Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on January 8, 2007, with President Mark Poche` presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Poche`, who asked Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

Mr. Poche` addressed the Jury stating that as the Jury knows that the Presidents position is a two year term, and after the year of Hurricane Rita, it is his belief that the President should only serve for a one year term, and believes that every Juror should get a opportunity to be President. Mr. Poche` also stated that he believe these two positions should not be political, he believes that every Juror should get a chance at this table, and believes that it is the form of government that we have and that we as Jurors owe this to the people of our Parish. Mr. Poche` gave a brief scenario of the past year as being President of the Police Jury and the Jury's accomplishments. Mr. Poche` also stated that he is sure that Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III will be the next president and feels confident with his conservative views will lead the Police Jury to another level. This is something that he tried to reach as President and knows that Mr. Hardee will continue to reach that level; we are all in here for one reason that is to serve the people of Vermilion Parish. Mr. Poche` thanked the Jury for serving this past year and Mr. Hubert J. Faulk thanked Mr. Poche` for the work he did this past year as President.

Mr. Poche` announced that the first order of business was the election of a President and Vice-President.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, Mr. Luther "Buster" Hardee, III was nominated for the position of President of the Police Jury.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, and duly seconded by, Mr. Purvis Abshire, the nominations were closed and Mr. Hardee was elected by acclamation. President Hardee thanked the Jury for having the confidence in him to give him such an important position

to represent the entire Jury and thanked Mr. Mark Poche` for helping the Jury through the hurricane season and had a world of issues to deal with and really appreciate Mr. Poche`s effort on his hard work as president this past year.

Mr. Hardee then took the gavel to conduct the balance of the meeting.

A motion was made by Mr. David C. Mayard, to nominate Mr. Carroll Duhon as Vice-President.

Mr. Carroll Duhon thanked Mr. David C. Mayard for nominating him for Vice-President. Mr. Duhon expressed that in the eleven years he has been a Police Juror, this past year the Police Jury has been split. Mr. Duhon thinks that it is time that the Jury comes together and does what is best for the people of this Parish and work together to make this a better Parish and at this time Mr. Duhon declined the nomination.

Upon motion of Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and seconded by Mr. Purvis Abshire, and unanimously carried, Mr. Hubert J. Faulk was nominated for the position of Vice-President of the Police Jury.

Upon motion of Mr. Wayne Touchet, and duly seconded by, Mr. Ravis Menard, the nominations were closed and Mr. Faulk was elected by acclamation. Vice-President Faulk thanked the Jury and assured the Jury that he will work with the President and the Jury will come together.

Mr. Hardee announced that the next item on the agenda would be the appointment of the Secretary/Treasurer, since we don`t at this moment have one; Mr. Wayne Touchet suggested designating Ms. Linda Duhon as temporary Secretary/Treasurer. Mr. Hardee stated that the Jury has a week or two before a Secretary/Treasurer is appointed. Mr. Hardee suggested to the jury to put this item on hold.

President Hardee then presented his appointments to the various Police Jury Standing Committees for the 2007 calendar year, which are as follows: The Committee`s will appoint the new committee chairman`s at the next scheduled committee meetings.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the minutes of the December 18, 2006, meeting as corrected and the reading was dispensed with and were accepted.

President Hardee read the following announcements:

- 1) The 33rd Annual Vermilion Parish 4-H Livestock Show and Sale will be held on January 20, 2007 at the Cecil McCrory Exhibit Building.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers and Associates, Inc. presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of the following Project Permits:

- (A) Project Permit No. 1461-D to Percision Holdings, LLC, to drill the J.I. Broussard Heris No. 1 Well, drill site will be accessed from Kirk Road, in Election District No. 01, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/ Office of Emergency Preparedness.
- (B) Project Permit No. 1462-D to Nexen Petroleum USA, Inc., to drill the Cote De Mere Prospect Well, drill site will be accessed from a private slip, in Election District No. 09, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/ Office of Emergency Preparedness.

Upon motion of Mr. Hubert J. Faulk, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury gave Final Approval to the subdivision development identified as Kindall Ridge Subdivision, Phase I & II, in Election District No. 02.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the General Needs Committee Recommendations, as presented, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations.

AS A RESULT OF A GENERAL NEEDS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JANUARY 3, 2007, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury give final approval for the subdivision development identified as Kindal Ridge Subdivision, contingent upon Parish Engineers review, in Election District No. 2.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize The Sellers Group to proceed with the minimal of replacing the roof and repair the inside ceiling tile, at the Vermilion Parish Health Unit.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury authorize The Sellers Group to re advertise for a new health unit.

3. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the award of the Aerial Spray Service Contract for the period January 1, 2007 and ending December 31, 2009 to T & M Aviation, in accordance with their bid.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury ratify Partial Payment No. 1, to Environmental Specialties, in the amount of \$312,995.32, relative to the Vermilion Parish Solid Waste Plant Subtitle "D" Improvements Area-1B Slope Tie-In Liner System.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the issuance of Project Permit No. 1460-WL to Southeast Waterworks District No. 2, to install and maintain 2-inch through 8-inch PVC waterlines within the Sweetbay area, located in various sections in T-13-S/ R-2-E and R-3-E.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve Partial Payment No. 1, to Jason S. Hebert, in the amount of \$3,000.00, for the repair to the Erath Health Unit, relative to damages caused by Hurricane Rita.

11. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the Vermilion Parish Sheriff Office's request to construct a cement slab and covered parking for their new Mobile Incident Command Center and S.R.T. Unit at the Vermilion Parish Law Enforcement Center. Cost to be paid by the Vermilion Parish Sheriff Department.
12. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve Partial Payment No. 1, to Glenn Lege Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$3,227.00, relative to the bridge replacement on Hawk Road.
13. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the President and the Secretary/Treasurer to sign the compliance letter for the 2006 audit.
14. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve an ordinance to establish a 10 ton load limit on Mulberry Road for its entire length and to hold the responsible parties

that cause damage be responsible for the paying of any damages caused on Mulberry Road.

15. It is recommended that the Police Jury ratify that all employees with a Grade 6 classification be adjusted to a Grade 7 classifications.
16. It is recommended that the Police Jury rescind a motion to use the insurance funds from the Intracoastal City Fire Station to construct the new 7th Ward Fire Station.
17. It is recommended that the Police Jury ratify the renewal of the Boiler and Machinery Coverage for the Courthouse through Arthur J. Gallagher Risk Management Services, Inc., in the amount of \$2,920.00, for the period of 1/1/07 – 1/1/08.
18. It is recommended that the Police Jury ratify to appoint Ms. Linda Duhon as the Certified Building Official for Vermilion Parish.

In accordance with the General Needs Committee Recommendations the following ordinance was adopted:

ORDINANCE

2007-O-01

- WHEREAS, it has been brought to the attention of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury that a considerable amount of heavy traffic exists on Mulberry Road, which is causing damage and hazardous conditions on the said Mulberry Road, in Election District No. 10.
- SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 10-ton load limit on Mulberry Road, for its entire length.
- SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED that the appropriate signs be installed upon said road.
- SECTION III: IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED that any violation of this ordinance which results in damage to Mulberry Road, its rights-of-ways, or ditches, shall result in civil liability of the violator for the cost of repairs, payable to the Vermilion Parish Police Jury.
- SECTION IV: IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED that, in addition to civil liability, for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a

\$100.00 fine and/or a 10-day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION V: IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED that, in addition to civil liability, for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10-day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION VI: IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED that, in addition to civil liability, for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10-day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION VII: IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that, in addition to civil liability, the Sheriff of Vermilion Parish be and is authorized and directed to enforce this ordinance by the use of regular patrolling.

6. This resolution is applicable for a period of one year unless revoked by the governing body and copy of such revocation shall be furnished to DOTD.

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President Hardee addressed the Jury on Item No. 11 of New Business Part C.

No Action was taken on a resolution authorizing the Vermilion Parish Assessor to hire an attorney to represent the Parish before the Tax Commission and before the courts for on-going litigation over the assessment and ad valorem taxation of certain pipeline property located in Vermilion Parish.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury awarded the quote obtained for labor and material to pressure wash the exterior of the Vermilion Parish Government Complex Building (Old Hibernia Bank), to Mr. Tony Guidry, at a cost of \$3,500.00.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of an Invoice dated January 2, 2007, from Iberia Parish Sheriff's Office, in the amount of \$2,574.85, relative to housing a Vermilion Parish Inmates for the month of December, 2006 and authorized Legal Counsel to send a letter with the attached check to Iberia Parish Sheriff's Office, stating that the Police Jury is not binding itself to any rate by making the payment for the housing of Vermilion Parish inmates.

Upon motion of Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a letter of no objection for temporary liquor permit request for February 9 & 10, 2007, to the Gueydan Duck Festival Association, for a Mardi Gras Dance, to be held on February 9, 2007.

It is further agreed that the Gueydan Duck Festival Association be allowed to use the ARCO Park grounds as a parking area for this dance.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard, with Juror Wayne Touchet abstaining, the Police Jury authorized that a letter be sent to all municipalities requesting to set up a meeting with the mayors and permit officials to discuss the participation in an intergovernmental agreement, that all permitting for the new Louisiana State Construction Building Codes be issued by the Vermilion Parish Police Jury, which would be located in the Courthouse.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to grant a partial release of Perpetual

Rights-Of-Way and/or Spoil Disposal Easements on property previously owned by Thomas DeHart and described as follows:

That certain tract or parcel of land, together with all buildings and improvements, containing 35.838 acres, lying and being situated in Irregular Sections 63 and 74, Township 13 South, Range 3 East, in the Second Ward of Vermilion Parish, Louisiana; bounded north By Dedrick, George and Henry Ramke; East by F.D. Moss; South by Albert Kuelhing; and West by Vermilion River, all in accordance with plat of survey dated April 30th, 1966, made by Noy O. Lewis, Surveyor, recorded in Volume 588 of Conveyances at Page 276, Entry No. 181944 of the Records of Vermilion Parish, Louisiana.

And that Police Jury, President, is authorized to sign all necessary documents in connection therewith.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of an Invoice dated January 4, 2007, from Acadia Parish Sheriff's Office, in the amount of \$694.09, relative to housing a Vermilion Parish Inmates for the month of December, 2006 and authorized Legal Counsel to send a letter with the attached check to Acadia Parish Sheriff's Office, stating that the Police Jury is not binding itself to any rate by making the payment for the housing of Vermilion Parish inmates.

Ms. Linda Duhon informed the Jury that SmartCode will have a SmartCode Pro Session in New Orleans, on January 11-14, 2007. The registration is \$765.00, but the Louisiana Recovery Authority (LRA) will pay for two registrations for the Vermilion Parish Police Jury. Need approval of payment for hotel accommodations and food for Ms. Becky Broussard and someone else from the Jury.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Ms. Rebecca Broussard and Ms. Stella LeJeune to attend a SmartCode Pro Session in New Orleans, on January 11-14, 2007, and approve expenses.

Ms. Duhon also informed the Jury that Mr. Dudley Broussard received a quote from Scott Construction Equipment for (1) one Entyre self propelled chip spreader, at a price of \$125,900.00.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved to purchase (1) one Entyre self propelled chip spreader thru State Contract, if State Contract is not available, then authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to advertise.

Ms. Duhon also informed the Jury that representatives from FEMA, Michael Baker, Inc. and Gulf Engineers & Consultants will be at the Police Jury Administrative Office on January 9, 2007, to discuss the re modernization of the new flood maps.

Ms. Duhon also informed the Jury that the Louisiana Tax Commission has scheduled a hearing for Wednesday, January 17, 2007, at 10:00 a.m. in the Louisiana Tax Commission's Hearing Room, located at 5420 Corporate Boulevard, Suite 107 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, to consider any comments any tax recipient body within the parish might have.

Upon motion of Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Edval Simon, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved an intergovernmental with the Consolidated Gravity Drainage District No. 1, to change a bridge that has collapsed on Polk Road, the Parish will haul off spoil and the Drainage District will provide their equipment.

Upon motion of Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized that a letter be sent to the Vermilion Parish Library Board recommending Ms. Carolyn Bessard as the next Vermilion Parish Library Board of Control Member.

Upon motion of Mr. Purvis Abshire, duly seconded by Mr. Gaulman Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury adopted an ordinance establishing a 15mph speed limit on Flavie Road, for its entire length, in Election District No. 12.

ORDINANCE

2007-O-02

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Flavie Road, in Election District No. 12.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 15 mph speed limit on Flavie Road, for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

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Upon motion of Mr. David C. Mayard, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized to send a letter to the Department of Transportation and Development (DOTD), requesting that signs be installed off of the intersection of U.S. Hwy. 167 and Hwy. 696, stating Vermilion Parish Solid Waste Facility and install an updated sign at the intersection of Hwy. 696 and Birch Road.

Mr. Gaulman Gaspard asked Parish Engineer, Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr. about a Census Report request from a previous meeting. There was a discussion and Mr. Sellers informed the Jury he will get back with them.

Mr. Jules LeBlanc informed the Jury that he lives on Hwy. 82 and has sugarcane property and has concerns if the Parish has a law prohibiting the amount of mileage that tractors and sugarcane wagons can travel on the roads. On Hwy. 82 they travel and come across and travel over 1/2 mile slinging mud all over the road. The Jury discussed with Mr. LeBlanc about this problem. Mr. Carroll Duhon requested that Ms. Linda Duhon research if there is an ordinance in reference to this matter.

Mr. LeBlanc also asked the Jury about some land that has been cleared north of Benvielle Road on the Vermilion River side. Mr. LeBlanc asked if that is going to be a subdivision. Mr. Poche` informed Mr. LeBlanc that he thinks that this is going to be a subdivision. Mr. Hardee informed Mr. LeBlanc that they will have to follow the parish subdivision ordinance.

Mr. Bob Ferguson introduced himself as the new and elected Mayor of Maurice and is just here to attend the meeting and pledge his support with the Vermilion Parish Police Jury and looking forward to working with everyone.

Upon motion of Mr. Ravis Menard, duly seconded by Mr. Minos Broussard, and unanimously carried, that there being no further business to be presented, the meeting was duly adjourned.
