Minutes of a regular meeting of the Vermilion Parish Police Jury held on June 1, 2009, with President Gerald Butaud presiding.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Butaud, who asked Mr. Nathan Granger to lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, the President asked for a moment of silent prayer or reflection. The President then reminded all present to turn all cell phones, pagers, etc. off or set to silent mode for the duration of the Police Jury meeting.

President Butaud read the following announcements:

- (A) The Coastal Wetlands Planning, Protection and Restoration Task Force will hold a meeting on Wednesday, June 3, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the NOAA Estuarine Habitats and Coastal Fisheries Center, 646 Cajundome Boulevard, Suite 119, Lafayette, to initiate discussion of the FY10 Planning Budget Development and the PPL20 Process. The Task Force will also review the results of the Technical Committee's selection of PPL19 candidate projects and demonstration projects.

Upon motion of Mr. Leon Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved dispensing the reading of the minutes of the May 18, 2009 regular meeting, and were accepted as presented.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Eugene Sellers, Sr., with Sellers & Associates, Inc., to present his business to the Jury.

Mr. Sellers presented the following letters of no objection:

- (1) Letter of No Objection to Ms. Tammy Stutes, to construct a bulkhead and erosion control for 214 feet of the Vermilion River, in Election District No. 11.

- (2) Letter of No Objection to Dune Operating Company, to dredge and construct levee improvements to a private slip along the Florence Canal, in Election District No. 14.

Upon motion by Mr. Leon Broussard, duly seconded by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the following:

- (1) Letter of No Objection to Ms. Tammy Stutes, to construct a bulkhead and erosion control for 214 feet of the Vermilion River, in Election District No. 11.
- (2) Letter of No Objection to Dune Operating Company, to dredge and construct levee improvements to a private slip along the Florence Canal, in Election District No. 14.

Mr. Sellers stated that advertising for the North Prong bank stabilization had started, with bids due by July 6, 2009.

President Butaud recognized Mr. Eugene Sellers, Jr., with The Sellers Group, to present his business to the Jury.

Mr. Sellers requested a motion from the Jury to formally accept the new Henry and Seventh Ward Fire Stations as substantially complete.

Upon motion by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. Cloris J. Boudreaux, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury formally accepted the new Henry Fire Station and Seventh Ward Fire Station as substantially complete.

Upon motion by Mr. Mark Poche`, duly seconded by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury amended Item No. 3 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations to read: "It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to prepare an Act of Sale to purchase one (1) all welded steel vessel, with the following dimensions: 64 feet in length; breadth – 28 feet; and a depth of 3 feet; said vessel being powered by one (1) Ford 4-cylinder diesel engine, together with all appurtenances thereto attached in the amount of \$100.00 from Pine Island Ferry, Inc. It is further recommended that the Police Jury advertise the sale of the old Pine Island Ferry, once all Act of Sale documents have been recorded."

Upon motion by Mr. Errol J. Domingues, duly seconded by Mr. Gerald Butaud, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury amended Item No. 15 of the Public Road Committee Recommendations to read: "It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to prepare an Intergovernmental Agreement between the Vermilion Parish Police Jury and the Prairie Gregg Drainage District to clean a beaver dam located off Moss Road, in Election District No. 08, whereby the Prairie Gregg Drainage District will provide the labor and equipment to break up the beaver dam and the Police Jury will pay the costs incurred from Election District No. 08, Road District 4-A."

Upon motion by Mr. Pervis Gaspard, duly seconded by Mr. Ronald Darby, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury approved the Public Road Committee Recommendations, as amended, and the appropriate officials were authorized to carry out the recommendations.

PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE

AS A RESULT OF A PUBLIC ROAD COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON MAY 27, 2009, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RESPECTFULLY SUBMITTED FOR THE JURY'S CONSIDERATION:

1. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to inspect all three pumping stations (Mont Blanc, Pine Street, and Victoria Acres) for generator size needed before the Police Jury meeting on Monday, June 1, 2009.
2. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the Public Road Supervisor to hire Mr. Rick Bessard to install catch-basins in Election Districts No. 02 and 09, at a cost of \$650.00 per catch-basin (including labor and material).
3. It is recommended that the Police Jury advertise the sale of the old Pine Island Ferry.
4. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to amend the Public Road Maintenance Manual to change the following to the *Minimum Requirements for Accepting Roads into the Parish Road System*:
 - A. A minimum right-of-way of fifty (50) feet.
 - B. A minimum road bed of twenty-eight (28) feet constructed to acceptable engineering standards.
 - C. A minimum of eighteen (18) feet of limestone or approved equivalent surface material, with a minimum compacted depth of four (4) inches.
 - D. All dead-end roads must have a cul-de-sac or turnaround.
5. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve payment to Entergy, in the amount of \$9,200.00, relative to moving an electrical pole located near the Cheneau Road bridge out of the Parish's right-of-way.
6. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve Contract Change Order No. 3, to adjust contract quantities for the "Subtitle D Cell Area II-B – Grading Plan". The change order reflects an increase of \$13,609.53, adjusting the contract price to date to \$736,859.53.
7. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve payment of Partial Payment No. 5 to IDIM Construction, LLC, in the amount of \$41,703.68, relative to the "Subtitle D Cell Area II-B – Grading Plan". Cost to be paid from '94 Sales Tax.

8. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the President to sign a resolution of acceptance from IDIM Construction, LLC pertaining to the completion of the contract for the Vermilion Parish Solid Waste Plant Subtitle D Cell Area II-B – Grading Plan.
9. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to send a letter to the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development stating that the Police Jury reverses their previous decision and wish to proceed with box culverts as designed for the Dennis Road and Bluebonnet Road bridge replacements for the Federal Aid Off-System Highway Bridge Program.
10. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt a resolution for the Federal Aid Off-System Highway Bridge Program to remove the Lloyd Road Bridge and the Oliver Road Bridge from the program.
11. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize the President to sign the application for a Corps of Engineers permit for bridge replacement of Bluebonnet Road, Pioneer Road and Amerada Road for the Long Term Community Recovery Program – Phase II.
12. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to advertise for bids for the “Materials for Parish Road Maintenance for the period of July 1, 2009 to December 31, 2009”.
13. It is recommended that the Police Jury deny the request of the St. Mary Community Action Agency to issue a permit waiver to install culverts on Louisiana Highway 82 for the new Headstart building.
14. It is recommended that the Police Jury accept Plummer (Pvt) Road into the Parish Road System as a private road, in Election District No. 04.
15. It is recommended that the Police Jury approve entering into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Prairie Gregg Drainage District to clean a beaver dam located off Moss Road, in Election District No. 08, whereby the Prairie Gregg Drainage District will provide the labor and equipment to break up the beaver dam and the Police Jury will return a similar service at a later date.
16. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Legal Counsel to file a lawsuit against Louviere Construction for the damages to Guilliot Road, in Election District No. 13.
17. It is recommended that the Police Jury rescind Ordinance No. 2008-O-34, which established a 35 mph speed limit on Zaunbrecher Road, from Marsule Road to Alvie Road, in Election District No. 14.
18. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 25 mph speed limit on Dallas Guidry Road, from West Barbara Road to Louisiana Highway 713, in Election District No. 14.

19. It is recommended that the Police Jury adopt an ordinance establishing a 35 mph speed limit on Gene (Pvt) Road, for its entire length, in Election District No. 09.

ORDINANCE

2009-O-14

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Dallas Guidry Road, in Election District No. 14.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 25 mph speed limit on Dallas Guidry Road, from West Barbara Road to Louisiana Highway 713.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

ORDINANCE

2009-O-15

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Police Jury's attention that a considerable amount of speeding exists, which is causing very hazardous conditions, on Gene (Pvt) Road, in Election District No. 09.

SECTION I: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Police Jury does hereby impose a 35 mph speed limit on Gene (Pvt) Road, for its entire length.

SECTION II: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.

7. It is recommended that the Police Jury authorize Sellers & Associates, Inc. to prepare the necessary paperwork to purchase a generator for the Parish Government Office Complex through State Contract, or to request bids/quotes if one is not available through State Contract.

Mr. Theriot stated that he had received correspondence from Abbeville General Hospital which stated that the hospital had completed an initial cleaning of the Vermilion Parish morgue, bringing the area up to specification with environmental standards. The letter stated that the Jury will not be charged for the initial cleaning, as it was used to establish a baseline cost for the budget. Mr. Theriot informed the Jury that the Hospital has agreed to clean the morgue twice a month at a cost of \$75.00 per cleaning session (cost includes labor, supplies, etc.).

Upon motion by Mr. Keith Meaux, duly seconded by Mr. Leon Broussard, and unanimously carried, the Police Jury authorized Legal Counsel to prepare an Intergovernmental Agreement between the Vermilion Parish Police Jury and Abbeville General Hospital to clean the Vermilion Parish Morgue whereby the Hospital employees will clean the morgue twice a month and the Police Jury will pay a cost of \$75.00 per cleaning session (cost to include labor, supplies, etc.).

SECTION III: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that "Watch for Children" signs be installed at 6761 Jefferson Road.

SECTION IV: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a first offense, a maximum penalty of a \$100.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court for the first offense.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a second offense, a maximum penalty of a \$250.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that for a third offense, a maximum penalty of a \$500.00 fine and/or a 10 day jail sentence be imposed at the discretion of the court.

SECTION V: BE IT HEREBY FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's Department be and is hereby requested and/or directed to enforce the speed limit by the use of radar and/or regular patrolling.
