

Police Jury Room
July 16, 2007
Abbeville, Louisiana

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on July 16, 2007, with Vice President Hubert J. Faulk presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Faulk, who asked Mr. Wayne Touchet to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the Vice President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Vice President Hubert J. Faulk asked if there are any additions or changes to the agenda.

Upon motion by Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Ravis Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized additions/changes to the agenda to allow Mr. Terry Dartez to address the Jury.

Upon motion by Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized additions/changes to the agenda to allow Ms. Pat Thomas to address the Jury and to allow the opening of the bids for the Multi-Purpose Community Health Center.

Mr. Terry Dartez addressed the Jury regarding a five-acre tract to be annexed ½ mile outside the city limits of Kaplan, before the first large curve on Louisiana Highway 35 South, by the City of Kaplan for a trailer park. The tract is not contiguous to any of the incorporated limits of the City of Kaplan. The land has been zoned as a R-3 which would allow it to be used as a trailer park for FEMA campers. The only way the city can annex the tract would be to annex the road which passes alongside the land. Mr. Dartez and the surrounding landowners have collected a petition to oppose the annexation of the land. Mr. Dartez came to the Police Jury as spokesman for his neighbors to ask for the Police Jury's support in opposing the annexation of the land and the trailer park.

Mr. Purvis Abshire asked Legal Counsel whether the parish road that ran alongside the property being discussed could be given to the City of Kaplan.

Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel, informed the Jury that he would have to research the issue and report back at the next committee meeting.

Upon motion by Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury went on record to accept Mr. Dartez’s petition and to support Mr. Dartez’s opposition to the annexation of the five-acre tract ½ mile outside of the city limits of Kaplan, before the first large curve on Louisiana Highway 35 South, for a FEMA trailer park.

Ms. Pat Thomas addressed the Jury regarding the problem of the public defenders of Vermilion Parish. Ms. Thomas stated that she and the other public defenders represented approximately 93% of all individuals accused of a crime in Vermilion Parish. This being so, they are having major difficulties in meeting with the clients they have. Because the Vermilion Parish Law Enforcement Center is overcrowded, many prisoners are being sent to other parishes for incarceration, i.e. St. Helena Parish, St. Charles Parish, Iberia Parish. This makes it difficult to locate the prisoners. Ms. Thomas stated that the Sixth Amendment of the U. S. Constitution guarantees every accused the right to counsel. The Louisiana Code of Criminal Procedure, Article 511 states that public defenders have the right to be able to see their clients in private at all reasonable times. Public Defenders are required to meet with their clients within 72 hours of their appointment, but many times they are not able to locate the accused individual because he has been moved from one jail to another. Ms. Thomas stated that in essence, we are denying the accused individuals their Constitutional right to counsel.

After a lengthy discussion, the Police Jury decided to take this matter under advisement, and to discuss the matter further at the next General Needs meeting on August 1, 2007.

Upon motion by Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the opening of the bids for the “Multi-Purpose Community Health Center”.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Jr. with The Sellers Group opened the base bids and three alternates as follows:

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the July 2, 2007 meeting were dispensed with and were accepted.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Jr., with The Sellers Group presented various items for the Police Jury’s consideration.
