May 21, 2007
Abbeville, Louisiana

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on May 21, 2007, with President Luther "Buster" Hardee, III presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Hardee, who asked Mr. Hubert Faulk to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

President Luther "Buster" Hardee, III, asked Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers & Associates, Inc., to present the bids for the "2006-2007 Capital Improvements Program Street Improvements".

Upon motion by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Jury closed the receipt of all bids and authorized the opening of the following bids:

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Mark Poche', and unanimously carried, the Police Jury awarded the lowest bid to Glenn Lege Construction, in the amount of \$4,007,025.25, for the "2006-2007 Capital Improvements Programs-Street Improvements".

Mr. Sellers informed the Jury that only one bid was received for the "2007 or Latest Model Road Sweeper" from Nortrax, in the amount of \$39,250.00.

Upon motion by Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury awarded the only bid received to Nortrax, in the amount of \$39,250.00, for “2007 or Latest Model Road Sweeper,” for Parishwide.

Mr. Sellers informed the Jury that only one bid was received for the “2007 or Latest Model 5-Cubic Yard Dump Truck (Non-CDL) for the Public Works Department” from Frenzel Motors, Inc., in the amount of \$54,305.39 per each vehicle.

Upon motion by Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury awarded the only bid received to Frenzel Motors, Inc., in the amount of \$54,305.39 each, for four (4) “2007 or Latest Model 5-Cubic Yard Dump Truck (Non-CDL) for the Public Works Department” totaling \$217,221.56.

President Luther “Buster” Hardee, III, asked if there are any additions or changes to the agenda.

Mr. Hardee asked Mr. Ivan Fontenot, with Cajun Auction Company, Inc., if he had any business to present to the Police Jury.

Mr. Fontenot spoke with the Jury regarding the recent auction held on May 12, 2007. The auction netted a grand total of \$181,493.38.

President Hardee recognized Mr. Jonathan Perry, a candidate for State Representative, District 47. After a brief biography, Mr. Perry asked for the Police Jury’s support and vote on October 20, 2007.

President Hardee recognized Ms. Gerri Daniels, with Gulf Engineers & Consultants.

Ms. Daniels stated that her firm, in conjunction with FEMA and various other entities, are part of the project team for the Louisiana Mapping Project (LaMP) and are working on the development of updated Digital Flood Insurance Rate Maps (DFIRMs). In the near future, LaMP will be hosting a series of meetings held locally within each project group to provide training and assistance. These meetings will target three different groups:

- (A) Executive Group – government/elected officials
- (B) Technical Group – surveyors/engineering officials
- (C) User/Stakeholder Group – real estate agents/insurance agents

President Hardee recognized Mr. Michael G. Langlinais, Vermilion Parish Tax Assessor.

Mr. Langlinais addressed the Police Jury in regards to reassessed property owned by Florida Gas Transmission. Mr. Langlinais informed the Police Jury that the Parish will lose approximately \$78,000 in taxes from Florida Gas Transmission.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the May 5, 2007 meeting were dispensed with and were accepted.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers and Associates, Inc. presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of Project Permit No. 1481-D to Tolar Corporation to construct a drill site location with appurtenant structures for drilling the MIO GYP RE SUA; A. V. Cain No. 1 Well, in Election District No. 14, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/ Office of Emergency Preparedness.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a "Letter Of No Objection" to Chevron/Texaco Pipeline, LLC, for erosion control of bank lines at Oaks Canal, where an existing 12 inch pipeline is located, in Sections 17 of T-14-S, R-5-E, in Election District No. 9.

Upon motion by Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved establishing a policy to have the Parish Road Supervisor inspect and take pictures of roads (before and after) in the area of requests for drilling permits to document any road deterioration once projects have been completed.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the preliminary plans for the subdivision development identified as Hunter Row, contingent upon Parish Engineers comments, in Election District No. 02.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the preliminary plans for the subdivision development identified as Cedar Cove, contingent upon Parish Engineers comments, in Election District No. 03.

Mr. Sellers informed the Police Jury that the Louisiana Governor's Office has approved funding for the Hazardous Mitigation Plan Update and Project Scoping. The total project funding is \$150,000; the local share is 25% or \$37,500.00. Mr. Sellers requested an authorization from the Police Jury to allow the President to enter into a contract with Sellers & Associates, Inc. to proceed.

(Ret.) General Robert LeBlanc informed the Police Jury that the Hazardous Mitigation Plan is in place to allow the Police Jury to recoup those monies spent to repair damages to the Parish. General LeBlanc recommended the Police Jury get with the taxing bodies from Vermilion Parish and have them each contribute to the 25% owed.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the Parish Engineer and the

Administrative/Secretary-Treasurer to get together to calculate a formula depicting each entity's percentage for the 25% of the Hazardous Mitigation Plan and calling a meeting of those taxing bodies.

Upon motion by Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the President to enter into a contract with Sellers & Associates, Inc., relative to the Hazardous Mitigation Plan Update and Project Scoping.

Mr. Sellers informed the Police Jury that Sellers & Associates, Inc. had completed the necessary paperwork for a Permit Application to connect the two plugs that had been made to North Prong Schooner Bayou. The Corps of Engineers phoned Mr. Sellers to let him know that the Corps is preparing to go in and armor the two plugs. Mr. Sellers then asked the Corps representative if it would be possible for the Corps to include in their project the connecting of the 100 foot gap between the two plugs. Mr. Seller advised the Police Jury to wait and see if the Corps of Engineers will be able to include the 100 feet into their project, thus eliminating the need for the Police Jury to connect the two plugs.

Upon motion by Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations, as presented, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON MAY 16, 2007, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve replacing a 14' Priefert Brown D Gate on Marlon Road, in Election District No. 9, damaged by Parishwide equipment, at a cost of \$123.30. Cost to be paid from Road District 7.

2. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve purchasing extended power train warranties for 48 months/5,000 hours for the following 2006 Komatsu Motor Graders:

496 Motor Hours
Cost: \$4,999.00

b.) Serial No. 51244
474 Motor Hours
Cost: \$4,999.00

c.) Serial No. B20043
869 Motor Hours
Cost: \$5,185.00

3. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 40 mph speed limit on Sand Pit Road, from Highway 167 to 7915 Sand Pit Road, in Election District No. 1.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury accept Tobias (Pvt) Road into the Parish Road System as a private road, in Election District No. 3.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to advertise for bids for the “Materials for Parish Road Maintenance for the Period of July 1, 2007 to December 31, 2007”.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Luther Road, for its entire length, in Election District No. 2.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the construction of a handicap accessible restroom and ramp in the Abbeville Historical Museum (old Abbeville Public Library Building).
8. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to write a letter to El Paso Production to begin negotiating to have Love Road repaired.
9. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to investigate a claim filed by Ms. Langlinais and report his findings to the Police Jury at the meeting which will be held on May 21, 2007.
10. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 15 mph speed limit and a “Children At Play” sign on Rachele Drive, in Election District No. 11.
11. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve placing additional speed limit signs on Jane Street, in Election District Nos. 5 and 6.
12. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve placing additional “NO DUMPING” signs on Guegnon Street between Jacquelyn Street and Trahan Street, in Election District No. 4.
13. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance to install “NO WAKE ZONE” signs on the Boston Canal, starting at the first camp, then heading southbound, in Election District No. 9.
14. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to send a letter to Mr. Paul Ed Broussard, owner of Country Acres Living Mobile Home Park, requesting he increase the number of trash bins or that he increases the number of service pick-ups at his trailer park
15. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve placing a “DEAD END” sign on Wildflower Road, in Election District No. 10.

ORDINANCE

2007-O-12

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Sand Pit Road, in Election District No. 1.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 40 mph speed limit on Sand Pit Road, from Highway 167 to 7915 Sand Pit Road.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

ORDINANCE

2007-O-13

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 15 mph speed limit on Rachelle Drive, for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs and Children At Play signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

In accordance with the Public Road Committee Recommendations the following ordinance was adopted:

ORDINANCE

2007-O-15

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF “NO WAKE ZONE” IN DESIGNATED WATERS ON THE BOSTON CANAL, STARTING AT THE FIRST CAMP, THEN HEADING SOUTHBOUND; TO PROVIDE FOR THE INSTALLATION OF SIGNS DESIGNATING THESE ZONES; AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Police Jury of Vermilion Parish, Louisiana, in regular session duly assembled and proceeding under its police power and further pursuant to the laws of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 1: NO WAKE ZONES (5 M.P.H.)

The following described waterways are hereby designated as no wake zones within which watercraft shall not throw any type of wake or when such a wake is occurring that such watercraft shall not exceed the speed of five (5) miles per hour:

- A. That portion on the Boston Canal, starting at the first camp, then heading southbound.

Appropriate signs shall be erected and maintained along such waterways, and any vessel traveling thereon shall respect the signs so erected and maintained.

SECTION 2: WATERWAY IDENTIFICATION SIGNS AND NAVIGATIONAL AIDS

No person shall destroy, molest, damage, change or alter any sign or navigational aid placed along, or in, any water body within Vermilion Parish.

SECTION 3: PENALTY

Any person violating any of the provisions aforestated shall upon conviction be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days or both.

SECTION 4: DECLARATION

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the remainder of said ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5: IMPLEMENTATION

This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption by the Police Jury.

On motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the above ordinance was adopted as presented.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON MAY 16, 2007, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the installation of Chevron striping, lights, hose trays and special thread adaptors to the fire truck housed at the Abbeville Fire Department.

2. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to investigate laws in neighboring parishes (i.e. New Iberia) regarding address numbers on homes.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury rescind the motion from the meeting of May 7, 2007, requesting that IBTS inspectors be phased out prior to the June 15th deadline.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Administrative/Secretary-Treasurer and the Administrative Assistant to compile a fee schedule for 3rd Party Providers and report back to the Jury.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Administrative/Secretary-Treasurer to get with Sellers & Associates, Inc. and the Certified Building Official to help create and Administrative Chapter to the Building Code Ordinance and report back to the Jury for approval.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to prepare the necessary paperwork to bid out the Aerial Spraying Contract by Helicopter for the Mosquito Control Program.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the purchase of a steam cleaner for the Mosquito Control Department.
8. It is recommended that the Police Jury award Bid #2 to Nortrax, in the amount of \$210,750.00, for one used model Articulated Dump Truck for the Solid Waste Program.
9. It is recommended that the Police Jury deny a request for payment made by Mr. James Jackson regarding a washing machine relative to the Solid Waste Facility.
10. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Solid Waste Supervisor to hire 2 general laborers for the Solid Waste Department.
11. It is recommended that the Police Jury deny a “Request for Elevation Variance” to build a camp at 27821 Front Ridge in Kaplan, in Election District No. 13.
12. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve payment of an Invoice dated May 14, 2007, from Rodney P. Primeaux, in the amount of \$525.00, relative to construction of steps at the 7th Ward Fire Station Trailer.
13. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the purchase of a bulldozer for the Solid Waste Program, and authorizes Sellers & Associates, Inc. to prepare the necessary paperwork to advertise for bids.
14. It is recommended that the Police Jury ratify Legal Counsel’s request for a bond reduction for an individual, due to the lack of a handicap facility at the Vermilion Parish Law Enforcement Center.

ORDINANCE
2007-O-11

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
“NO WAKE ZONE” IN DESIGNATED WATERS AT THE MOUTH
OF VERMILION BAY, FROM THE FUELMAN CAMP, TO THE
MOUTH OF SOUTH LAKE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE
INSTALLATION OF SIGNS DESIGNATING THESE ZONES; AND
TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Police Jury of Vermilion Parish, Louisiana, in regular session duly assembled and proceeding under its police power and further pursuant to the laws of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 1: NO WAKE ZONES (5 M.P.H.)

The following described waterways are hereby designated as no wake zones within which watercraft shall not throw any type of wake or when such a wake is occurring that such watercraft shall not exceed the speed of five (5) miles per hour:

- B. That portion beginning at the mouth of Vermilion Bay, from the Fuelman Camp, to the mouth of South Lake.

Appropriate signs shall be erected and maintained along such waterways, and any vessel traveling thereon shall respect the signs so erected and maintained.

**SECTION 2: WATERWAY IDENTIFICATION SIGNS AND
NAVIGATIONAL AIDS**

No person shall destroy, molest, damage, change or alter any sign or navigational aid placed along, or in, any water body within Vermilion Parish.

SECTION 3: PENALTY

Any person violating any of the provisions aforesated shall upon conviction be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days or both.

SECTION 4: DECLARATION

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the remainder of said ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5: IMPLEMENTATION

This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption by the Police Jury.

On motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the above ordinance was adopted as presented.
