Upon motion of Mr. Leon Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Cloris J. Boudreaux, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved dispensing the reading of the minutes of the regular meeting of May 5, 2008 and the special meeting of May 12, 2008, and were accepted as presented.

President Butaud read the following announcements:

- (A) Juror Chris Beraud had quadruple bypass surgery on Sunday. He is at the Heart Hospital in Lafayette and is doing fine.
- (B) The Jury received a "Habitat Hero Award" from the Lafayette Habitat for Humanity. The award was given with gratitude for the Jury's dedication and support of Habitat's mission to build simple, decent homes in partnership with local families in need.
- (C) The Coastal Wetlands Planning, Protection and Restoration Act Committee will have a Task Force meeting on June 4, 2008 at 9:30 a.m. at the NOAA Estuarine Habitats and Coastal Fisheries Center, 646 Cajundome Boulevard, Suite 119, Lafayette, to discuss the FY '09 Planning Budget Development and the PPL 19 Process.
- (D) The Vermilion Health Care Center in Nunez will be hosting a 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration on Saturday, May 31, 2008 at 2:00 p.m. at 14008 Cheneau Road, Kaplan. Please join them for an afternoon of BBQ, Cajun music and dancing, with music provided by Jamie Bergeron and the Kickin' Cajuns.

Upon motion by Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Cloris J. Boudreaux, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized additions/changes to the agenda to allow Mr. Sherrill Sagrera and Mr. Tim Creswell to address the Jury.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Sherrill Sagrera to present his business to the Jury.

Mr. Sagrera stated that the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority had been awarded approximately \$300 million to be used for protection projects around the state of Louisiana. Mr. Sagrera stated that the State has requested project submittals from all Parishes. As such, Mr. Sagrera requested authorization to forward a project request for a Watershed Study at the Hebert Canal. This project would install a structure in the Hebert Canal to prevent storm surges. Mr. Sagrera informed the Jury that the deadline to submit projects is June 11, 2008.

Upon motion by Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Mr. Sherrill Sagrera to submit the Hebert Canal Watershed Study project to the State of Louisiana for funding through the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Tim Creswell to present his business to the Jury.

Mr. Creswell stated that along the same lines as Mr. Sagrera, he also requested permission to submit the installation of surge control structures in the Delcambre Canal, the Oaks Canal, the Boston Canal and the 4-Mile Canal. Mr. Creswell informed the Jury that this is a conceptual plan only.

Upon motion by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Mr. Tim Creswell to submit the conceptual plan of installing surge control structures in the Delcambre Canal, the Oaks Canal, the Boston Canal and the 4-Mile Canal to the State of Louisiana for future funding through the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority.

Upon motion by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations, as presented, and the appropriate officials of the Jury were authorized to carry out the recommendations.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON MAY 14, 2008, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury advertise for bids from the public to purchase the following bush hogs:
  - A. Unit 1-1260 (3710 Bushhog Flexwing Cutter)
  - B. Unit 4-1234 (2610 Bushhog Rotary Cutter)
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Coulee Kinney Drainage District to clear a drainage right-of-way at the intersection of Louisiana Highway 699 and Highway 167 to provide better visibility to traffic at the intersection whereby the Police Jury will provide the trucks to haul off the trees and brush and the Coulee Kinney Drainage District will provide the equipment and respective operators for the clearing of the drainage right-of-way.

3. It is recommended that the Police Jury rescind the motion of May 5, 2008 to replace the deluxe exhaust system on the 6420 Diamond 5' Side Rotary Mower at an approximate cost of \$978.93 by Quality Equipment Co., Inc.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury ratify payment of Invoice No. 02350997 to Quality Equipment Co., Inc. – Abbeville in the amount of \$723.93 and Invoice No. 40535-01 to Quality Equipment Co., Inc. – Crowley in the amount of \$545.86 relative to replacing the deluxe exhaust system of the 6420 Diamond 5' Side Rotary Mower.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve payment of the attached bills that were submitted.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury award the lowest quote received to Quality Equipment Co., Inc. in the amount of \$4,234.85, relative to the purchase of two 8' Rotary Cutters for the Area I Barn and two 8' Rotary Cutters for the Area IV Barn for a total cost of \$16,939.40 on State Contract.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve Mr. Lorphea Broussard not receiving the 6% cost-of-living raise.
8. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to advertise for bids for the “Materials for Parish Road Maintenance for the Period of July 1, 2008 to December 31, 2008”.
9. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 10 mph speed limit on Oldy Road, for its entire length, in Election District No. 13.
10. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 25 mph speed limit on Lull Road, for its entire length, in Election District No. 13.
11. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Administrator/Secretary-Treasurer to send a letter to Representative Don Trahan and Senator Nick Gautreaux requesting a traffic study to install a light at the intersection of Louisiana Highway 699 and Louisiana Highway 167.
12. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to conduct a drainage study on Aldes Road, near Hebert's Landing, in Election District No. 09.
13. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Avid Road, from Louisiana Highway 35 to Louisiana Highway 699, and install “Watch for Children” signs at 18305 Avid Road, in Election District No. 12.
14. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Riceville Road, from Tetoie Road to Alvie Road, in Election District No. 14.
15. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Saul Road, from the first bridge to Riceville Road, in Election District No. 14.
16. It is recommended that the Police Jury begin installing driveway culverts with the following stipulations:
  - A. Price for installation will be figured as such: \$0.25 cents per diameter inch times the linear footage of the culvert to be installed not to exceed 40'.

- B. The Vermilion Parish Police Jury will not provide the pipe for the culverts.
- C. The Vermilion Parish Police Jury will provide dirt where available.
- D. Permit application fee will be \$10.
- E. Culverts will be installed as time and manpower permit.

**ORDINANCE**

**2007-O-31**

**AN AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 2007-O-31,  
APPROVED BY THE VERMILION PARISH POLICE JURY  
AT THEIR REGULAR MEETING HELD ON SEPTEMBER 4, 2007.**

***THE AMENDMENT RESCINDS SECTION I OF ORDINANCE 2004-O-24 TO CHANGE  
THE SPEED LIMIT ON OLDY ROAD AS FOLLOWS:***

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions on Oldy Road, in Election District No. 13.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 10 mph speed limit on Oldy Road, for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

**ORDINANCE**

**2008-O-13**

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions on Lull Road, in Election District No. 13.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 25 mph speed limit on Lull Road, for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions on Avid Road, in Election District No. 12.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 35 mph speed limit on Avid Road, from Louisiana Highway 35 to Louisiana Highway 699.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Chris Theriot, Administrator/Secretary-Treasurer, to present any business he had to the Jury.

Domingues, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Claim No. BLST-65-200803-23-0127-JSG to A T & T, in the amount of \$1,288.03, relative to an accident by a Parishwide employee. Cost to be paid from Parishwide.

**AN AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 2004-O-24,

***THE AMENDMENT RESCINDS SECTION I OF ORDINANCE 2004-O-24 TO CHANGE THE SPEED LIMIT ON ROSEWOOD ROAD AS FOLLOWS:***

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions on Rosewood Road in Election District No. 10 and 14, from Mahogany Road to Bluebonnet Road.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 45 mph speed limit on Rosewood Road for that section of road named above; and

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

- (A) Project Permit 1551-P to El Paso & E&P Company, LC to furnish and install two (2) 30' x 30' meter sites and approximately 2,823 feet of one (1) 8-inch pipeline to serve the C. J. Stelly Well No. 1, in Election District No. 13.
- (B) Project Permit 1552-P to Castex Energy, Inc., to furnish and install a walkway and heater platform and approximately 1,450 feet of one (1) 4-inch flowline to serve the Fred Stovall Well No. 001, in Election District No. 09.
