Upon motion of Mr. Mark Poche`, duly seconded by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved dispensing the reading of the minutes of the Special Meeting of March 6, the Regular Meeting of March 17 and the Special Meeting of March 31, 2008 meetings, and were accepted as presented.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers & Associates, Inc. to present any business he had to the Jury.

Mr. Sellers presented four drilling permits to be approved by the Jury.

ORDINANCE

2008-O-06

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions on Prejean Road, in Election District No. 09.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 35 mph speed limit on Waldo Road, for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the appropriate speed limit signs be installed in said area.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

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ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, in Loughon Addition Subdivision, in Election District No. 14.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

Mr. Moresi stated that he had reviewed the damage claim by Mr. Joseph Magnon, relative to a busted tire caused by a pothole on Cheneau Road, in Election District No. 13, and he recommended denying the claim.

Upon motion by Mr. Wayne Touchet, duly seconded by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury denied the claim of Mr. Joseph Magnon, relative to a busted tire caused by a pothole on Cheneau Road, in Election District No. 13.

Mr. Moresi stated that he had requested a copy of an Ordinance from Lafayette Parish which regulates the distance between certain types of businesses and residences and schools, due to the concerns raised by Mr. Bill Best at the Public Works Committee meeting of April 4, 2008. Mr. Moresi stated that this "Good Neighbor Ordinance" requires a buffer zone and green belts between those businesses and residences and/or schools. He further stated that he would provide a copy of Lafayette's ordinance to the Administrative Office, for review by the Jurors if they desired.

Mr. Moresi informed the Jury that he had received an Attorney General's Opinion regarding enforcing Ordinance No. 2005-O-21, relative to shooting ranges in the unincorporated areas of Vermilion Parish, and he will present that information at the Committee meetings to be held April 16, 2008.

Mr. Ronald Darby stated that he had a complaint regarding the work done by the Road Crew on Lamar Road in his district. He stated that the road was not resealed correctly the first time it was done, and had to be redone. Mr. Darby further stated that he felt it was unfair that the monies to pay for the second resealing should not come out of his road funds, but should be paid out of Parishwide.

Upon motion by Mr. Mark Poche', duly seconded by Mr. Nathan Granger, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved referring the item of payment for the second resealing of Lamar Road be referred to the Public Road Committee meeting of April 16, 2008.

Upon motion by Mr. Leon Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Dane Hebert, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized the Administrator/Secretary-Treasurer and Legal Counsel to discuss medical insurance options for Mr. Douglas Richard with Mr. Rob Carter of Kolder, Champagne, Slaven and Company.

Upon motion by Mr. T. J. Prejean, Jr., duly seconded by Mr. Cloris J. Boudreaux, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury amended the agenda to allow City of Kaplan Mayor Linda Hardee to address the Jury.

Ms. Hardee stated that she attended tonight to verify that a change order had been made to include Klaby Meaux Road from Louisiana Highway 14 to Mill Street for the "2006-2007 Capital Improvements Program – Street Improvements."

Ms. Hardee also stated that she wished to thank the Jury for their assistance with "Habitat for Humanity" with trash pickup.

Upon motion by Mr. Leon Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, and unanimously carried, there being no further business to be presented, the meeting was duly adjourned.
