March 19, 2007  
Abbeville, Louisiana

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on March 19, 2007, with President Luther "Buster" Hardee, III presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Hardee, who asked Mr. Maxwell Chreene to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection.

The President recognized Mr. Rene Simon, a candidate for the Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture. After a brief biography, Mr. Simon asked for the Police Jury's support and vote on October 20, 2007.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. Carroll Duhon, and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the March 5, 2007 meeting were dispensed with and were accepted.

Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers & Associates, Inc. presented various items for the Police Jury's consideration.

Mr. Sellers informed the Jury that Trunkline Gas Company, LLC (Project Permit No. 1471-P, Election Districts 9 and 13) is requesting a variance from the Ordinance which requires an 8' barrier under streams and drainage ditches for natural gas pipelines. Trunkline Gas is requesting a waiver be issued so they could go 5' below the bottom rather than 8'.

Upon motion by Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury denied a variance for a pipeline right-of-way for Trunkline Gas Company, LLC, Project Permit No. 1471-P in Election Districts 9 and 13.

Upon motion by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved Pipeline Permits for the following:

(A) Permit No. 1471-P – Trunkline Gas Company, LLC, to furnish and

install approximately 14 miles of one 36 inch natural gas pipeline beginning at the existing Kaplan Compressor Station and ending at the Sabine Henry Hub Station, located in Election Districts No. 9 and 13, contingent upon receiving insurance certificate and correction of the permit to reflect adjustments made.

- (B) Permit No. 1472-P – El Paso E & P Company, LP, to furnish and install approximately 16,794 feet of one 10 inch pipeline beginning at the existing S. L. 18944 Well No. 001 and ending at an existing El Paso Production facility, located in Election District No. 13.
- (C) Permit No. 1473-D – Cimarex Energy Company, to construct a drill site location with appurtenant structures for drilling the BP Amoco Well No. 1, located in Election District No. 14, contingent upon the emergency plan being approved from the Vermilion Parish Homeland Security/ Office of Emergency Preparedness.

Mr. Sellers also informed the Jury of the preliminary approval requested by Rosewood Estates Subdivision in Election District No. 3. Mr. Sellers recommends this preliminary approval be granted.

Upon motion by Mr. Minos Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved preliminary approval for the subdivision development identified as Rosewood Estates Subdivision, in Election District No. 3, contingent upon comments by the Parish Engineer.

Mr. Sellers also informed the Jury that the Capital Improvements Program draft for the 5 year plan, which was presented to the Jurors and department heads, needs to be finalized in order to comply with State Auditor's requirements.

Upon motion Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the acceptance of the Capital Improvements Program 5 year plan as proposed by Sellers & Associates, Inc.

Mr. Sellers also informed the Jury that the bids for the Spoil Bank Rehabilitation for the North Prong of Schooner Bayou will be in on March 26, 2007 at 10:00 a.m.

Upon motion by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the President to execute acceptance of the contract if it is within the budget and meets all the requirements of the permit.

Mr. Sellers also informed the Jury that the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources has indicated that the Department of Natural Resources will fund the plug-in of all the breaches in Schooner Bayou now, with the work to be performed at a later date.

Upon motion of Mr. Carroll Duhon, duly seconded by Mr. Ravis Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved Sellers & Associates, Inc. to apply for a

permit with the Department of Natural Resources to complete the work on the North Prong of Schooner Bayou.

Mr. Sellers also informed the Jury that the Certification of the Vermilion Parish Solid Waste Sub-Title D-Improvements-Area IB Tie-In Liner System has been completed and once the Department of Environmental Quality approves the certification, the slope liner will be available for use.

Upon motion by Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard, and unanimously carried, Item No. 11 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations be amended to read to approve the Consolidated Gravity Drainage District No. 1 instead of Prairie Gregg Drainage District.

Upon motion by Mr. Edval Simon, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury deleted Item No. 11 from the Public Road Committee Recommendations.

Upon motion of Mr. Maxwell Chreene, duly seconded by Mr. David C. Mayard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations, as amended and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendation.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON MARCH 14, 2007, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve all "NO DUMPING" signs to carry the wording "\$500 Fine" from this point forward.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve a status change from \$40.00 to \$100.00 a month for licensed Herbicide Sprayers.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve Contract Change Order No. 2 regarding the F.Y. 2005 LCDBG-DR Water System Improvements-Cow Island Area. This change order would add \$34,364.00 to the total contract price, adjusting the total contract price to \$634,749.25.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to conduct a survey of Alwood Road (P-9-99) to determine the width of extension to an existing Right of Way (recorded with the Vermilion Parish Clerk of Court on August 15, 1988), in Election District No. 2.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the reappointment of the following individuals to the Prairie Gregg Drainage District for a 4 year term:

6. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve entering into an intergovernmental agreement with the Coulee Kinney Drainage District to improve drainage in the area of the Decuir property off of Gooch Road. The Police Jury will do the necessary improvements and the Drainage District will return a similar value of service at a later date.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury approve entering into an intergovernmental agreement with the Coulee Kinney Drainage District to remove trees on Montgomery Road.

7. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve payment on the attached bills that were submitted.
8. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve a Letter of No Objection for Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr. for a proposed bank protection on the Vermilion River.
9. It is recommended that the Police Jury abandon the last eighty-five feet (85') of Harvey Road, in Election District #2.
10. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 15 mile-per-hour speed limit and a "Children At Play" sign on Jada Road, in Election District No. 2.
11. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the Prairie Gregg Drainage District to use their excavator to help remove the barge in Bayou Tigre.

In accordance with the Public Road Committee Recommendations the following ordinance was adopted:

**ORDINANCE**

**2007-O-08**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury’s attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Jada Road, in Election District No. 2.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 15 mph speed limit on Jada Road, for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs and Children At Play signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff’s Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.
