told Mr. Menard he would have to fill out an application. The Rabies Control Supervisor position was advertised in the official journal the week of July 13, 2007. Mr. Menard turned in his resume on August 15, 2007, one week after Mr. Jimmy Meaux, Sr. had been appointed as Rabies Control Supervisor. Mr. Theriot felt that he should inform the Jurors of the timeline of the events and his conversation with Mr. Menard.

Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel, presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Mr. Moresi informed the Jury that he had sent letters to all shooting ranges in the Parish requesting compliance with Ordinance 2005-O-21. He stated that he had also included a copy of the Application for a Shooting Range Permit with the letter, but has received no replies as of today.

Mr. Moresi also informed the Jury that after studying the Ordinance prohibiting animals roaming at large, he felt that no amendment was necessary to include wording for underground electronic fencing.

Mr. Moresi stated that the adjudicated property ordinance was nearly complete, and that he would be presenting the ordinance at the Public Road Committee meeting to be held on September 12, 2007.

Mr. Moresi also stated that he had received a call from Ms. Betty Fuller regarding complaints of tall grass in certain subdivisions. Mr. Moresi explained to Ms. Fuller that all complaints received by the Administrative Office were forwarded to him, at which time he sends out letters requesting compliance with the Police Jury's Subdivision Ordinance, which prohibits long grass.

Upon motion by Mr. Mark Poche, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized installing 2 additional "45 MPH" signs on

North Airport Road, one near the intersection with Highway 338 and one at the intersection with Rodeo Road, in Election District No. 06.

(Ret.) General Robert LeBlanc informed the Jury that, due to Hurricane Dean, Vermilion Parish had declared a preliminary State of Emergency last week. As of the last advisories, Hurricane Dean will hit south Mexico.

Mr. LeBlanc also requested the Police Jury approve paying for the advertisement for an Administrative Secretary, or to transfer funds to the Vermilion Parish Office of Homeland Security/Emergency Preparedness to pay for the advertisement.

Upon motion by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved paying for the advertisement for an Administrative Secretary for the Vermilion Parish Office of Homeland Security/Emergency Preparedness.

Upon motion of Mr. Mark Poche`, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, and unanimously carried, there being no further business to be presented, the meeting was duly adjourned.
