March 17, 2008
Abbeville, Louisiana

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on March 17, 2008, with President Gerald Butaud presiding.

The meeting was called to order by President Butaud, who asked Mr. Pervis Gaspard to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection. The President then reminded all present to turn all cell phones, pagers, etc. off or set to silent mode for the duration of the Police Jury meeting.

Upon motion by Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved amending the agenda to allow Mr. Steven Langlinais to address the Police Jury.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Steven Langlinais to address the Jury.

Mr. Langlinais stated that he wished to express his thanks on behalf of the Lake Peigneur Group for their continued support. Mr. Langlinais thanked Ms. Linda Duhon, Administrative Assistant for her help in locating Resolution 2006-R-24 and Amendment to Resolution 2006-R-24, which opposed the permit applications by the Jefferson Island Storage and Hub, LLC and which allowed the Police Jury to work with Iberia Parish Council in marking the buoys to show fishermen and recreational boaters the site of the bubbling in Lake Peigneur and opposing any more permits granted for the purpose of underground gas storage in Lake Peigneur. He again thanked the Jury for their support and allowing him time to speak tonight.

Mr. Langlinais stated that he again wished to thank the Jury for their support regarding Lake Peigneur and thanked the Jury to allow him time to speak tonight.

President Butaud read the following announcements:

- (A) The CWPPRA Technical Committee will review and take public comment on the 18th Project Priority (PPL 18) nominee projects on Wednesday, April 16, 2008, at 9:30 a.m. at the US Army Corps of Engineers Office, District Assembly Room (DARM), 7400 Leake Avenue, New Orleans, Louisiana. The Technical Committee will select 10 candidate projects and up to 3 demonstration projects to be further evaluated for PPL 18.

(B) The Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority has scheduled a meeting for Wednesday, March 19, 2008, at the Department of Natural Resources, LaSalle Building (LaBelle Room), 617 North Third Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

Upon motion by Mr. Leon Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the readings of the minutes of the March 3, 2008 meeting were dispensed with and were accepted.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers & Associates, Inc. to present any business he had to the Jury.

Mr. Sellers presented various drilling permits to be approved by the Jury.

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON MARCH 12, 2008, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY’S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Parish Road Supervisor to submit a list of all Parish roads containing cattleguards to the Administrator/Secretary-Treasurer for further investigation.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the hiring of Mr. Doris Abshire as a mower operator for the Area II Barn, at a Grade 9, Step 0.
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve Change Order No. 1, relative to the “Truck Bypass Route Improvements in the Gueydan Area”. Change order reflects an increase of \$15,675.00.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury amend Ordinance No. 2005-O-09 “An Ordinance Regulation the Control of Vegetation and Offensive Accumulations in Formally Dedicated Subdivisions in the Unincorporated Areas of Vermilion Parish” to include Section 7 as follows:

SECTION #7 WAIVERS

The Vermilion Parish Police Jury may waive the requirements of this Ordinance after a consideration of the following factors:

1. The location of the lot made the subject of the complaint;
 2. The condition of the adjoining lots;
 3. Whether the lot was ever cleared; and
 4. Other factors deemed relevant to the complaint;
 5. A landowner seeking a waiver under this part must apply in writing to the Vermilion Parish Police Jury for such a waiver, and provide adequate information to the Vermilion Parish Police Jury for consideration. The Vermilion Parish Police Jury retains the sole discretion in deciding whether a waiver is warranted under the circumstances.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve paying Invoice No. 36-12903 to Louisiana Testing & Inspection, Inc., in the amount of \$3,275.50 relative to the “2006-2007 Capital Improvements Program-Phase I – Street Improvements” and the “2006-2007 Capital Improvements Program-Phase II – Street Improvements”.
 6. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to write to the State requesting an extension of the deadline for Thibodeaux Feeds for the Enterprise Zone Program.
 7. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Administrator/Secretary-Treasurer to request a fee schedule and programs regarding installation of private driveways from the surrounding Municipalities and Parishes.
 8. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve the plans and specifications for Meaux Estates Subdivision in Election District No. 2, contingent upon Parish Engineer comments being addressed by the developer.

ORDINANCE

2008-O-04

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions on Nanson Road, in Election District No. 13.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 35 mph speed limit on Nanson Road, from the intersection at Waldo Road, heading north for a distance of approximately 500 feet.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

ORDINANCE

Mr. Theriot also informed the Jury that the following two quotes had been received for a 2 WD Cab Tractor and a 20' Boom Mower from State Contract for Area I and Area IV:

Upon motion by Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Mr. Elray Schexnider to review the plans for Deere Park Subdivision.

Upon motion by Mr. Dane Hebert, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the issuance of a Temporary Liquor Permit to the Waikiki Riders for their Annual Trail Ride to be held on March 28-30, 2008, at the Waikiki Campgrounds, located at 7507 West Louisiana Highway 338, Abbeville, Louisiana, in Election District No. 06.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Paul Moresi, III, Legal Counsel, to present any business he had to the Jury.

Mr. Moresi informed the Jury that the 30-day time period for the cleaning of Lot 1 in Victoria Acres, owned by Mr. Alf Vincent, had expired.

Upon motion by Mr. Mark Poche, duly seconded by Mr. Nathan Granger, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel to send a letter requesting compliance with Ordinance No. 2005-O-09 to Mr. and Mrs. Tim Stanley for Lot No. 1 in Rosehill Subdivision, in Election District No. 09.

Mr. Moresi informed the Jury that he had received the final payment from Mr. Leon Rosenberger, relative to charges for having his property cleaned as outlined in Ordinance No. 2005-O-09.

Upon motion by Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Nathan Granger, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel to send a letter to Mr. Leon Rosenberger reminding him to keep his lot clean and requesting that he tear down the dilapidated home on the property, as outlined in Ordinance 2005-O-09, in order to avoid more charges for cleaning his lot.

Upon motion by Mr. Keith Meaux, duly seconded by Mr. Wayne Touchet, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved entering into an intergovernmental agreement with the Abbeville Christian Service Center, located at 701 Chevis Street, Abbeville, Louisiana, to furnish gravel in the driveway and parking lot, in Election District No. 7. Cost to be paid from Parishwide.

Upon motion by Mr. Keith Meaux, duly seconded by Mr. Mark Poche`, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved advertising for a full time custodian at the Vermilion Parish Health Unit.

Upon motion by Mr. Leon Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Keith Meaux, and unanimously carried, there being no further business to be presented, the meeting was duly adjourned.
