Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on July 21, 2008, with President Gerald Butaud presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Butaud, who asked Mr. Wayne Touchet to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection. The President then reminded all present to turn all cell phones, pagers, etc. off or set to silent mode for the duration of the Police Jury meeting.

President Butaud read the following announcements:

1. The Acadiana Legislative Delegation invites all elected and appointed officials from the Acadiana Region to attend an ethics seminar on Thursday, August 7, 2008 at the UL Union, Bayou Bijou Theatre from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Each elected official in attendance will receive credit toward required annual ethics training.
2. The Coastal Protection and Restoration Financing Corporation will be holding a public meeting on Wednesday, July 30, 2008 at 1:00 p.m. at the Department of Natural Resources, LaSalle Building (LaBelle Room), 617 North Third Street, Baton Rouge, LA.
3. Received the Financial Report for the year ending December 31, 2007 from the Acadiana Criminalistics Laboratory Commission, which will be kept on file.

Upon motion of Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved dispensing the reading of the minutes of the regular meeting of July 7, 2008, and were accepted as presented.

President Butaud stated that the Jury would now hold a public hearing to consider levying additional or adopting increased millage rates without further voter approval or adopting the adjusted millage rate and rolling forward to a millage rate not to exceed the prior year's maximum. President Butaud called for any objections to the proposed levying.

As no objections were made, the meeting continued.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Eugene Sellers, Jr., with The Sellers Group, to present his business to the Jury.

Mr. Sellers provided the Jury with four bills to be approved for payment.

Upon motion by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. Cloris J. Boudreaux, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Application for Payment No. 2 (Corrected Copy) to Minvielle Lumber Co., Inc., in the amount of \$87,875.08, relative to the "New Fire Stations – Henry". Cost to be paid from '76 Sales Tax.

Upon motion by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. Cloris J. Boudreaux, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved payment of Invoice No. 3157 (Corrected Copy) to The Sellers Group, in the amount of \$2,164.97, relative to professional services provided for the observation of construction for the "New Fire Stations – Henry". Cost to be paid from '76 Sales Tax.

Upon motion by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. Cloris J. AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JULY 16, 2008, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers & Associates, Inc. to investigate and place a load limit for the concrete topped bridges on the south end of Prairie Street in Election District No. 09 and on Kibbe Street in Election District No. 06.

It is further recommended that the Police Jury authorize Mr. Sellers to investigate the bridge on West Albert Road, in Election District No. 06, to see if the bridge could be removed and replaced with a pipe.

2. Mr. Bradley Simon asked the Jury if the owners of GOL Shooting Range had applied for a permit to operate the shooting range.

Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel, stated that GOL Shooting Range had not applied for a permit, and was prepared to discuss the legal issues with the Jury in Executive Session.

Mr. Wayne Touchet rescinded the above referenced motion.

Upon motion by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. Cloris J. Boudreaux, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved going into Executive Session later in the meeting to discuss legal issues associated with GOL Shooting Range.

Boudreaux, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the President to sign the necessary documents with Philip Reclamation Services Houston, LLC, relative to the “Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event” to be held on November 22, 2008.

Upon motion by Mr. Cloris J. Boudreaux, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel to send a letter to the owners of 8810 Miller Drive, Kaplan, requesting they clean the property, as outlined in Ordinance No. 2005-O-09.

Upon motion by Mr. Nathan Granger, duly seconded by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury appointed Mr. Robert Romero to the Hospital Service District No. 2 for a 6 year term, replacing Mr. Donald Primeaux.

Upon motion by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved amending the agenda to allow Ms. Roberta Boudreaux to address the Jury.

Ms. Boudreaux thanked the Jury for the opportunity to work with them.

Upon motion by Mr. Cloris J. Boudreaux, duly seconded by Mr. Dane Hebert, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved hiring Mr. Albert Bell as a Mower Operator at the Area IV Barn at a Grade 9, Step 0.

Upon motion by Mr. Leon Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved placing the issue of Parishwide employees working four 10-hour days during the summer and five 8-hour days during the winter on the agenda for the Public Road Committee meeting to be held on July 30, 2008.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel, to present his business to the Jury.

Mr. Moresi stated that the final version of the ordinance that regulates traffic on cul-de-sacs and dead ends in formally recognized subdivisions had been presented to the Administrative Office. Mr. Moresi recommended adoption of the ordinance as presented.

Upon motion by Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Cloris J. Boudreaux, with Juror Errol J. Domingues voting nay, the Police Jury adopted an ordinance regulating traffic on cul-de-sacs and dead ends in formally recognized subdivisions.

Mr. Moresi informed the Jury that he had received documentation regarding problems with the elevator at the Courthouse. Mr. Moresi stated that the Police Jury has a maintenance contract with H & J Handicap Lifts, Inc. to service and maintain the elevators. Mr. Moresi also stated that the problems the elevator is experiencing now fall under the service contract. Mr. Moresi requested permission to contact H & J Handicap Lifts, Inc. to determine why the terms of the contract are not being met.

Upon motion by Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Leon Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel to contact H & J Handicap Lifts, Inc. to

determine why the terms of the maintenance contract for the elevators at the Vermilion Parish Courthouse are not being met.

Mr. Moresi also informed the Committee that he had received an Act of Donation from the City of Abbeville for a 1985 Mac Pumper Truck. Mr. Moresi reminded the Jury that the truck in question had been donated to the City who is no longer in need of it.

Upon motion by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury referred the item of the Act of Donation from the City of Abbeville for a 1985 Mac Pumper Truck to the next Public Works Committee meeting of July 30, 2008.

Upon motion by Mr. Ronald Darby, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Menard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved amending the agenda to allow Mr. Calvin Broussard with Lighthouse for Jesus Church to address the Jury.

Mr. Broussard stated that the second amendment to Ordinance 2001-O-17 allows vehicles engaged in church services to park on the shoulders of public roads. Mr. Broussard also stated that during their last revival, there was a car that was parked too far into the roadway, which has caused some problems with the neighbors. Mr. Broussard requested that the Police Jury examine the pictures provided and to discuss the item thoroughly before rescinding the Ordinance. Mr. Broussard also stated that usually, their parking lot is sufficient to accommodate the number of cars, but at times when there is an event such as a revival, there are many more cars to accommodate.

Mr. Moresi reminded the Jury that Ordinance 2001-O-17, in its current form, allowed for exceptions, such as those referred to by Mr. Broussard. Mr. Moresi also stated that there is a fine line between parking on the side of the road and parking in the roadway, thereby obstructing traffic.

Mr. Granger suggested having someone present at their larger events to direct traffic.

Mr. Moresi stated that it may be pertinent to adjust the ordinance slightly to say that even though there are exceptions to the ordinance, those people who must park on the side of the road may not park in such a way that obstructs the normal flow of traffic.

Mr. Poche` stated that the pictures provided by a local neighbor of the church showed a car parked approximately 4-5 feet into the roadway. Mr. Poche` stated that when Ordinance No. 2001-O-17 was adopted, the shoulders of the roadways were not clearly defined.

Mr. Moresi stated that he would look at the Ordinance and present some clarifications at the next Public Road Committee meeting on July 30, 2008.

Mr. Ronald Darby recognized and congratulated Mr. Jeremiah Bolden as the new Abbeville City Marshall.

Upon motion by Mr. Nathan Granger, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury went into executive session at 6:38 p.m. to discuss prospective litigation after written demand regarding GOL Shooting Range.

Upon motion by Mr. Nathan Granger, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury returned back to regular session at 7:02 p.m.

Upon motion by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel to prepare a suit for injunctive relief against GOL Shooting Range to be filed when directed to do so by the Jury and to invite the owners of the GOL Shooting Range to the Public Road Committee meeting of July 30, 2008 to allow them to explain their legal position relative to Ordinance No. 2005-O-21.

Upon motion by Mr. Leon Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, and unanimously carried, there being no further business to be presented, the meeting was duly adjourned.
